Minutes of Meeting

The regular meeting of the Wilton Manors Civic Association was held in the Village Hall at 8:00 P.M. on January 8, 1951.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Cherney.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read - moved by Mrs. Cherney and seconded by Mrs. Sullivan that they be accepted.

Mr. Chabot reported that he had divided the village into ten parts in readiness for the membership campaign and asked for workers to help.

Mr. Dameron gave a report on progress of playground plans. He stated that it would take approximately \$1200 to start a playground and pointed out that the equipment should be purchased as soon as possible in view of the possible curtailment of the use of metal. The association was advised that the Kiwanis had also planned to sponser a village playground. It was moved by Mr. Dameron and seconded by Mrs. Sanderson that the Kiwanis be co-sponsors with the Civic Association of the playground, if they so desire. A meeting was to be held the following week with committees from both organizations in attendance.

Mr. Cherney reported on the meeting held at the home of Mrs. Turner for the purpose of planning a project to raise funds for the playground. At this meeting it was decided that a barbecue would not be desirable; the committee tentatively decided on a carnival, which would cater to the children and where all organizations in village would have a part in the entertainment.

It was announced that bids were closed on the Wilton Manors school, construction was to begin within 30 days, and the school board expected the new building to be ready for use in September.

Mr. J. Marvin Brown asked if anyone knew where a desk or file cabinet could be obtained to be used for the mayor's court.

Mrs. Pilcher announced that she was chairman for the March of Dimes in Wilton Manors and suggested that a project be sponsored by all organizations to obtain large donation from village. Mr. Hainey and Mr. Newton offered to be on committee. Mr. Cherney also asked to serve.

Mr. Hartman asked when it was expected that the work would be completed on the building. He had brought sealer at cost for the floor. Mr. Newton stated that the men were too busy now to complete work. Mr. Brown stated that money had been set aside to pay for finishing floor. Mr. Hartman was asked to submit bill for sealer.

Mrs. Cherney asked that three keys be made for village hall for each of the scout leaders. Motion made by Mr. Cherney, seconded by Mr. Miller that this be done.

A motion to adjourn was made by Mrs. Pilcher, seconded by Mr. Chabot.

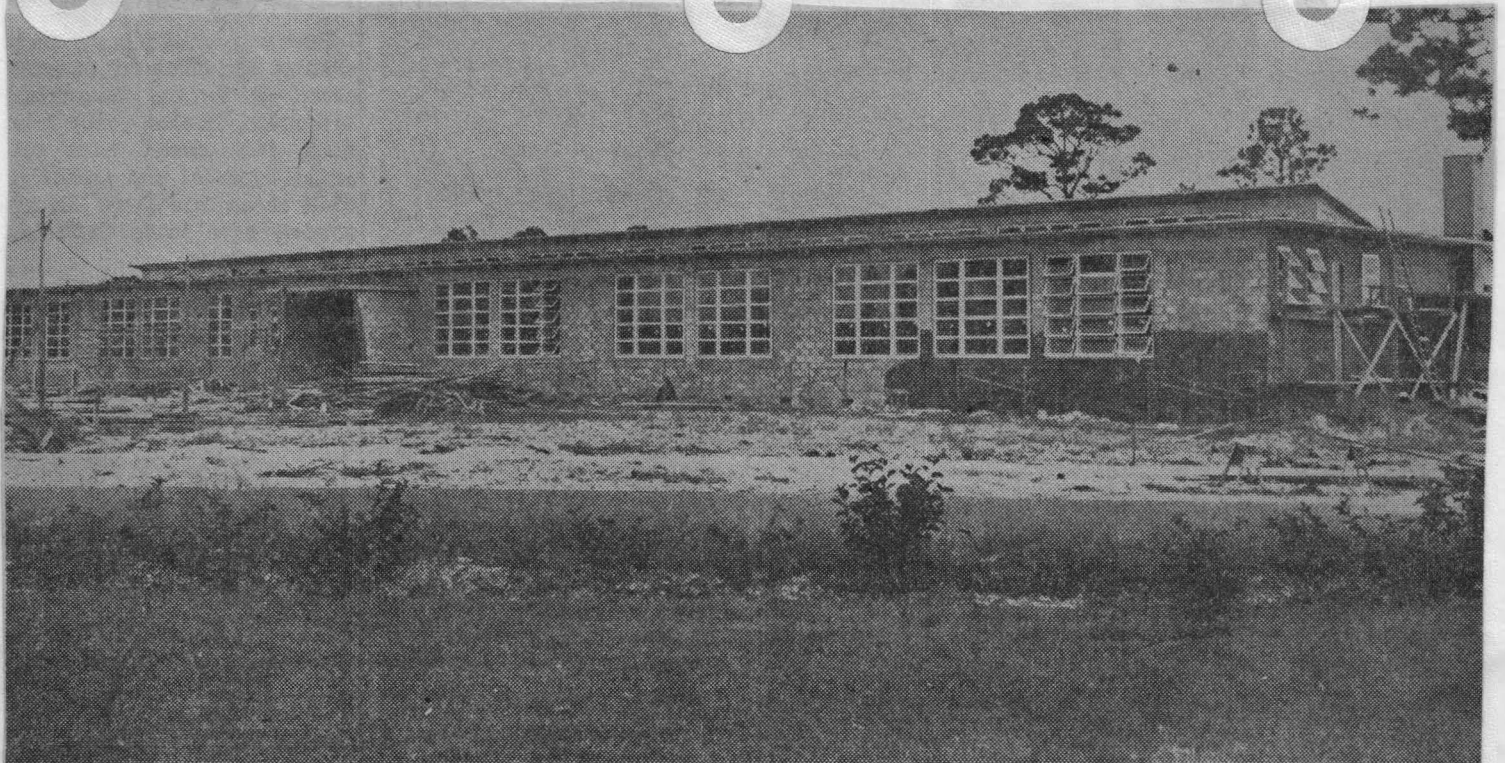

Wilton Manors Wilton Manors Annexation Protests Grow Votes To Add Approved By On Water Plan New Territory Wide Margin

WILTON MANORS — Protests against a proposed plan to lay a \$62,000 water line system in Wilton Manors and sell it to the city of Ft. Lauderdale were building up here today.

A group of business people met Sunday with Leslie A. Bagwell as unofficial chairman and launched a campaign against the plan as outlined to the village council Friday night by C. Kay Davis, engineer employed to design the system.

"We don't see any sense in building a system and then selling it to Ft. Lauderdale," Bagwell said today.

The objections, he added, are based on a contention that if the service supplied by Ft. Lauderdale should prove unsatisfactory, the village would have no recourse. "If we owned the system, we could drill our own wells, or go to Oakland Park for water, or anything else."

Bagwell said that under the proposed plan, the village would undertake an issue of revenue certificates in the amount of the water system cost. Ft. Lauderdale would supply the water and charge each user \$1.87½ for 5,000 gallons, returning 93 3-4 cents of this amount to the village to retire the certificates. In addition, each consumer would pay \$1.06¼ cents a month to the village to help pay off the certificates.

The plan proposes, Bagwell said, that Ft. Lauderdale would become the eventual owner of the system.

His group feels, he added, that "if the village floats a revenue bond issue, the consumers can pay for it at less than the sum per month estimated by the engineer and that ownership of the system can be retained by the village."

Bagwell contended that the village itself could buy water from Ft. Lauderdale for \$1.25 per 5,000 gallons and sell it at \$1.87½ to consumers.

A formal protest will be filed at the next meeting of the council, Bagwell announced.

Wilton Manors residents prepared today to absorb the 150 persons and the nearly 600 acres of unincorporated Middleton Gardens, following overwhelming approval of the annexation in a referendum election Thursday.

Only five of the 137 Wilton Manors voters who went to the polls opposed the move. At Middleton Gardens, the vote was 57 in favor and two against.

Outcome of the referendum was a setback to Ft. Lauderdale's hopes of growing northward. The city had envisioned annexing several sections north of its present limits and had advertised a state legislative bill authorizing the action.

The Wilton Manors election not only killed Ft. Lauderdale's chances of getting Middleton Gardens, but virtually cut the city off from another section it wants, the Dye subdivision north of Middleton Gardens.

As Wilton Manors civic leaders celebrated the outcome of the referendum, it was indicated that the community of Highland Estates north of the village also desires to be annexed.

J. Marvin Brown, Wilton Manors councilman and a leader in the annexation campaign, said he had been approached on the subject by leaders of the Highland Estates civic association, and that they plan to discuss the matter with the council at its meeting tonight.

Results of the referendum will be certified to the council tonight, Brown said, and an ordinance putting the annexation into effect probably will be drawn.

Middleton Gardens occupies a triangle lying between the north and south forks of Middle river, which join near Federal hwy., and east of the Florida East Coast road.

WILTON MANORS — Voters of Wilton Manors and Middleton Gardens subdivision gave their approval to the annexation of the subdivision by the billage in a referendum Thursday.

The vote was one-sided. Of 137 voters in Wilton Manors only five voted against annexation. In the subdivision the residents voted 57 to 2 for the move.

Middleton Gardens lies in a triangle between Wilton Manors and Fort Lauderdale.

Annexation of the area by Wilton Manors ends the hopes of Fort Lauderdale officials to bring it and other subdivisions to the north of their city.

Police To Install Two-Way Radios

WILTON MANORS—Plans are underway for the installation of a two-way radio in Wilton Manors' police patrol car.

Police Commissioner J. Marvin Brown was authorized by the city council at its last meeting to investigate the possibility of operating the radio through the Ft. Lauderdale police department network.

Brown said he planned to confer with Ft. Lauderdale authorities within the next few days.

C. Kay Davis, engineer employed to design the proposed water system for Wilton Manors, will make a partial report to the council.

Wilton Manors today was expected to vote on another expansion move. A delegation from the Highland Estates Civic association appeared before the village council Friday night and asked that their community be annexed.

Their spokesman, E. W. Smith, requested that the council invite Highland Estates in and take the necessary steps. The council authorized Mayor David Turner to appoint a committee to meet with a civic association committee within a week.

Wilton Manors To Annex Highland Estates by Big Vote

County Election Defeated

The voters of both Wilton Manors and Highland Estates by an overwhelming majority placed their stamp of approval on the annexation of Highland Estates and other areas to the Village of Wilton Manors at a special election held Tuesday, August 7th.

Of 97 votes cast in Wilton Manors, the electorate voted "for" 88 and "against" 9.

In Highland Estates there were 83 votes cast and of this number 78 voted "for" and 5 "against."

The bill for the levying of three-tenths of a mill in additional taxes, with the money to be turned over to the Broward County Economic Development Commission was defeated in the Village by the vote of 57 "against" and 45 "for."

The annexation will take the usual course, first by certification by the election board to the Village Council who in turn will introduce an ordinance to accept Highland Estates as a part of Wilton Manors.

The first voter in Wilton Manors early Tuesday was Elmer Millman of 425 N. E. 25th street while Mrs. Kathryn Burns of 817 N. E. 28th street cast the first ballot in Highland Estates Civic Club.

The annexation election officials at Wilton Manors were Mrs. Clayton Leaver, Chairman; Mrs. Mabyn Thomas, Mrs. James Boyd and Mr. Ray Coleman.

Those serving on the election board in Highland Estates included E. W. McGuire, Chairman; Mrs. Dan Kingman and Mrs. Nettie Lintom.

Those serving as election officials for the County election were: W. P. Hartman, Chairman; Mrs. A. B. Wilkerson, Mrs. Morgan Bryan and Mrs. Harley Sanderson.

The first time the question of annexation came to notice was when a group of interested citizens from Highland Estates appeared before the Council at the May meeting which was held in Village Hall.

This delegation was headed by Ed Smith, who appeared as spokesman and asked the Council for an invitation to annex with Wilton Manors. A short time later a petition was presented to the Council with 149 signatures affixed from residents of Highland Estates favoring such a move. At the present time there are approximately 110 families in Highland Estates with a population of about 350.

At the present time Highland Estates has its own water system and volunteer fire department.

The water question which the Council has been doing preliminary study on for some time has been held in abeyance until the results of this election is known. It is expected now, that shortly, a special meeting will be called to delve into the water supply for the Village.

The substations will be located in Wilton Manors and at S. W. 15th Ave. and State Road 84.

Establishment of four postal units was recommended recently by W. I. Farmer, government postal inspector.

Besides the two for which authorization has been received Farmer recommended also that substations be set up in Davie and in the Gateway development.

REGARDING PROPOSED ADDITION TO CORPORATE LIMITS OF WILTON MANORS

TO ALL RESIDENTS OF WILTON MANORS
and
TO ALL RESIDENTS OF THE PROPOSED ADDITION:-

The PETITION of the residents of the proposed ADDITION for inclusion in the Village of WILTON MANORS poses a general question of future policy. Is Wilton Manors satisfied to remain as it now is - or should it grow in population, area and importance? Growth seems the order of the times.

It appears likely Wilton Manors will be surrounded by an inevitable growth. It is now bounded on three sides by unincorporated areas which in future will be built upon. If these areas remain unincorporated and unrestricted the buildings and uses of same are likely to be of a heterogeneous character and may include some structures or uses quite undesirable such as are familiar to all, thereby lowering the value of adjoining property.

The proposed addition, which for lack of specific designation is herein referred to as Middleton Gardens, includes a considerable area of nice laying property with a large amount of desirable river frontage on both forks of Middle River. The owners have decided that they want reasonable restrictions on future development so as to protect present property values. By nearly unanimous action they have petitioned for annexation to Wilton Manors. The proposed extension includes all the land between the North Fork and the South Fork of Middle River and East of the F.E.C.R.R., thus adjoining Wilton Manors.

The Wilton Manors Village Council has, by unanimous vote, considered the Petition favorably and set April 19 as the date on which an election is to be held at which residents of both the Village and of Middleton Gardens may decide the question. The expense of the election to be borne by the Petitioners.

To become effective, two thirds (2/3) of the registered voters actually voting in each area must approve.

Since this is an important question of policy, the residents of Wilton Manors should actively participate by Registering by April 14th and by voting on April 19th. Registration Books for Wilton Manors open daily at office of Tropical Homes Co., 2006 Wilton Drive. For greater convenience, Registration Books will be available at Manor Market, Friday April 13th and Saturday, April 14th, Vote at Village Hall.

If the voters approve the extension, steps will be immediately taken to secure Right-of-Way for a County Road to be built from Wilton Manors, thru the new area to connect with the Federal Highway. This seems highly advantageous.

Looking further into the future, if the rumored subdivision of the Galt property east of the Federal Highway is consummated it is likely that this route would provide a more nearly direct approach to the ocean which would also be desirable.

The principal objection to approval seems to be that another trailer park would be brought into Wilton Manors. However, the trailer park would be subject to Wilton Manors Ordinance as to no extension of present park and no other new trailer park or other undesirable development could be located in the new addition.

The advantages and disadvantages of the proposed extension have been carefully considered by the Wilton Manors Village Council and the conclusion reached that the extension is desirable. The voters have the final decision. All should register and vote April 19th, 7 A. M. to 7 P. M.

Mayor Dave Turner has said, and authorized quotation, "Wilton Manors has grown rapidly and well. It looks to me like a good idea to encourage further growth. I favor the extension".




