May 10th, 1946.

Volunteers were asked to head the various committees and are as follows: Street Improvement - James Farquhar and Harley Sanderson, Transportation - Dave Turner and A. F. Cammon, Water - A. Hagen and John Pedersen.

Ways and means were discussed as to how best obtain the objectives of the various committees, and it was decided that petitions were to be drawn and ready for the next meeting which will be held at Mr. Hagen's Office on May 24th.

Mr. Hagen very kindly offered to allow us the use of his office for these meetings.

Meeting was adjourned by a motion which was carried at 10 PM.

Committees are: transportation, Dave Turner and A. F. Camman; street improvements, James Farquhar and Harley Sanderson; and water, Alvar Hagen and John Pedersen.

The regular meeting of the Wilton Manor Civic Association was held May 17th, 1946 at the office of Mr.A.Hagen. The chairman Mr.Lefler presiding.

11 members were present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

There was a discussion as to how best circulate petitions so they could be signed by the largest number of people. Mr.Boyd reported the Dye sub-division were with us 100% so far as transportation was concerned and he volunteered to see petitions were given to their committee for signatures. Mr. Lefler volunteered to contact Oakland Park and Messrs. Sanderson and Farquhar, Wilton Manor.

Mr. Hagen reported, he and Mr. Pedersen had been in touch with the Lauderdale water department in regards to extending pipelines to Wilton Manor and they were advised by the water company nothing could be done until sometime in 1947. If necessary equipment was available it would cost \$2.00 per foot to lay a pipe-line from Daddy Jacks to Wilton Manor and was estimated to cost about \$6,000.00 from there to Mr.Hagens office. This outlay of money would be retarded at 75% of bills collected from users until fully paid back. The rate for Wilton Manor would be a 25% increase over that used in Ft.Lauderdale.

Petitions were distributed and adjournment was called at 9.15

MINUTES

June 7th, 1946.

The regular meeting of the Wilton Manor Civic Association was held June 7th, 1946 at the office of Mr. Hagan. The Chairman Mr. Lefler presiding.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Boyd just returned from Oakland Park and reported that Oakland Park Association had 400 signers on their petition for the bus line and had already turned the petition in to the State Railroad Commission, that the Oakland Park City Council was figuring on installing their own water Department and would consider letting us come in. Mr. Boyd had also seen Mr. Johns the surplus property custodian who promised to try to attend the meeting, but who was evidently delayed. Mr. Johns informed Mr. Boyd he was willing to entertain a proposition to collect the Wilton Manor surplus waste the only difficulty being in the disposal of same. It was suggested that someone contact the Ft. Lauderdale Commissioners and obtain permission to use the incinerator.

Mr. Lefler reported for Mr. Turner who was unable to attend, that he, Mr. Turner had talked to Mr. Swaggerty head of the ~~Swaggerty~~ City bus line in reference to extending the bus line to Oakland Park. Mr. Swaggerty is willing to extend the bus line, but needs permission from the Railroad Commission. The Florida bus line is willing to relinquish their franchise over this route and run exclusively over Route 1 so as to leave this line open for Swaggerty. If it should be necessary for this question to come to a trial Mr. Turner volunteered to go to Tallahassee as our representative. Our signed petitions were turned over to Mr. Lefler to be given to Mr. Turner who will see that they are sent to the Railroad Commission.

Mr. Hagan reported he had been talking to Florida Power and Light Company regarding the electric light equipment to see if something can be done to improve the power to Wilton Manor. He was told that by Fall the light company expected to put in a sub-station at Oakland Park that would include Wilton Manor with better voltage therefore giving us better service. It is hoped they can run these wires underground.

Mr. Lefler suggested we take steps to prevent an accident on the Wilton Manor Road by writing a letter to the County Sheriff to see what could be done to curb the fast driving especially by the negroes. He and several others said it was dangerous driving as some of the cars seemed to be racing or driving at a very high speed. It was suggested this be held over to the next meeting.

Meeting adjourned at 9:50

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved

After some discussion it was moved by Mr. Farquhar, seconded by Mr. Turner to write a letter to the County Commissioner of Ft. Lauderdale asking him to enforce the speeding law along Wilton Blvd. especially between the hours of 6 A M & 8 A M and 3.30 P.M. & 6 P.M.

Mr. Boyd reported he had again contacted Mr. Johns in reference to garbage collections for Wilton Manor and Mr. Johns would like us to make a survey so as to give him a definite number of people who would require this service.

Mr. Lefler and Mr. Boyd arranged to go see Mr. Johns on Sunday the 23rd to see what could be done about this.

It was suggested by Mrs. Fernandez that to simplify calling on residents of Wilton Manor in order to get petitions signed or any other business which would make it necessary for house to house canvass to have a map made up to show where the houses are located and the owner of same. Mr. Turner and Mr. Hagan both have small maps that could be enlarged to some extent for this purpose. Mr. Farquhar volunteered to make these enlargements.

COLLECTION COSTS \$2 PER MONTH

A garbage collector will contact Wilton Manor residents beginning today to solicit costs of two dollars a month from those who wish twice-a-week trash collections. Garbage accommodations may be obtained by the subdivision's homeowners and tenants by contacting the Wilton Manor Civic Association. The Association has voted a month's trial of garbage collections at the two dollars per month rate, and has appealed to the County Commission to curb speeding along Wilton Manor Boulevard, scene of three accidents within a week.

MINUTES

A letter from Walter R. Clark sheriff acknowledging our letter of June 24th requesting a check up of the speeding along Wilton Manor was read.

Mr. Boyd reported for himself and Mr. Lefler that upon investigation Mr. Johns the surplus waste collector wanted to be guaranteed at least \$125.00 per month to collect garbage in our vicinity. As this seemed inadvisable Mr. Boyd and Mr. Lefler contacted Mr. Cammon who gave them a name of a man in negro town. They went to see this man and he promised to start immediately, charging the agreed upon price of \$2.00 per house per month.

It was agreed that some plan of payment should be worked out that would be agreeable to everyone concerned and Mr. Sanderson said he would see John Jackson who has charge of the truck in which the garbage is collected *to see* advise how payments could be simplified.

Mr. Lefler advised that although the Florida bus line is willing to relinquish their franchise over Wilton Manor Road it was believed that the case would have to be decided in court

Mr. Lefler also advised he had tried to contact Mr. Remsberg but was unsuccessful.

A motion was made by Mr. Boyd and seconded by Mr. Hagen that the meetings be held once a month on the 1st Friday, instead of twice a month as heretofore

Notices of meetings are to be sent to members and prospective members.

The regular meeting of the Wilton Manor Civic Ass'n was held October 4th, 1946 at the office of Mr. Hagan.

The chairman Mr. Lefler presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Hagan had noticed the surveyors survey the streets preparatory to paving same.

There has been some suggestion that permission be obtained for mail boxes to be placed nearer the residence around 20th Street and fourth Ave., and Mr. Lefler appointed Mr. Chabot a committee of one to contact Mr. VanDyke the present letter carrier to see what steps would have to be taken for this service.

There has been quite a lot of delay by the garbage collector in picking up the refuse and also complaints that he has been missing the various customers. Some of this may be due to the new collectors not knowing where to stop, so it was regularly moved by Mr. Sanderson and seconded by Mrs. Bryan that cards be made 6X8, red with the word "Garbage" printed on them and circulated among the customers. A price for these being \$3.00 for 100.

A bill of 70¢ was presented along with the bill for these cards which was order paid. Motion made by Mr. Hagan seconded by Mrs. Lippard that all bills be paid as presented.

The only report on the busses was that the meeting of the railroad commission was to be held on Oct. 15th granting the bus service with rates lower than the present ones to Oakland Park. There is some rumor that the busses will make 9 trips a day.

Chief Barnhill of the Oakland Park association paid our organization a visit and gave us some information as to how they obtained their objectives, and said that Oakland Park was will to help us in any way they could. He also invited us to visit their association.

Mr. Lefler thought it would be a good idea for written invitations be sent to the Oakland Park and North side associations to visit the Wilton Manor Ass's , and so directed the secretary.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES

November 1, 1946

The regular meeting of the Wilton Manor Civic Association was held on Friday Nov. 1st, 1946 at the office of Mr. Hagan. The Chairman Mr. Lefler presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Secretary read a letter from the American Red Cross asking that the enclosed questionnaire be filled in and returned. Mr. Hagan made a motion seconded by Mr. Boyd that this letter be answered to the best of our ability.

Mr. Lefler reported he and Mr. Starkey were around Sunday Oct. 27th to contact members and customers advising them of the change of the garbage collector.

After some discussion a motion was made by Mr. Hagan seconded by Mr. Sanderson that we employ this new man to collect garbage and pay at every collection at 25¢ per collection.

It has come to the attention of some of the members of the Wilton Manor Civic Ass'n that the officials of the City of Ft. Lauderdale are watching the growth of Wilton Manor with the thought of perhaps at some future date annexing it. Most of the members present expressed no desire to be taken into the city limits rather they were of an opinion that something should be done preventing this happening

Mr. Robinson a new member who was present was asked to enlighten us on the proper procedure that could be taken to keep out of the city and what were the pitfalls to be watched in case the city started activity.

One of the quick ways the city could obtain the Wilton Manor area would be by declaring and act of Legislature. Then the people of Wilton Manor would be put to a great deal of expense and time to have this declaration put aside. Another way is to obtain a two thirds vote on the part of the residence. Mr. Robinson suggested that if the Civic Association Incorporated into a village it would be impossible for Ft. Lauderdale to do anything. Mr. Robinson pointed out that the city of Ft. Lauderdale was heavily indebted from the boom-bust of 1927 ~~at which time the residence was~~ and if the city were to take this area in we would be paying these taxes, while if we incorporated into a village any taxes assessed the village would get the benefit and these would only be levied by the will of the people.

The president brought up the question of whether or not the organization wished to have election of officers at this time, so that new officers could take office January 1st 1947 meeting. After quite a discussion it was decided to start the fiscal year of the Wilton Manor Civic Association in May as that is the date of our first meeting.

MINUTES

Jan. 3rd, 1947

The Regular meeting of the Wilton Manor Civic Association was held Jan 3rd, 1947 at the office of Mr. Hagan. The chairman Mr. Lefler presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Robinson reported the meeting of the Railroad Commission held at the Court House Jan 3rd relative to the busses running between Ft. Lauderdale and Oakland Park was highly successful. There are to be 9 busses daily starting Jan 4th and the fare is to be 20 cents each way.

The chairman asked Mr. Robinson for a report on the petition to be circulated to determine the will of the resident whether or not to incorporate into a town. Mr. Robinson had drawn up these petitions and stated that anything included in them should be discussed and ironed out before presentation. Mrs. Fernandez asked what was the advantages in so far as taxes were concerned if we incorporate? Mr. Robinson informed her that would be entirely up to the voters in the Town, and whether or not we would want to take control of maintenance of the roads also would be up to the voters. The taxes would be relatively small in comparison to what they would be if taken in by either Ft. Lauderdale or Oakland Park.

Mr. Lefler informed the organization that during the week he had received a visit from the Highland Park Association by the name of Mr. Umber, who seemed under the impression that Highland Park was not in favor of joining us in incorporating as they were afraid the restrictions would be higher than their requirements. Mr. Lefler suggested the Highland Park Association send representatives to the January meeting of the Wilton Manor Ass'n. Mr. Lefler introduced these representatives Mr. Evans, Ware and Jones at the meeting. After discussing the advisability of incorporating, a agreement was reached whereby Mr. Evans the president of the Highland Park Ass'n and Mr. Ware and Hart were to present to their association the advantages and disadvantages of joining with the Wilton Manor Civic Ass'n and present their decision at our next meeting Feb 7th.

It was regularly moved by Mr. Turner and seconded by Mr. Mueller that we go ahead with our petitions and the chairman appoint a committee to circulate said petitions for signatures. Mr. Boyd was appointed chairman with four assistants Mr. Brown, Hickson, Hooper and Turner.

The Chairman asked for a report on the streets. It was believed by Mr. Davis and Mr. Turner that the engineers had been forced to cut their appropriations and would be unable to resurface 21st Ct. A committee of Mr. Turner and Mr. Davis was appointed to call upon the County engineers.

The chairman Mr. Lefler told us the garbage collector wasn't too happy about the war his garbage and money collections was working out. He felt some of the people were doubling up with two families

MINUTES

May 2, 1947.

The regular meeting of the Wilton Manor Civic Association was held May 2nd, 1947 at the office of Mr. Hagen. The Chairman Mr. Hagen presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Hagen informed the meeting that Mr. Pederson wished to withdraw from the Village of Wilton Manor and create a separate village taking in Blocks 44, 45, 46.

The article appearing in the Ft. Lauderdale News written for Mr. Pederson by Philip Weidling was introduced and discussed. Some of the members were of the opinion that Mr. Pederson has stipulated in his Deeds a restriction to the effect that buildings are to be 20X22 and costing not less than \$3,500.00, others were of the opinion that Mr. Pederson said this was a gentlemen's agreement only. Those having recent abstracts and deeds were asked to look them up to verify this.

Mr. Sanderson suggested that we ignore Mr. Pederson's threats as he felt Mr. Pederson was only trying to create descension among us enforcing us to do the very things he Mr. Pederson, was basing his objections on. Mr. Sanderson also pointed out the intelligent veteran would consult his banker and the Veterans Administration before doing anything definite and would learn how impossible Mr. Pederson's claims are, re: building for equivalent of 5 lbs butter etc. On the other hand if we become unduly worried, we are apt to play right into Mr. Pederson's hands by creating taxes through applying for a building code necessitating an inspector, who would have to be paid and other unnecessary expenses that we wish to avoid at this time, thereby giving Mr. Pederson the very grounds he needs to form his own village.

Mr. Fernandez was of the same opinion as Mr. Sanderson and suggested we ignore Mr. Pederson. Mr. Robinson agreed that both Mr. Sanderson and Mr. Fernandez were correct, the veteran would consult before doing anything definite.

It was moved by Mr. Sanderson seconded by Mr. Fernandez that we ignore Mr. Pederson.

Mr. Sanderson asked to have his duties outlined, whether he was to take care of accidents on the State Highway. Mr. Robinson told him the new state bill specifically states Town Marshall to take care of such accidents.

Mr. Miller wanted to know how could we operate without taxes. Mr. Robinson informed the meeting that the expenses should not exceed \$200.00 a year at the present time and Mr. Hagen asked for a motion to raise dues from one dollar to two dollars a year per family. A motion was made by Mr. Robinson seconded by Mr. Reilly that the dues be increased to two dollars a year.

Mr. Hagen advised that election of officers for the year 1947 would be held next meeting and asked members to bring their friends.

June 6th, 1947

The regular meeting of the Wilton Manor Civic Association was held June 6th, 1947 at the office of Mr. Alvar Hagen. The Chairman Mr. Hagen presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

It was reported that no petition was ever served on any of the council by Mr. Pederson to withdraw from the village.

Mr. Hagen announced that it was time for an election of officers. Motion was made by Mr. Farquhar, seconded by Mr. D. Turner that meetings of the association be postponed until the first Fri. in Sept. at which time election would be held. Mr. Farquhar suggested that we have a nominating committee appointed for this election and the Chairman appointed Mr. Farquhar, as chairman, assisted by ~~Mr. Gates~~, Miller and Fernandez.


Mr. Hagen told the members that a corporated village is allowed to collect 50% of state taxes.

Mr. Turner reported that the new water main being installed in Ft. Lauderdale may not be adequate to take care of any outside of city properties, so we couldn't look for water from Ft. Lauderdale at this time, however he was talking to an attorney in Pompano who advised Oakland Park were considering making a contract with Pompano to extend their water line to them and perhaps we could somehow take advantage of this deal and get Pompano to extend the line to include Wilton Manor. Mr. Turner said that Pompano has the best water of any town around here.

It was decided to take the matter up later with Mr. Robinson as to what can be done about the speed law.

Motion for adjournment was made by Mr. Hooper seconded by Mr. Turner

Trailer Park Plans Protested

WILTON MANORS — The second meeting of the Civic association protesting the establishment of a trailer park in the village limits was held Monday and a vote of members revealed that 38 were opposed to the park and only four approved.

The protest meetings followed action by the village council in granting preliminary approval for the park to E. W. Carter, real estate man.

The first association protest meeting last Friday, was attended by a large crowd, but no action was taken because a copy of a village ordinance prohibiting trailers could not be obtained.

A copy of the ordinance was not produced at last night's meeting although the village council had been asked to supply one, according to William J. Cherney who presided over the meeting. Another meeting will be called at a later date.

The proposed park would be located north of Middle river and west of Andrews avenue extension. Petitions are being circulated protesting its approval.

Effective - date, February, 1948.

An ordinance to authorize a building inspector. Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Wilton Manors as follows:

That, from the date of this ordinance, the village of Wilton Manor shall be zoned in the following manner:

It is hereby ordained that a building inspector shall be named by the Council of the Village of Wilton Manor whose duties shall include that outlined herein. The said building inspector shall serve at the pleasure of the city council.

Duties

(ONLY PERTINENT DUTIES AT ISSUE ARE AS FOLLOWS)

An ordinance to prohibit the parking of house cars or trailers outside of licensed tourist camps in the village of Wilton Manor.

Be it ordained by the village council of the village of Wilton Manors, Broward County, Florida, as follows:

That, hereafter no automobile trailer, camp car or house car shall be permitted to be located anywhere within the limits of the village of Wilton Manors, whether the same shall be used as living quarters, or storage, or sleeping quarters, outside of a properly licensed tourist camp or automobile tourist park, except that the same may be stored in a regular garage or storage place when not used as living or sleeping quarters, and further provided that the same may travel upon the public highways of the village of Wilton Manors in conformity with the provisions of the ordinances of the village pertaining to automobile traffic.

Any person violating the terms and provisions of the ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and may, upon being found guilty, be fined the sum of fifty dollars or imprisoned for a period not to exceed ten days.

Effective date - February 19th, 1948.

RESOLUTION

FIRST:

The Civic Association of Wilton Manors protests the action of the Village Council on March 17, 1950 in granting a permit for another Trailer Park in a residence district in violation of the present Zoning Ordinance, *if such exists.*

SECOND:


Gentlemen:
