# Old Clark Homestead Bought For Use As Site For Stores

Purchase of the Clark home at 201 SE Second st., one of Ft. Lauderdale's landmarks, by Wen Milligan, was announced today. Milligan said the purchase price of \$210,000 would be paid in yearly payments for 50 years, and that the property on which store buildings will be erected included 145 feet of land adjoining Second st., and

50 feet on SE Second ave. Sheriff Walter Clark, one of the first white babies born in Broward county was born in the home in 1904.

It was run as a boarding home by Mrs. Annie Clark until 1935, two years prior to her death. Since the death of Mrs. Clark, one of the best known and liked of this city's pioneers, Mr. and Mrs. I. G. Cranton, had rented the building. They moved recently when the four Clark brothers decided to sell.

The property was owned by Howard, Frank, Robert and Walter Clark, all sons of Mrs. Annie Clark.

## Built In 1900

Robert, now chief deputy sheriff for Broward county, said that the home was built, to the best of his knowledge, during the year 1900, or shortly thereafter.

Milligan said the home, behind the city post office, may not be torn down for as long as three years. Construction will get underway in two weeks on a six-store building on the property, he asserted, and he anticipated that this would be completed and ready for occupancy by October, 1947.

However, the completion of a proposed building to house 14 stores and 18 offices will not be a reality for "some years," Milligan declared, adding that just how long would depend upon future building prices.

"We will build upon the six-store building when the time comes, and only then will it be necessary to do away with the Clark home," Milligan explained.
