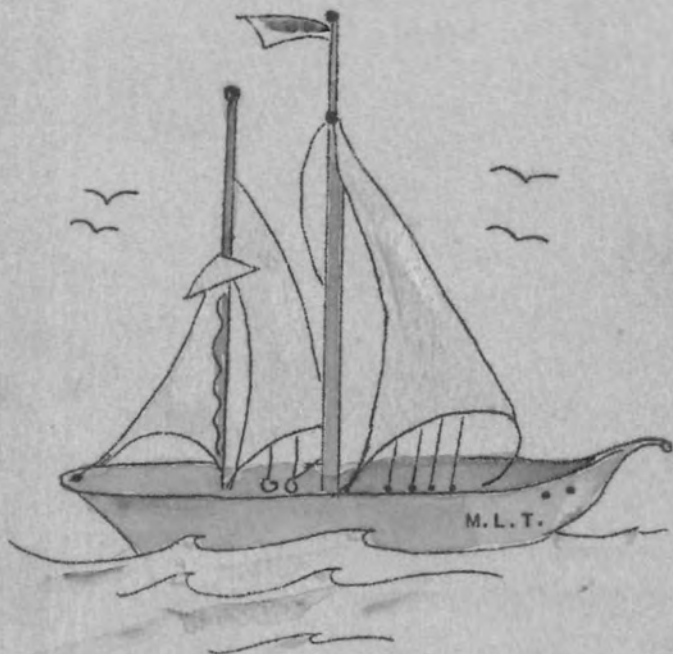

THE WOMAN'S CLUB OF WILTON MANORS

COMPLETE BY-LAWS

as Revised and Approved March 1957

* * *

Article I.

Name

The name of this organization shall be "The Woman's Club of Wilton Manors".

Article II.

Object

The object of this organization shall be to further religious, educational, cultural and civic activities of the community. It shall be non-political and non-sectarian.

Article III.

Members

Section 1. White women, of good

character and of good standing in the community, interested in the objects of this organization, shall be eligible to membership.

Section 2. Names of prospective members shall be presented to the Membership Committee. These prospective members must be known by three members of the club for six months, and have attended two regular business meetings before being presented a membership application. Upon approval of this application by the Membership Committee, the Membership Chairman will present said application to the Board of Directors for final approval. Initiation fees and dues having been paid, the new member will be enrolled.

Section 3. Transfers of members, in good standing, from other clubs will be accepted upon the payment of the regular dues of six dollars.

Section 4. Associate Members - Any member unable to attend regular business meetings, or to take part in the activities or projects of the club may become

an Associate Member. These members not being privileged to vote or hold office, shall pay Associate Membership fee of \$15.00.

Section 5. Limitation of Membership
The Woman's Club of Wilton Manors membership shall not exceed one hundred members.

Article IV.

Officers

Section 1. The Officers of this organization shall be a President, a First Vice President, a Second Vice President, a Third Vice President, a Recording Secretary, a Financial Secretary, a Treasurer, and a Board of Five Directors, to be elected as hereinafter provided.

Officers shall be elected to serve one year, or until their successors are duly elected and qualified. Directors shall be elected to serve for two years or until their successors are duly elected and qualified. The retiring President shall serve on the Board of Directors for one year. Officers and Directors shall take office at the Installation of Officers.

Section 2. Duties of Officers

President - The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club, shall be Chairman of the Board of Directors; shall call special meetings as provided in the By-Laws; shall exercise general supervision over all activities of the club.

The President shall be a delegate to all State Conventions and State Board Meetings; also District and County Meetings, while in office. She shall present a written report at the Installation of Officers.

The First Vice-President - shall preside in the absence of the President. She shall act as general assistant to the President. She shall be chairman of Programs, and compile and edit the Year Books. She shall be responsible for the execution of programs.

The Second Vice-President - Shall preside in the absence of the President and First Vice-President. She shall be Membership Chairman. She shall be responsible for making personal calls on

Members who have missed two consecutive meetings, and investigate resignations before they are presented to the Board of Directors for action.

Third Vice-President: Shall preside in the absence of President, First Vice-President and Second Vice-President. She shall be Social Chairman. She shall be Chairman of all Social Functions and the Social Committee. She shall be a member of the Program Committee and responsible for hostesses at each regular meeting. The program chairman and hostesses for the day shall be responsible for the refreshment expenses.

The Recording Secretary - Shall keep correct records of all regular and special meetings of the General Club and Board of Directors. She shall prepare for the President from the minutes of each meeting a memorandum of all unfinished business, and shall prepare the President's report of all County, District and State Meetings.

The Corresponding Secretary - Shall conduct all correspondence of the Club, shall send necessary notices to Members, and shall notify Members of Board of Directors of meetings.

The Financial Secretary - Shall receive all dues, giving receipts for same, and shall turn over all monies received to the Treasurer.

During the first week in October she shall send written notices to members who have failed to pay their dues up to that time.

The Treasurer - Shall handle all monies of the Club, keeping a correct record of all receipts and disbursements and of the amount on hand and shall report at each regular meeting the amount on hand at that time. She shall deposit all funds belonging to the club in a reliable bank chosen by the Board of Directors in the name of the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors.

The Treasurer shall have power to pay current operating expenses when due. She shall issue checks only upon receipt of

itemized bills and upon order of the Board of Directors. She shall, by order of the Board of Directors, refund from the Treasury necessary expense incurred by those in the service of the Club. She shall be ex officio of Ways and Means Committee. All checks shall be signed by both President and Treasurer. She shall be ex-officio of the House Committee.

Section 3. A vacancy occurring in an office shall be filled until the next annual election by the Board of Directors. The election shall be by ballot.

Section 4. Resignations of Officers or Directors shall be accepted upon the approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 5. No member shall hold more than one office at any one time, and no member shall be eligible for more than two consecutive terms in the same office, excepting the Directors who are elected to serve for two years and cannot, therefore, serve two consecutive terms.

Article V.

Board of Directors

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall consist of Officers, Directors, Parliamentarian, Ways and Means Chairman, House Chairman and such Department heads as the Board of Directors deems advisable. The Board of Directors shall meet once a month throughout the year, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. The Board of Directors shall carry on the routine business of the Club and make recommendations and offer plans for the approval of the club when necessary.

Article VI.

Elections

Section 1. Officers shall be elected the Third Tuesday in March of each year. Three Directors shall be elected at a meeting to be held the Third Tuesday of March each odd numbered year, and two on

even numbered years. Voting in the elections shall be by written ballot. A majority vote of the Membership present at said elections shall be required to elect any officer or director.

Section 2. Nominations for Officers and Directors shall be made by a Committee of three. The Chairman of the Nominating Committee shall be elected by ballot by the Board of Directors. Two members of the Nominating Committee shall be elected by the club, at a regular meeting, on the first Tuesday in February. Nominations from the floor may be made at the meeting on the third Tuesday in March, regular election day, provided the consent of the nominee has been previously obtained.

Section 3. The Nominating Committee shall post on the billboard at the Club room the first regular meeting in March the names of nominee for each office.

Section 4. No member shall be eligible to hold office until she has been a member of the club one year. No member shall be nominated for the Office

of President unless she has served in an Elective Office previously, and been in the club at least two years.

Article VII.

Meetings

Section 1. Regular meetings of the Club shall be held on the First and Third Tuesdays of each month from September to May, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

The Board of Directors shall meet the Fourth Tuesday of each month, throughout the year, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Special meetings of the organization may be called by the President or shall be called upon written request of ten members.

Section 3. The Regular meeting the Third Tuesday in March shall be the Annual business meeting, at which time all the officers, department chairmen

and chairmen of Standing Committees shall submit written annual reports. This is a meeting for Members Only.

Article VIII.

Dues

Section 1. The fiscal year shall begin on April First of each year.

Section 2. Annual dues shall be (\$6.00) six dollars, payable each April in advance.

Section 3. Any member in arrears for dues at the first meeting in November shall not be permitted to vote, and shall be automatically dropped from the rolls.

Section 4. Initiation fee of (\$4) four dollars shall be paid by each new member, with the exception of transfer members who pay only the regular dues of six dollars (\$6.00). Any new member joining the Club after January First, shall pay one half the yearly dues plus initiation fee - which would be seven dollars (\$7.00).

Article IX.

Departments and Committees

Section 1. The Departments of the Club shall be: - (1) American Home, (2) Communications, (3) Community Affairs, (4) Conservation of Natural Resources, (5) Education, (6) Fine Arts, (7) International Affairs, (8) Public Affairs, (9) Religions of the World, (10) Legislation.

Section 2. The President shall have authority to appoint Chairmen for any special Committee for which the need may arise.

Article X.

Quorums

Section 1. Eleven (11) Members shall constitute a quorum for all regular and special meetings of the Club.

Section 2. Five members (5) shall constitute a quorum for all regular and

special meetings of the Board of Directors.

Article XI.

Section 1. The Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary shall turn over all books and papers of the Club in her custody to her successor at the Installation of Officers. The Treasurer, in addition to her book, shall turn over all monies and vouchers. The Treasurer shall have the final report audited by an Auditing Committee appointed by the Board of Directors.

Article XII.

Parliamentary Authority

Section 1. The rules contained in "Robert's Rules of Order Revised" shall govern the organization in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are inconsistent with these By-Laws.

Section 2. The Parliamentarian shall be appointed by the President subject to the approval of the Board of Directors

and shall attend all meetings including the Board of Directors Meetings.

Article XIII.

Amendments to Charter and By-Laws

Amendments and alterations to the Charter of this organization shall be proposed and presented to the Membership of the organization by the Board of Directors as constituted by existing By-Laws, after written notice of such presentation shall have been duly served upon said Membership. Such amendments or alterations shall be read at two consecutive meetings, and may then be passed upon by a vote of two-thirds of the Membership present. The organization shall then petition the Circuit Court for approval of such amendments and alterations in accordance with Section 617.02 Florida Statutes Annotated.

By-Laws and Amendments and Alterations thereto, shall be proposed and presented by the Board of Directors in the same manner as Amendments and Alterations to Charter, and after being passed upon by

a vote of two-thirds of the Membership present, shall become part of the By-Laws of the Organization.

For the purpose of acting upon the amendments to the Charter or By-Laws, it shall be necessary for at least eleven (11) members of the organization in good standing to be present, which said number of members constitutes a quorum.

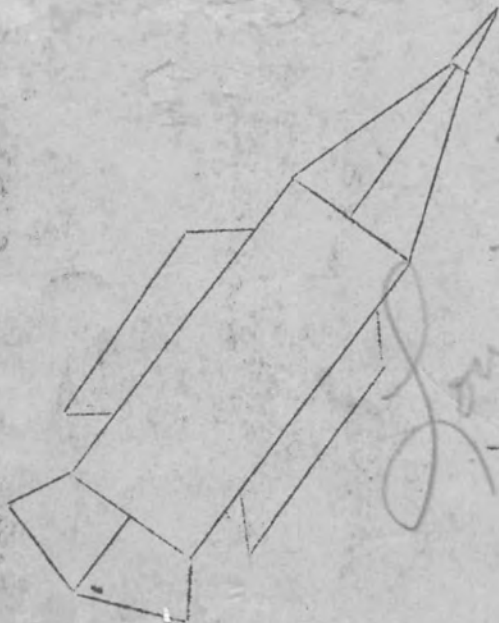

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be The Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc., located in the City of Wilton Manors, Broward County, Florida.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

The object of this organization shall be to further religious, educational, cultural and civic activities of the community. It shall be non-political and non-sectarian.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The qualifications for membership shall be women of good character and good standing in the community, having an interest in the objects of this organization.

Section 2. A. A prospective member shall have attended two meetings as a guest and shall have been introduced to the general membership before her application for membership is presented.

B. Names of prospective members shall be presented to the membership committee only by members of at least one year's standing. Applications to be signed by the membership chairman and two members, one sponsor knowing the applicant for a period of at least six months.

C. After an interview with the prospective member, the membership chairman shall collect the initiation fee and bring the name before the Board of Directors

for final action. If accepted the new member shall be enrolled and the dues collected.

Section 3. An applicant for membership may be rejected by three dissenting votes on a closed ballot by the Board of Directors. The applicant shall then be informed by the membership chairman and the initiation fee refunded.

Section 4. A. The membership of this organization shall consist of three classes: Active, Inactive and Life.

B. Active members shall consider themselves honor bound to attend the meetings regularly, take an active part in the program and projects of the organization and shall be entitled to all privileges of membership. Each active member shall serve as hostess at a regular meeting and a card party at least once a year. The privilege of holding office, making motions, debating and voting shall not be extended to those members whose dues are in arrears.

C. Inactive members shall be entitled to all privileges of membership except holding office, upon application to the membership committee. An active member may become an inactive member for a specified time with the approval of the Board of Directors.

D. Life membership is bestowed by the club upon a member for outstanding service rendered to the club. This shall be a paid up membership and includes all the privileges of voting, holding office and participating in all activities and projects.

Section 5. Transfer memberships from other Federated clubs shall be accepted upon presentation of a current membership card and letter of transfer together with the payment of the regular dues.

Section 6. A member of the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall not hold any membership in another Federated Woman's Club in this District.

Section 7. Resignations shall be presented by the membership committee to and accepted by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. A member who has resigned from the club in good standing may be reinstated by making application to the membership committee.

ARTICLE IV - DUES

Section 1. The fiscal year shall begin on May first of each year at which time the annual dues of Eight Dollars (\$8.00) shall be due and payable.

Section 2. Any member whose dues are not paid by November first shall be suspended from membership after written notice.

Section 3. An initiation fee of Four Dollars (\$4.00) shall be paid by each new member, with the exception of transfer members who shall pay the annual dues of Eight Dollars (\$8.00) only. A new member joining the organization after January first shall pay Four Dollars (\$4.00) which is one half the annual dues.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a president, first vice president, second vice president, third vice president, recording secretary, corresponding secretary, financial secretary, treasurer and five directors.

Section 2. A. The officers shall be elected annually, the term of office being for one year or until their successors are elected and installed.

B. No member shall be entitled to hold an elective office who has not been a member at least one year. No member shall be eligible to hold the office of president who has not been a member for at least two years and served in an elective office.

C. No member shall hold more than one office at any one time. No member shall serve in the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 3. A. The elected officers, the parliamentary, the Junior Sponsor, the immediate past president and the department chairmen shall constitute the Board of Directors.

B. The Board of Directors shall meet the fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

C. Seven (7) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall carry on the routine business of the organization, make recommendations and propose plans for the approval of the general membership.

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall recommend standing rules to the general membership. Standing rules shall be adopted by a majority vote of the membership present at any meeting without previous notice having been given; may be suspended by a majority vote or amended or rescinded by a two thirds (2/3) vote of those present.

ARTICLE VI - ELECTIONS

Section 1. A. Nominations for officers and directors shall be made by a nominating committee of three members. The chairman of the nominating committee shall be elected by the Board of Directors in January. Two members shall be elected by the general membership at the regular meeting on the first Tuesday in February. The nominating committee shall report and post the names of nominees on the bulletin board in the club house at the first regular business meeting in March. Nominations may be made from the floor on the third Tuesday in March. The consent of each nominee must be obtained before her name is placed in nomination.

B. The nominating committee shall be responsible for informing nominees of their duties according to these by-laws.

Section 2. A. Election shall be held by ballot annually on the third Tuesday in March. However, if there is only one nominee for each office, it shall be in order to move that the secretary cast the elective ballot of the organization for the entire slate.

B. Officers and Directors shall assume their official duties upon installation.

C. Vacancies in office shall be filled by a recommendation of the Board of Directors to the general assembly. Nominations may be made from the floor with election by written ballot. If there is only one nominee the secretary may cast the elective ballot.

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The president shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall call special meetings; shall exercise general supervision over all club activities; shall be a member ex-officio of all committees with the exception of the nominating committee; shall appoint the parliamentarian, the department chairmen, the standing and special committee chairmen; shall serve as a delegate to all State conventions and board meetings, District and County meetings and shall present a written report at the meeting at which officers are installed.

Section 2. The first vice president shall act as aide to the president and shall preside in the absence of the president or at her request. She shall serve as chairman of the program committee and compile and edit the yearbook.

Section 3. The second vice president shall preside in the absence of the president and first vice president; shall serve as chairman of the membership committee; shall contact members who have missed two consecutive meetings; and shall investigate resignations before they are considered by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The third vice president shall preside in the absence of the president, first vice president and second vice president; shall serve as a member of the program committee, shall serve as chairman of the social committee and shall be responsible for the hostesses at each regular meeting.

Section 5. The recording secretary shall keep an accurate record of all regular and special meetings of the general membership and Board of Directors, and shall prepare a

memorandum of all unfinished business from the minutes of each meeting for the use of the president.

Section 6. The corresponding secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the club; shall send necessary notices to members and shall notify members of Board of Directors meetings.

Section 7. The financial secretary shall receive all dues; shall issue receipts for dues paid; shall remit monies at once to the treasurer; shall keep a record of the membership and shall send written notices during the first week in October to all members whose dues are not paid.

Section 8. The treasurer shall receive all monies keeping an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements; shall submit a written report at the first regular meeting of each month of the general membership and at the Board of Directors meeting; shall deposit all monies received in a reliable bank selected by the Board of Directors, in the name of the "Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc." shall have the power to pay current operating expenses when due and shall issue any other checks only upon receipt of itemized bills approved by the Board of Directors. She shall pay out funds by order of the Board of Directors to members to reimburse such members for expenses incurred on behalf of the organization; shall serve as a member ex-officio of the ways and means and budget committees; shall secure the signature of the president and treasurer or the recording secretary on all checks; and shall arrange for an audit of her final report as of April 30th.

Section 9. The five elected directors shall be chairmen as follows: Director #1 - House
 Director #2 - Ways and Means

Director #3 - Press, Publicity & Historian
Director #4 - Finance and Budget
Director #5 - Sunshine and Welfare

Section 10. The treasurer, financial secretary, recording secretary and corresponding secretary shall transfer without delay to their successors all books, papers, monies and vouchers of the organization in their possession at the first Board of Directors meeting after the installation or in case of resignation.

Section 11. The parliamentarian shall attend all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall give the necessary advice on parliamentary procedure when requested.

ARTICLE VIII - MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular meetings of this organization shall be held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month from September to May, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Special meetings of the organization may be called by the president or shall be called upon the written request of ten (10) members.

Section 3. The annual meeting shall be the third Tuesday in April. All officers, department chairmen and standing committee chairmen shall submit written annual reports.

Section 4. Fifteen (15) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5. The date of the installation of officers meeting shall be set by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Guests may be invited to any meeting of the organization except the election meeting in March.

Section 7. The same guest may not attend more than two (2) meetings in one year if eligible for membership.

ARTICLE IX - DEPARTMENTS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. A. The departments of this organization shall conform with that outlined by the State and General Federation. There shall also be evening and bulletin departments.

B. No member shall serve as chairman of the same department for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 2. A. This organization shall sponsor the Junior Woman's Club, Inc. of Wilton Manors.

B. The sponsor of the Junior Woman's Club shall be appointed by the Board of Directors on the recommendation of the Junior and Senior clubs.

Section 3. A. The evening department shall be comprised of members unable to attend the daytime meetings, such reasons being stated upon the membership application or as they may arise.

B. There shall be an evening department coordinator who shall be appointed by the president upon recommendation of the evening department and approved by the Board of Directors. She shall attend all Board of Directors meetings for the purpose of coordinating activities of the evening department with those of the general membership.

Section 4. The standing committees shall be: Budget, program, membership, social, ways and means, press, publicity and historian, sunshine and welfare, house, telephone and transportation.

Section 5. The chairmen of the departments and special

committees shall be appointed by the president with the approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 6. There shall be a standing by-laws revision committee. The chairman shall be appointed by the president and two (2) members elected from the general assembly at the first meeting in September. This committee may submit a revised set of by-laws at a meeting of the general assembly. The chairman shall read the revised by-laws at two (2) regular business meetings for adoption by the general assembly.

ARTICLE X. - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Section 1. The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order Revised shall govern the organization in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these by-laws.

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the organization by a two thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting, provided written notice of the proposed amendment shall have been sent to the entire membership and the proposed amendments read at two (2) consecutive meetings.

Section 2. Proposed revisions must be consistent with the charter provision in accordance with Section 617.02, Florida Statutes Annotated.

As Revised and Approved March 7, 1967.

STANDING CLUB RULES and HOUSE RULES

1. No intoxicating liquors will be served on the premises.
2. No equipment shall be removed from the club house unless for use in club activities; permission to be obtained from house chairman or president.
3. Members in good standing desiring to use the club house for special function may do so by paying only Five Dollars (\$5.00) to cover the expenses for electricity and water.
4. Luncheon expenses for appointed delegates to District and County election meetings will be assumed by the club.
5. An allowance will be made for the president's expenses.
6. Every member is required to serve as hostess at a regular meeting and at a card party once during the club year. If unable to serve on the appointed date it is up to the member to arrange for a substitute. A donation of \$2.00 toward the day's expenses should be made to the chairman of the hostesses at a regular meeting if committee member is unable to serve at all.
7. The chairman of the day will be responsible for the dish towels being laundered and returned to the club house promptly.

8. Any extra tables used other than those set up should be returned to the storage area.
9. Building shall be left in as good condition as found.



BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be The Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc., located in the City of Wilton Manors, Broward County, Florida

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

The object of this organization shall be to further religious, educational, cultural and civic activities of the community. It shall be non-political and non-sectarian.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The qualifications for membership shall be women of good character and good standing in the community, having an interest in the objects of this organization.

Section 2. A. A prospective member shall have attended two meetings as a guest and shall have been introduced to the general membership before her application for membership is presented.

B. Names of prospective members shall be presented to the membership committee only by members of at least one year's standing. Applications to be signed by the membership chairman and two members, one sponsor knowing the applicant for a period of at least six months.

C. After an interview with the prospective member, the membership chairman shall collect the initiation fee and bring the name before the Board of Directors for final action. If accepted the new member

shall be enrolled and the dues collected.

Section 3. An applicant for membership may be rejected by three dissenting votes on a closed ballot by the Board of Directors. The applicant shall then be informed by the membership chairman and the initiation fee refunded.

Section 4. A. The membership of this organization shall consist of three classes: Active, Inactive and Life.

B. Active members shall consider themselves honor bound to attend the meetings regularly, take an active part in the program and projects of the organization and shall be entitled to all privileges of membership. Each active member shall serve as hostess at a regular meeting and a card party at least once a year. The privilege of holding office, making motions, debating and voting shall not be extended to those members whose dues are in arrears.

C. Inactive members shall be entitled to all privileges of membership except holding office. Upon application to the membership committee, an active member may become an inactive member for a specified time with the approval of the Board of Directors.

D. Life membership is bestowed by the club upon a member for outstanding service rendered to the club. This shall be a paid up membership and includes all the privileges of voting, holding office and participating in all activities and projects.

Section 5. Transfer memberships from other Federated clubs shall be accepted upon presentation of a current membership card and letter of transfer together with the payment of the regular dues.

Section 6. A member of the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall not hold any membership in another Federated Woman's Club in this District.

Section 7. Resignations shall be presented by the membership committee to and accepted by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. A member who has resigned from the club in good standing may be reinstated by making application to the membership committee.

ARTICLE IV - DUES

Section 1. The fiscal year shall begin on May first of each year at which time the annual dues of Eight Dollars (\$8.00) shall be due and payable.

Section 2. Any member whose dues are not paid by November first shall be suspended from membership after written notice.

Section 3. An initiation fee of Four Dollars (\$4.00) shall be paid by each new member, with the exception of transfer members who shall pay the annual dues of Eight Dollars (\$8.00) only. A new member joining the organization after January first shall pay Four Dollars (\$4.00) which is one half the annual dues.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a president, first vice president, second vice president, third vice president, recording secretary, corresponding secretary, financial secretary, treasurer and five directors.

Section 2. A. The officers shall be elected

annually, the term of office being for one year or until their successors are elected and installed.

B. No member shall be entitled to hold an elective office who has not been a member at least one year. No member shall be eligible to hold the office of president who has not been a member for at least two years and served in an elective office.

C. No member shall hold more than one office at any one time. No member shall serve in the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 3. A. The elected officers, the parliamentarian, the Junior Sponsor, the immediate past president and the department chairmen shall constitute the Board of Directors.

B. The Board of Directors shall meet the fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

C. Seven (7) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall carry on the routine business of the organization, make recommendations and propose plans for the approval of the general membership.

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall recommend standing rules to the general membership. Standing rules shall be adopted by a majority vote of the membership present at any meeting without previous notice having been given; may be suspended by a majority vote or amended or rescinded by a two thirds (2/3) vote of those present.

ARTICLE VI - ELECTIONS

Section 1. A. Nominations for officers and directors shall be made by a nominating committee of three members. The chairman of the nominating committee shall be elected by the Board of Directors in January. Two members shall be elected by the general membership at the regular meeting on the first Tuesday in February. The nominating committee shall report and post the names of nominees on the bulletin board in the club house at the first regular business meeting in March. Nominations may be made from the floor on the third Tuesday in March. The consent of each nominee must be obtained before her name is placed in nomination.

B. The nominating committee shall be responsible for informing nominees of their duties according to these by-laws.

Section 2. A. Election shall be held by ballot annually on the third Tuesday in March. However, if there is only one nominee for each office, it shall be in order to move that the secretary cast the elective ballot of the organization for the entire slate.

B. Officers and Directors shall assume their official duties upon installation.

C. Vacancies in office shall be filled by a recommendation of the Board of Directors to the general assembly. Nominations may be made from the floor with election by written ballot. If there is only one nominee the secretary may cast the elective ballot.

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The president shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall call special meetings; shall exercise general supervision over all club activities; shall be a member ex-officio of all committees with the exception of the nominating committee; shall appoint the parliamentarian, the department chairmen, the standing and special committee chairmen; shall serve as a delegate to all State conventions and board meetings, District and County meetings and shall present a written report at the meeting at which officers are installed.

Section 2. The first vice president shall act as aide to the president and shall preside in the absence of the president or at her request. She shall serve as chairman of the program committee and compile and edit the yearbook.

Section 3. The second vice president shall preside in the absence of the president and first vice president; shall serve as chairman of the membership committee; shall contact members who have missed two consecutive meetings; and shall investigate resignations before they are considered by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The third vice president shall preside in the absence of the president, first vice president and second vice president; shall serve as a member of the program committee, shall serve as chairman of the social committee and shall be responsible for the hostesses at each regular meeting.

Section 5. The recording secretary shall keep an accurate record of all regular and special meetings of the general membership and Board of Directors, and shall prepare a memorandum of all unfinished business

from the minutes of each meeting for the use of the president.

Section 6. The corresponding secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the club; shall send necessary notices to members and shall notify members of Board of Directors meetings.

Section 7. The financial secretary shall receive all dues; shall issue receipts for dues paid; shall remit monies at once to the treasurer; shall keep a record of the membership and shall send written notices during the first week in October to all members whose dues are not paid.

Section 8. The treasurer shall receive all monies keeping an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements; shall submit a written report at the first regular meeting of each month of the general membership and at the Board of Directors meeting; shall deposit all monies received in a reliable bank selected by the Board of Directors, in the name of the "Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc."; shall have the power to pay current operating expenses when due and shall issue any other checks only upon receipt of itemized bills approved by the Board of Directors. She shall pay out funds by order of the Board of Directors to members to reimburse such members for expenses incurred on behalf of the organization; shall serve as a member ex-officio of the ways and means and budget committees; shall secure the signature of the president and treasurer or the recording secretary on all checks; and shall arrange for an audit of her final report as of April 30th.

Section 9. The five elected directors shall be chairmen as follows:

Director #1 - House
Director #2 - Ways and Means
Director #3 - Press, Publicity and
Historian
Director #4 - Finance and Budget
Director #5 - Sunshine and Welfare

Section 10. The treasurer, financial secretary, recording secretary and corresponding secretary shall transfer without delay to their successors all books, papers, monies and vouchers of the organization in their possession at the first Board of Directors meeting after the installation or in case of resignation.

Section 11. The parliamentarian shall attend all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall give the necessary advice on parliamentary procedure when requested.

ARTICLE VIII - MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular meetings of this organization shall be held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month from September to May, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Special meetings of the organization may be called by the president or shall be called upon the written request of ten (10) members.

Section 3. The annual meeting shall be the third Tuesday in April. All officers, department chairmen and standing committee chairmen shall submit written annual reports.

Section 4. Fifteen (15) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5. The date of the installation of officers meeting shall be set by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Guests may be invited to any meeting of the organization except the election meeting in March.

Section 7. The same guest may not attend more than two (2) meetings in one year if eligible for membership.

ARTICLE IX - DEPARTMENTS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. A. The departments of this organization shall conform with that outlined by the State and General Federation. There shall also be evening and bulletin departments.

B. No member shall serve as chairman of the same department for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 2. A. This organization shall sponsor the Junior Woman's Club, Inc. of Wilton Manors.

B. The sponsor of the Junior Woman's Club shall be appointed by the Board of Directors on the recommendation of the Junior and Senior clubs.

Section 3. A. The evening department shall be comprised of members unable to attend the daytime meetings, such reasons being stated upon the membership application or as they may arise.

B. There shall be an evening department coordinator who shall be appointed by the president upon recommendation of the evening department and approved by the Board of Directors. She shall attend all Board of Directors meetings for the purpose of coordinating activities of the evening department with those of the general membership.

Section 4. The standing committees shall be: Budget, program, membership, social, ways and means,

press, publicity and historian, sunshine and welfare, house, telephone and transportation.

Section 5. The chairmen of the departments and special committees shall be appointed by the president with the approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 6. There shall be a standing by-laws revision committee. The chairman shall be appointed by the president and two (2) members elected from the general assembly at the first meeting in September. This committee may submit a revised set of by-laws at a meeting of the general assembly. The chairman shall read the revised by-laws at two (2) regular business meetings for adoption by the general assembly.

ARTICLE X. - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Section 1. The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order Revised shall govern the organization in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not in consistent with these by-laws.

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the organization by a two thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting, provided written notice of the proposed amendment shall have been sent to the entire membership and the proposed amendments read at two (2) consecutive meetings.

Section 2. Proposed revisions must be consistent with the charter provision in accordance with Section 617.02, Florida Statutes Annotated.

As Revised and Approved March 7, 1967.

STANDING CLUB RULES and HOUSE RULES

1. No intoxicating liquors will be served on the premises.
2. No equipment shall be removed from the club house unless for use in club activities; permission to be obtained from house chairman or president.
3. Members in good standing desiring to use the club house for special function may do so by paying only Five Dollars (\$5.00) to cover the expenses for electricity and water.
4. Luncheon expenses for appointed delegates to District and County election meeting will be assumed by the club.
5. An allowance will be made for the president's expenses.
6. Every member is required to serve as hostess at a regular meeting and at a card party once during the club year. If unable to serve on an appointed date it is up to the member to arrange for a substitute. A donation of \$2.00 toward the day's expenses should be made to the chairman of the hostesses at a regular meeting if committee member is unable to serve at all.
7. The chairman of the day will be responsible for the dish towels being laundered and returned to the club house promptly.
8. Any extra tables used other than those set up should be returned to the storage area.
9. Building shall be left in as good condition as found.

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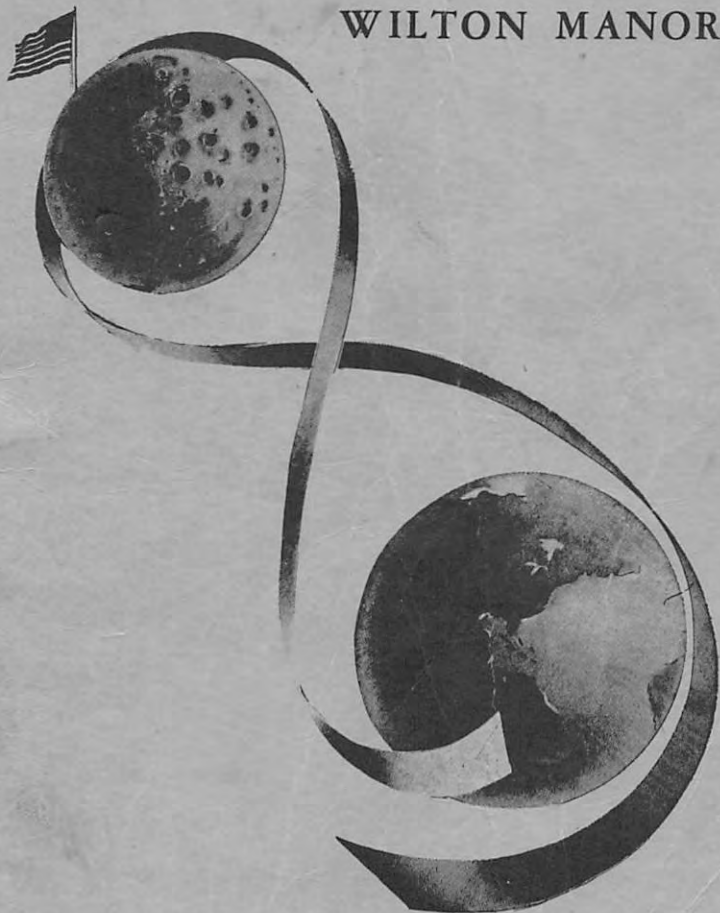



BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be The Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc., located in the City of Wilton Manors, Broward County, Florida.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

The object of this organization shall be to further religious, educational, cultural and civic activities of the community. It shall be non-political and non-sectarian.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The qualifications for membership shall be women of good character and good standing in the community, having an interest in the objects of this organization.

Section 2. A. A prospective member shall have attended two meetings as a guest and shall have been introduced to the general membership before her application for membership is presented.

B. Names of prospective members shall be presented to the membership committee only by members of at least one year's standing. Applications to be signed by the membership chairman and two members, one sponsor knowing the applicant for a period of at least six months.

C. After an interview with the prospective member, the membership chairman shall collect the initiation fee and bring the name before the Board of Directors for final action. If accepted, the new member shall be enrolled and the dues collected.

Section 3. An applicant for membership may be rejected by three dissenting votes on a closed ballot by the Board of Directors. The applicant shall then be informed by the membership chairman and the initiation fee refunded.

Section 4. A. The membership of this organization shall consist of three classes: Active, Inactive and Life.

B. Active members shall consider themselves honor bound to attend the meetings regularly, take an active part in the program and projects of the organization and shall be entitled to all privileges of membership. Each active member shall serve as hostess at a regular meeting and a card party at least once a year. The privilege of holding office, making motions, debating and voting shall not be extended to those members whose dues are in arrears.

C. Inactive members shall be entitled to all privileges of membership except holding office. Upon application to the membership committee, an active member may become an inactive member for a specified time with the approval of the Board of Directors.

D. Life membership is bestowed by the club upon a member for outstanding service rendered to the club. This shall be a paid up membership and includes all the privileges of voting, holding office and participating in all activities and projects.

Section 5. Transfer memberships from other Federated clubs shall be accepted upon presentation of a current membership card and letter of transfer together with the payment of the regular dues.

Section 6. A member of the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall not hold any membership in another Federated Woman's Club in this District.

Section 7. Resignations shall be presented by the membership committee to and accepted by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. A member who has resigned from the club in good standing may be reinstated by making application to the membership committee.

ARTICLE IV - DUES

Section 1. The fiscal year shall begin on May first of each year at which time the annual dues of Eight

Dollars (\$8.00) shall be due and payable.

Section 2. Any member whose dues are not paid by November first shall be suspended from membership after written notice.

Section 3. An initiation fee of Four Dollars (\$4.00) shall be paid by each new member, with the exception of transfer members who shall pay the annual dues of Eight Dollars (\$8.00) only. A new member joining the organization after January first shall pay Four Dollars (\$4.00) which is one half the annual dues.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Third Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Financial Secretary, Treasurer and five Directors.

Section 2. A. The officers shall be elected annually, the term of office being for one year or until their successors are elected and installed.

B. No member shall be entitled to hold an elective office who has not been a member at least one year. No member shall be eligible to hold the office of President who has not been a member for at least two years and served in an elective office.

C. No member shall hold more than one office at any one time. No member shall serve in the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 3. A. The elected officers, the parliamentarian, the Junior Sponsor, the Immediate Past President and the Department Chairmen shall constitute the Board of Directors.

B. The Board of Directors shall meet the fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

C. Seven (7) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall carry on the routine business of the organization, make recommendations and propose plans for the approval of the general membership.

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall recommend standing rules to the general membership. Standing rules shall be adopted by a majority vote of the membership present at any meeting without previous notice having been given; may be suspended by a majority vote or amended or rescinded by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present.

ARTICLE VI - ELECTIONS

Section 1. A. Nominations for officers and directors shall be made by a nominating committee of three members. The chairman of the nominating committee shall be elected by the Board of Directors in January. Two members shall be elected by the general membership at the regular meeting on the first Tuesday in February. The nominating committee shall report and post the names of nominees on the bulletin board in the clubhouse at the first regular business meeting in March. Nominations may be made from the floor on the third Tuesday in March. The consent of each nominee must be obtained before her name is placed in nomination.

B. The nominating committee shall be responsible for informing nominees of their duties according to these by-laws.

Section 2. A. Election shall be held by ballot annually on the third Tuesday in March. However, if there is only one nominee for each office, it shall be in order to move that the secretary cast the elective ballot of the organization for the entire slate.

B. Officers and Directors shall assume their official duties upon installation.

C. Vacancies in office shall be filled by a recommendation of the Board of Directors to the general assembly. Nominations may be made from the

floor with election by written ballot. If there is only one nominee the secretary may cast the elective ballot.

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall call special meetings; shall exercise general supervision over all club activities; shall be a member ex-officio of all committees with the exception of the nominating committee; shall appoint the parliamentarian, the department chairmen, the standing and special committee chairmen; shall serve as a Delegate to all state conventions and board meetings, District and County meetings and shall present a written report at the meeting at which officers are installed.

Section 2. The First Vice President shall act as aide to the President and shall preside in the absence of the President or at her request. She shall serve as chairman of the program committee and compile and edit the yearbook.

Section 3. The Second Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President and First Vice President; shall serve as chairman of the membership committee; shall contact members who have missed two consecutive meetings; and shall investigate resignations before they are considered by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The Third Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President, First Vice President and Second Vice President; shall serve as a member of the program committee, shall serve as chairman of the social committee and shall be responsible for the hostesses at each regular meeting.

Section 5. The Recording Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all regular and special meetings of the general membership and Board of Directors, and shall prepare a memorandum of all unfinished business from the minutes of each meeting for the use of the President.

Section 6. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the club; shall send necessary notices to members and shall notify members of Board of Directors meetings.

Section 7. The Financial Secretary shall receive all dues; shall issue receipts for dues paid; shall remit monies at once to the treasurer; shall keep a record of the membership and shall send written notices during the first week in October to all members whose dues are not paid.

Section 8. The Treasurer shall receive all monies, keeping an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements; shall submit a written report at the first regular meeting of each month of the general membership and at the Board of Directors meeting; shall deposit all monies received in a reliable bank selected by the Board of Directors, in the name of the "Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc."; shall have the power to pay current operating expenses when due and shall issue any other checks only upon receipt of itemized bills approved by the Board of Directors. She shall pay out funds by order of the Board of Directors to members to reimburse such members for expenses incurred on behalf of the organization; shall serve as a member ex-officio of the ways and means and budget committees; shall secure the signature of the President and Treasurer or the Recording Secretary on all checks; and shall arrange for an audit of her final report as of April 30th.

Section 9. The five elected Directors shall be chairmen as follows:

- Director #1 - House
- Director #2 - Ways and Means
- Director #3 - Press, Publicity and
Historian
- Director #4 - Finance and Budget
- Director #5 - Sunshine and Welfare

Section 10. The Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary shall

transfer without delay to their successors all books, papers, monies and vouchers of the organization in their possession at the first Board of Directors meeting after the installation or in case of resignation.

Section 11. The Parliamentarian shall attend all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall give the necessary advice on parliamentary procedure when requested.

ARTICLE VIII - MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular meetings of this organization shall be held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month from September to May, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Special meetings of the organization may be called by the President or shall be called upon the written request of ten (10) members.

Section 3. The annual meeting shall be the third Tuesday in April. All officers, department chairmen and standing committee chairmen shall submit written annual reports.

Section 4. Fifteen (15) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5. The date of the installation of officers meeting shall be set by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Guests may be invited to any meeting of the organization except the election meeting in March.

Section 7. The same guest may not attend more than two (2) meetings in one year if eligible for membership.

ARTICLE IX - DEPARTMENTS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. A. The departments of this organization shall conform with that outlined by the State and General Federation. There shall also be evening and bulletin departments.

B. No member shall serve as chairman

of the same department for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 2. A. This organization shall sponsor the Junior Woman's Club, Inc. of Wilton Manors.

B. The sponsor of the Junior Woman's Club shall be appointed by the Board of Directors on the recommendation of the Junior and Senior clubs.

Section 3. A. The evening department shall be comprised of members unable to attend the daytime meetings, such reasons being stated upon the membership application or as they may arise.

B. There shall be an evening department coordinator who shall be appointed by the President upon recommendation of the evening department and approved by the Board of Directors. She shall attend all Board of Directors meetings for the purpose of coordinating activities of the evening department with those of the general membership.

Section 4. The standing committees shall be: Budget, Program, Membership, Social, Ways and Means, Press, Publicity and Historian, Sunshine and Welfare, House, Telephone and Transportation.

Section 5. The chairmen of the departments and special committees shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 6. There shall be a standing By-laws revision committee. The chairman shall be appointed by the President and two (2) members elected from the general assembly at the first meeting in September. This committee may submit a revised set of By-laws at a meeting of the general assembly. The chairman shall read the revised By-laws at two (2) regular business meetings for adoption by the general assembly.

ARTICLE X - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Section 1. The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order Revised shall govern the organization in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these By-laws.

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These By-laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the organization by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting, provided written notice of the proposed amendment shall have been sent to the entire membership and the proposed amendments read at two (2) consecutive meetings.

Section 2. Proposed revisions must be consistent with the charter provision in accordance with Section 617.02, Florida Statutes Annotated.

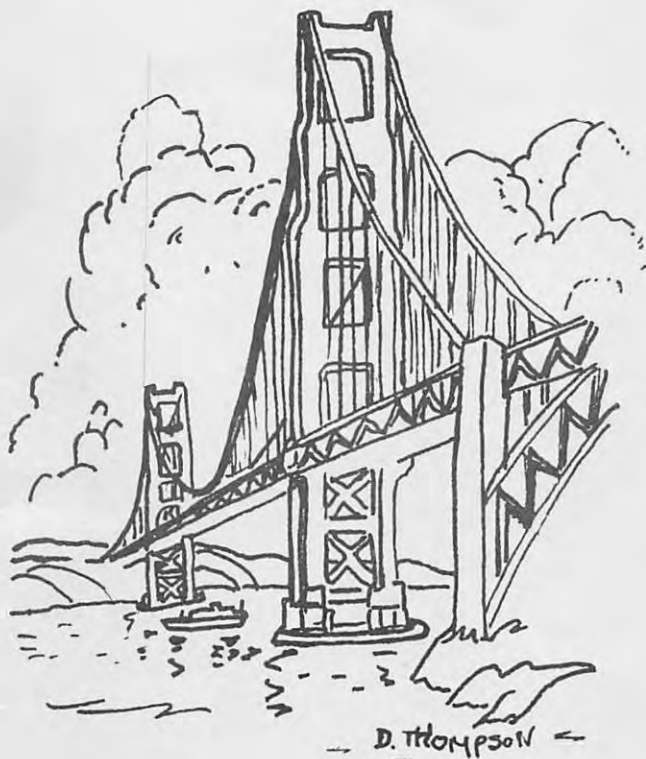

Our theme for this year is "Building Bridges for Tomorrow".





BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be The Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc., located in the City of Wilton Manors, Broward County, Florida.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

The object of this organization shall be to further religious, educational, cultural and civic activities of the community. It shall be non-political and non-sectarian.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The qualifications for membership shall be women of good character and good standing in the community, having an interest in the objects of this organization.

Section 2. A. A prospective member shall have attended two meetings as a guest and shall have been introduced to the general membership before her application for membership is presented.

B. Names of prospective members shall be presented to the membership committee only by members of at least one year's standing. Applications to be signed by the membership chairman and two members, one sponsor knowing the applicant for a period of at least six months.

C. After an interview with the prospective member, the membership chairman shall collect the initiation fee and bring the name before the Board of Directors for final action. If accepted, the new member shall be enrolled and the dues collected.

Section 3. An applicant for membership may be rejected by three dissenting votes on a closed ballot by the Board of Directors. The applicant shall then be informed by the membership chairman and the initiation fee refunded.

Section 4. A. The membership of this organization shall consist of three classes: Active, Inactive and Life.

B. Active members shall consider themselves honor bound to attend the meetings regularly, take an active part in the program and projects of the organization and shall be entitled to all privileges of membership. Each active member shall serve as hostess at a regular meeting and a card party at least once a year. The privilege of holding office, making motions, debating and voting shall not be extended to those members whose dues are in arrears.

C. Inactive members shall be entitled to all privileges of membership except holding office. Upon application to the membership committee, an active member may become an inactive member for a specified time with the approval of the Board of Directors.

D. Life membership is bestowed by the club upon a member for outstanding service rendered to the club. This shall be a paid up membership and includes all the privileges of voting, holding office and participating in all activities and projects.

Section 5. Transfer memberships from other Federated clubs shall be accepted upon presentation of a current membership card and letter of transfer together with the payment of the regular dues.

Section 6. A member of the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall not hold any membership in another Federated Woman's Club in this District.

Section 7. Resignations shall be presented by the membership committee to and accepted by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. A member who has resigned from the club in good standing may be reinstated by making application to the membership committee.

ARTICLE IV - DUES

Section 1. The fiscal year shall begin on May first of each year at which time the annual dues of Eight

Dollars (\$8.00) shall be due and payable.

Section 2. Any member whose dues are not paid by November first shall be suspended from membership after written notice.

Section 3. An initiation fee of Four Dollars (\$4.00) shall be paid by each new member, with the exception of transfer members who shall pay the annual dues of Eight Dollars (\$8.00) only. A new member joining the organization after January first shall pay Four Dollars (\$4.00) which is one half the annual dues.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Third Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Financial Secretary, Treasurer and five Directors.

Section 2. A. The officers shall be elected annually, the term of office being for one year or until their successors are elected and installed.

B. No member shall be entitled to hold an elective office who has not been a member at least one year. No member shall be eligible to hold the office of President who has not been a member for at least two years and served in an elective office.

C. No member shall hold more than one office at any one time. No member shall serve in the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 3. A. The elected officers, the parliamentary, the Junior Sponsor, the Immediate Past President and the Department Chairmen shall constitute the Board of Directors.

B. The Board of Directors shall meet the fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

C. Seven (7) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall carry on the routine business of the organization, make recommendations and propose plans for the approval of the general membership.

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall recommend standing rules to the general membership. Standing rules shall be adopted by a majority vote of the membership present at any meeting without previous notice having been given; may be suspended by a majority vote or amended or rescinded by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present.

ARTICLE VI - ELECTIONS

Section 1. A. Nominations for officers and directors shall be made by a nominating committee of three members. The chairman of the nominating committee shall be elected by the Board of Directors in January. Two members shall be elected by the general membership at the regular meeting on the first Tuesday in February. The nominating committee shall report and post the names of nominees on the bulletin board in the clubhouse at the first regular business meeting in March. Nominations may be made from the floor on the third Tuesday in March. The consent of each nominee must be obtained before her name is placed in nomination.

B. The nominating committee shall be responsible for informing nominees of their duties according to these by-laws.

Section 2. A. Election shall be held by ballot annually on the third Tuesday in March. However, if there is only one nominee for each office, it shall be in order to move that the secretary cast the elective ballot of the organization for the entire slate.

B. Officers and Directors shall assume their official duties upon installation.

C. Vacancies in office shall be filled by a recommendation of the Board of Directors to the general assembly. Nominations may be made from the

floor with election by written ballot. If there is only one nominee the secretary may cast the elective ballot.

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall call special meetings; shall exercise general supervision over all club activities; shall be a member ex-officio of all committees with the exception of the nominating committee; shall appoint the parliamentarian, the department chairmen, the standing and special committee chairmen; shall serve as a Delegate to all state conventions and board meetings, District and County meetings and shall present a written report at the meeting at which officers are installed.

Section 2. The First Vice President shall act as aide to the President and shall preside in the absence of the President or at her request. She shall serve as chairman of the program committee and compile and edit the yearbook.

Section 3. The Second Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President and First Vice President; shall serve as chairman of the membership committee; shall contact members who have missed two consecutive meetings; and shall investigate resignations before they are considered by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The Third Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President, First Vice President and Second Vice President; shall serve as a member of the program committee, shall serve as chairman of the social committee and shall be responsible for the hostesses at each regular meeting.

Section 5. The Recording Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all regular and special meetings of the general membership and Board of Directors, and shall prepare a memorandum of all unfinished business from the minutes of each meeting for the use of the President.

Section 6. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the club; shall send necessary notices to members and shall notify members of Board of Directors meetings.

Section 7. The Financial Secretary shall receive all dues; shall issue receipts for dues paid; shall remit monies at once to the treasurer; shall keep a record of the membership and shall send written notices during the first week in October to all members whose dues are not paid.

Section 8. The Treasurer shall receive all monies, keeping an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements; shall submit a written report at the first regular meeting of each month of the general membership and at the Board of Directors meeting; shall deposit all monies received in a reliable bank selected by the Board of Directors, in the name of the "Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc."; shall have the power to pay current operating expenses when due and shall issue any other checks only upon receipt of itemized bills approved by the Board of Directors. She shall pay out funds by order of the Board of Directors to members to reimburse such members for expenses incurred on behalf of the organization; shall serve as a member ex-officio of the ways and means and budget committees; shall secure the signature of the President and Treasurer or the Recording Secretary on all checks; and shall arrange for an audit of her final report as of April 30th.

Section 9. The five elected Directors shall be chairmen as follows:

- Director #1 - House
- Director #2 - Ways and Means
- Director #3 - Press, Publicity and
Historian
- Director #4 - Finance and Budget
- Director #5 - Sunshine and Welfare

Section 10. The Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary shall

transfer without delay to their successors all books, papers, monies and vouchers of the organization in their possession at the first Board of Directors meeting after the installation or in case of resignation.

Section 11. The Parliamentarian shall attend all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall give the necessary advice on parliamentary procedure when requested.

ARTICLE VIII - MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular meetings of this organization shall be held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month from September to May, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Special meetings of the organization may be called by the President or shall be called upon the written request of ten (10) members.

Section 3. The annual meeting shall be the third Tuesday in April. All officers, department chairmen and standing committee chairmen shall submit written annual reports.

Section 4. Fifteen (15) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5. The date of the installation of officers meeting shall be set by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Guests may be invited to any meeting of the organization except the election meeting in March.

Section 7. The same guest may not attend more than two (2) meetings in one year if eligible for membership.

ARTICLE IX - DEPARTMENTS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. A. The departments of this organization shall conform with that outlined by the State and General Federation. There shall also be evening and bulletin departments.

B. No member shall serve as chairman

of the same department for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 2. A. This organization shall sponsor the Junior Woman's Club, Inc. of Wilton Manors.

B. The sponsor of the Junior Woman's Club shall be appointed by the Board of Directors on the recommendation of the Junior and Senior clubs.

Section 3. A. The evening department shall be comprised of members unable to attend the daytime meetings, such reasons being stated upon the membership application or as they may arise.

B. There shall be an evening department coordinator who shall be appointed by the President upon recommendation of the evening department and approved by the Board of Directors. She shall attend all Board of Directors meetings for the purpose of coordinating activities of the evening department with those of the general membership.

Section 4. The standing committees shall be: Budget, Program, Membership, Social, Ways and Means, Press, Publicity and Historian, Sunshine and Welfare, House, Telephone and Transportation.

Section 5. The chairmen of the departments and special committees shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 6. There shall be a standing By-laws revision committee. The chairman shall be appointed by the President and two (2) members elected from the general assembly at the first meeting in September. This committee may submit a revised set of By-laws at a meeting of the general assembly. The chairman shall read the revised By-laws at two (2) regular business meetings for adoption by the general assembly.

ARTICLE X - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Section 1. The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order Revised shall govern the organization in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these By-laws.

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These By-laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the organization by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting, provided written notice of the proposed amendment shall have been sent to the entire membership and the proposed amendments read at two (2) consecutive meetings.

Section 2. Proposed revisions must be consistent with the charter provision in accordance with Section 617.02, Florida Statutes Annotated.

As Revised and Approved March 7, 1967

1. No intoxicating liquors will be served on the premises.
2. No equipment shall be removed from the clubhouse unless for use in club activities; permission to be obtained from house chairman or President.

4. Luncheon expenses for appointed delegated to District and County election meeting will be assumed by the club.

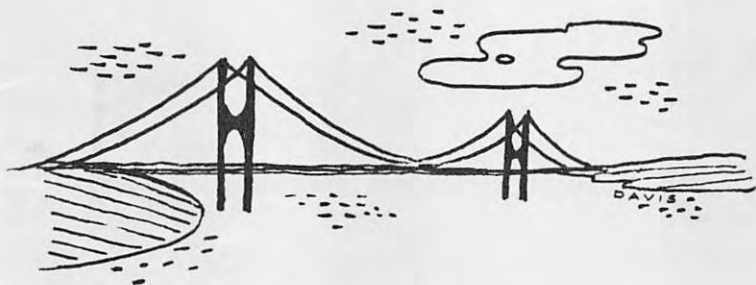

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc., located in the City of Wilton Manors, Broward County, Florida.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

The object of this organization shall be to further religious, educational, cultural and civic activities of the community. It shall be non-political and non-sectarian.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The qualifications for membership shall be women of good character and good standing in the community, having an interest in the objects of this organization.

Section 2. A. A prospective member shall have attended two meetings as a guest and shall have been introduced to the general membership before her application for membership is presented.

B. Names of prospective members shall be presented to the membership committee only by members of at least one year's standing. Applications to be signed by the membership chairman and two members, one sponsor knowing the applicant for a period of at least six months.

C. After an interview with the prospective member, the membership chairman shall collect the initiation fee and bring the name before the Board of Directors for final action. If accepted, the new member shall be enrolled and the dues collected.

Section 3. An applicant for membership may be rejected by three dissenting votes on a closed ballot by the Board of Directors. The applicant shall then be

informed by the membership chairman and the initiation fee refunded.

Section 4. A. The membership of this organization shall consist of three classes: Active, Inactive and Life.

B. Active members shall consider themselves honor bound to attend the meetings regularly, take an active part in the program and projects of the organization and shall be entitled to all privileges of membership. Each active member shall serve as a hostess at a regular meeting and a card party at least once a year. The privilege of holding office, making motions, debating and voting shall not be extended to those members whose dues are in arrears.

C. Inactive members shall be entitled to all privileges of membership except holding office. Upon application to the membership committee, an active member may become an inactive member for a specified time with the approval of the Board of Directors.

D. Life membership is bestowed by the club upon a member for outstanding service rendered to the club. This shall be a paid up membership and includes all the privileges of voting, holding office and participating in all activities and projects.

Section 5. Transfer memberships from other Federated clubs shall be accepted upon presentation of a current membership card and letter of transfer together with the payment of the regular dues.

Section 6. A member of the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall not hold any membership in another Federated Woman's Club in this District.

Section 7. Resignations shall be presented by the membership committee to and accepted by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. A member who has resigned from the club

in good standing may be reinstated by making application to the membership committee.

ARTICLE IV - DUES

Section 1. The fiscal year shall begin on May first of each year at which time the annual dues of Eight Dollars (\$8.00) shall be due and payable.

Section 2. Any member whose dues are not paid by November first shall be suspended from membership after written notice.

Section 3. An initiation fee of Four Dollars (\$4.00) shall be paid by each new member, with the exception of transfer members who shall pay the annual dues of Eight Dollars (\$8.00) only. A new member joining the organization after January first shall pay Four Dollars (\$4.00) which is one-half the annual dues.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Third Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Financial Secretary, Treasurer and five Directors.

Section 2. A. The officers shall be elected annually, the term of office being for one year or until their successors are elected and installed.

B. No member shall be entitled to hold an elective office who has not been a member at least one year. No member shall be eligible to hold the office of President who has not been a member for at least two years and served in an elective office.

C. No member shall hold more than one office at any one time. No member shall serve in the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 3. A. The elected officers, the parliamentarian, the Junior Sponsor, the Immediate Past President and the Department Chairmen shall constitute the Board of Directors.

B. The Board of Directors shall meet the fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

C. Seven (7) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall carry on the routine business of the organization, make recommendations and propose plans for the approval of the general membership.

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall recommend standing rules to the general membership. Standing rules shall be adopted by a majority vote of the membership present at any meeting without previous notice having been given; may be suspended by a majority vote or amended or rescinded by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present.

ARTICLE VI - ELECTIONS

Section 1. A. Nominations for officers and directors shall be made by a nominating committee of three members. The chairman of the nominating committee shall be elected by the Board of Directors in January. Two members shall be elected by the general membership at the regular meeting on the first Tuesday in February. The nominating committee shall report and post the names of nominees on the bulletin board in the clubhouse at the first regular business meeting in March. Nominations may be made from the floor on the third Tuesday in March. The consent of each nominee must be obtained before her name is placed in nomination.

B. The nominating committee shall be responsible for informing nominees of their duties

according to these by-laws.

Section 2. A. Election shall be held by ballot annually on the third Tuesday in March. However, if there is only one nominee for each office, it shall be in order to move that the secretary cast the elective ballot of the organization for the entire slate.

B. Officers and Directors shall assume their official duties upon installation.

C. Vacancies in office shall be filled by a recommendation of the Board of Directors to the general assembly. Nominations may be made from the floor with election by written ballot. If there is only one nominee the secretary may cast the elective ballot.

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall call special meetings; shall exercise general supervision over all club activities; shall be a member ex-officio of all committees with the exception of the nominating committee; shall appoint the parliamentarian, the department chairmen, the standing and special committee chairmen; shall serve as a Delegate to all State conventions and board meetings, District and County meetings and shall present a written report at the meeting at which officers are installed.

Section 2. The First Vice President shall act as aide to the President and shall preside in the absence of the President or at her request. She shall serve as chairman of the program committee and compile and edit the yearbook.

Section 3. The Second Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President and First Vice President; shall serve as chairman of the membership committee; shall contact members who have missed two consecutive meetings; and shall investigate resignations

before they are considered by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The Third Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President, First Vice President and Second Vice President; shall serve as a member of the program committee, shall serve as chairman of the social committee and shall be responsible for the hostesses at each regular meeting.

Section 5. The Recording Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all regular and special meetings of the general membership and Board of Directors, and shall prepare a memorandum of all unfinished business from the minutes of each meeting for the use of the President.

Section 6. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the club; shall send necessary notices to members and shall notify members of Board of Directors meetings.

Section 7. The Financial Secretary shall receive all dues; shall issue receipts for dues paid; shall remit monies at once to the treasurer; shall keep a record of the membership and shall send written notices during the first week in October to all members whose dues are not paid.

Section 8. The Treasurer shall receive all monies, keeping an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements; shall submit a written report at the first regular meeting of each month of the general membership and at the Board of Directors meeting; shall deposit all monies received in a reliable bank selected by the Board of Directors, in the name of the "Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc."; shall have the power to pay current operating expenses when due and shall issue any other checks only upon receipt of itemized bills approved by the Board of Directors. She shall pay out funds by order of the Board of Directors to members to reimburse such members for expenses incurred on behalf of the organization; shall serve as a member ex-officio of the ways and means and budget committees; shall se-

cure the signature of the President and Treasurer or the Recording Secretary on all checks; and shall arrange for an audit of her final report as of April 30th.

Section 9. The five elected Directors shall be chairmen as follows:

- Director #1 - House
- Director #2 - Ways and Means
- Director #3 - Press, Publicity and Historian
- Director #4 - Finance and Budget
- Director #5 - Sunshine and Welfare

Section 10. The Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary shall transfer without delay to their successors all books, papers, monies and vouchers of the organization in their possession at the first Board of Directors meeting after the installation or in case of resignation.

Section 11. The Parliamentarian shall attend all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall give the necessary advice on parliamentary procedure when requested.

ARTICLE VIII - MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular meetings of this organization shall be held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month from September to May, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Special meetings of the organization may be called by the President or shall be called upon the written request of ten (10) members.

Section 3. The annual meeting shall be the third Tuesday in April. All officers, department chairmen and standing committee chairmen shall submit written annual reports.

Section 4. Fifteen (15) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5. The date of the installation of officers meeting shall be set by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Guests may be invited to any meeting of the organization except the election meeting in March.

Section 7. The same guest may not attend more than two (2) meetings in one year if eligible for membership.

ARTICLE IX - DEPARTMENTS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. A. The departments of this organization shall conform with that outlined by the State and General Federation. There shall also be evening and bulletin departments.

B. No member shall serve as chairman of the same department for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 2. A. This organization shall sponsor the Junior Woman's Club, Inc. of Wilton Manors.

B. The sponsor of the Junior Woman's Club shall be appointed by the Board of Directors on the recommendation of the Junior and Senior clubs.

Section 3. A. The evening department shall be comprised of members unable to attend the daytime meetings, such reasons being stated upon the membership application or as they may arise.

B. There shall be an evening department coordinator who shall be appointed by the President upon recommendation of the evening department and approved by the Board of Directors. She shall attend all Board of Directors meetings for the purpose of coordinating activities of the evening department with those of the general membership.

Section 4. The standing committees shall be: Budget, Program, Membership, Social, Ways and Means,

Press, Publicity and Historian, Sunshine and Welfare, House, Telephone and Transportation.

Section 5. The chairmen of the departments and special committees shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 6. There shall be a standing By-laws Revision Committee. The chairman shall be appointed by the President and two (2) members elected from the general assembly at the first meeting in September. This committee may submit a revised set of By-laws at a meeting of the general assembly. The chairman shall read the revised By-laws at two (2) regular business meetings for adoption by the general assembly.

ARTICLE X - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Section 1. The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order Revised shall govern the organization in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these By-laws.

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These By-laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the organization by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting, provided written notice of the proposed amendment shall have been sent to the entire membership and the proposed amendments read at two (2) consecutive meetings.

Section 2. Proposed revisions must be consistent with the charter provision in accordance with Section 617.02, Florida Statutes Annotated.

STANDING CLUB RULES AND HOUSE RULES

1. No intoxicating liquors will be served on the premises except for receptions at which champagne punch may be served.
2. No equipment shall be removed from the clubhouse unless for use in club activities; permission to be obtained from house chairman or President.
3. Members in good standing desiring to use the clubhouse for special functions may do so by paying \$10.00 to cover the expenses of maintenance, electricity and water. A fee of \$7.50 shall be made for the rental of the P.A. system. Approval of the house chairman or another member of the house committee plus the President must be given before the P.A. system may be rented.
4. Luncheon expenses for appointed delegates to the District election meeting will be assumed by the club.
5. An allowance will be made for the President's expenses.
6. Every member is required to serve as hostess at a regular meeting and at a card party once during the club year. If unable to serve on an appointed date it is up to the member to arrange for a substitute. A donation of \$2.00 toward the day's expenses should be made to the chairman of the hostesses at a regular meeting if committee member is unable to serve at all.
7. The chairman of the day will be responsible for the dish towels being laundered and returned to the clubhouse promptly.
8. Any extra tables and chairs used other than those set up should be returned to the storage area.
9. Building shall be left in as good condition as found.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc., located in the City of Wilton Manors, Broward County, Florida.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

The object of this organization shall be to further religious, educational, cultural and civic activities of the community. It shall be non-political and non-sectarian.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The qualifications for membership shall be women of good character and good standing in the community, having an interest in the objects of this organization.

Section 2. A. A prospective member shall have attended two meetings as a guest and shall have been introduced to the general membership before her application for membership is presented.

B. Names of prospective members shall be presented to the membership committee only by members of at least one year's standing. Applications to be signed by the membership chairman and two members, one sponsor knowing the applicant for a period of at least six months.

C. After an interview with the prospective member, the membership chairman shall collect the initiation fee and bring the name before the Board of Directors for final action. If accepted, the new member shall be enrolled and the dues collected.

Section 3. An applicant for membership may be rejected by three dissenting votes on a closed ballot by the Board of Directors. The applicant shall then be

informed by the membership chairman and the initiation fee refunded.

Section 4. A. The membership of this organization shall consist of three classes: Active, Inactive and Life.

B. Active members shall consider themselves honor bound to attend the meetings regularly, take an active part in the program and projects of the organization, support all fund raising projects, and shall be entitled to all privileges of membership. Each active member shall serve as a hostess at a regular meeting and a card party at least once a year. The privilege of holding office, making motions, debating and voting shall not be extended to those members whose dues are in arrears.

C. Inactive members shall be entitled to all privileges of membership except holding office. Upon application to the membership committee, payment of dues, plus a special inactive membership fee of \$15.00, an active member may become an inactive member for a specified time with the approval of the Board of Directors.

D. Life membership is bestowed by the club upon a member for outstanding service rendered to the club. This shall be a paid up membership and includes all the privileges of voting, holding office and participating in all activities and projects.

Section 5. Transfer memberships from other Federated clubs shall be accepted upon presentation of a current membership card and letter of transfer together with the payment of the regular dues.

Section 6. A member of the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall not hold any membership in another Federated Woman's Club in this District.

Section 7. Resignations shall be presented by the membership committee to and accepted by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. A member who has resigned from the club in good standing may be reinstated by making application to the membership committee and following the general new member procedure.

ARTICLE IV - DUES

Section 1. The fiscal year shall begin on April first of each year at which time the annual dues of Eight Dollars (\$8.00) shall be due and payable.

Section 2. Any member whose dues are not paid by July first shall be suspended from membership after written notice.

Section 3. An initiation fee of Four Dollars (\$4.00) shall be paid by each new member, with the exception of transfer members who shall pay the annual dues of Eight Dollars (\$8.00) only. A new member joining the organization after January first shall pay Four Dollars (\$4.00) which is one-half the annual dues.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Third Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Financial Secretary, Treasurer and five Directors.

Section 2. A. The officers shall be elected annually, the term of office being for one year or until their successors are elected and installed.

B. No member shall be entitled to hold an elective office who has not been a member at least one year. No member shall be eligible to hold the office of President who has not been a member for at least two years and served in an elective office.

C. No member shall hold more than one elective office at any one time. No member shall serve in the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 3. A. The elected officers, the parliamentarian, the Junior Sponsor, the Immediate Past President and the Department Chairmen shall constitute the Board of Directors.

B. The Board of Directors shall meet the fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

C. Seven (7) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall carry on the routine business of the organization, make recommendations and propose plans for the approval of the general membership.

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall recommend standing rules to the general membership. Standing rules shall be adopted by a majority vote of the membership present at any meeting without previous notice having been given; may be suspended by a majority vote or amended or rescinded by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present.

ARTICLE VI - ELECTIONS

Section 1. A. Nominations for officers and directors shall be made by a nominating committee of three members. The chairman of the nominating committee shall be elected by the Board of Directors in January. Two members shall be elected by the general membership at the regular meeting on the first Tuesday in February. The nominating committee shall report and post the names of nominees on the bulletin board in the clubhouse at the first regular business meeting in March. Nominations may be made from the floor on the third Tuesday in March. The consent of each nominee must be obtained before her name is placed in nomination.

B. The nominating committee shall be responsible for informing nominees of their duties

according to these by-laws.

Section 2. A. Election shall be held by ballot annually on the third Tuesday in March. However, if there is only one nominee for each office, it shall be in order to move that the secretary cast the elective ballot of the organization for the entire slate.

B. Officers and Directors shall assume their official duties upon installation.

C. Vacancies in office shall be filled by a recommendation of the Board of Directors to the general assembly. Nominations may be made from the floor with election by written ballot. If there is only one nominee the secretary may cast the elective ballot.

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall call special meetings; shall exercise general supervision over all club activities; shall be a member ex-officio of all committees with the exception of the nominating committee; shall appoint the parliamentarian, the department chairmen, the standing and special committee chairmen; shall serve as a Delegate to all State conventions and board meetings, District meetings and shall present a written report at the meeting at which officers are installed.

Section 2. The First Vice President shall act as aide to the President and shall preside in the absence of the President or at her request. She shall serve as chairman of the program committee and compile and edit the yearbook.

Section 3. The Second Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President and First Vice President; shall serve as chairman of the membership committee; shall contact members who have missed two consecutive meetings; and shall investigate resignations

before they are considered by the Board of Directors. She shall make sure that a prospective member has attended two regular meetings, been informed of and accepted the by-laws and standing rules of the club. She shall visit the prospective member, fill out the membership application form with her, including sponsorship, and present the form and application fee with her recommendations to the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The Third Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President, First Vice President and Second Vice President; shall serve as a member of the program committee, shall serve as chairman of the social committee and shall be responsible for the hostesses at each regular meeting.

Section 5. The Recording Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all regular and special meetings of the general membership and Board of Directors, shall prepare a memorandum of all unfinished business from the minutes of each meeting for the use of the President and shall keep an accurate record of any changes in by-laws and standing rules.

Section 6. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the club; shall send necessary notices to members and shall notify members of Board of Directors meetings.

Section 7. The Financial Secretary shall receive all dues; shall issue receipts for dues paid; shall remit monies at once to the treasurer; shall keep a record of the membership and shall send written notices during the first week in June to all members whose dues are not paid.

Section 8. The Treasurer shall receive all monies, keeping an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements; shall submit a written report at the first regular meeting of each month of the general membership and at the Board of Directors meeting; shall deposit all monies received in a reliable bank selected by the Board of Directors, in the name of the "Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc."; shall have the power to pay cur-

rent operating expenses when due and shall issue any other checks only upon receipt of itemized bills approved by the Board of Directors. She shall pay out funds by order of the Board of Directors to members to reimburse such members for expenses incurred on behalf of the organization; shall serve as a member ex-officio of the ways and means and budget committees; shall secure the signature of the President and Treasurer or the Recording Secretary on all checks; and shall arrange for an audit of her final report as of April 30th.

Section 9. The five elected Directors shall be chairmen as follows:

- Director #1 - House
- Director #2 - Ways and Means
- Director #3 - Press, Publicity and Historian
- Director #4 - Finance and Budget
- Director #5 - Sunshine and Welfare

Section 10. The Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary shall transfer without delay to their successors all books, papers, monies and vouchers of the organization in their possession at the first Board of Directors meeting after the installation or in case of resignation.

Section 11. The Parliamentarian shall attend all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall give the necessary advice on parliamentary procedure when requested.

ARTICLE VIII - MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular meetings of this organization shall be held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month from September to May, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Special meetings of the organization may be called by the President or shall be called upon the written request of fifteen (15) members.

Section 3. The annual meeting shall be the first Tuesday in May. All officers, department chairmen and standing committee chairmen shall submit written annual reports.

Section 4. Fifteen (15) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5. The date of the installation of officers meeting shall be set by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Guests may be invited to any meeting of the organization except the election meeting in March.

Section 7. The same guest may not attend more than two (2) meetings in one year if eligible for membership.

ARTICLE IX - DEPARTMENTS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. A. The departments of this organization shall conform with that outlined by the State and General Federation.

B. No member shall serve as chairman of the same department for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 2. A. This organization shall sponsor the Junior Woman's Club, Inc. of Wilton Manors.

B. The sponsor of the Junior Woman's Club shall be appointed by the Board of Directors on the recommendation of the Junior and Senior clubs.

C. The Junior Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall be permitted to use the clubhouse facilities for not more than two (2) fund raising events per club year not to exceed two (2) consecutive days per each event.

Section 3. The standing committees shall be: Budget, Program, Membership, Social, Ways and Means,

Press, Publicity and Historian, Sunshine and Welfare, House, Telephone and Transportation, and Bulletin.

Section 4. The chairmen of the departments and special committees shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 5. There shall be a standing By-laws Revision Committee. The chairman shall be appointed by the President and two (2) members elected from the general assembly at the first meeting in September. This committee may submit a revised set of by-laws at a meeting of the general assembly. The chairman shall read the revised By-laws at two (2) regular business meetings for adoption by the general assembly.

ARTICLE X - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Section 1. The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order Revised shall govern the organization in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these by-laws.

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the organization by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting, provided written notice of the proposed amendment shall have been sent to the entire membership and the proposed amendments read at two (2) consecutive meetings.

Section 2. Proposed revisions must be consistent with the charter provision in accordance with Section 617.02, Florida Statutes Annotated.

STANDING CLUB RULES AND HOUSE RULES

THE WOMAN'S CLUB OF WILTON MANORS

1. No intoxicating liquors will be served on the premises except for receptions at which champagne punch may be served.
2. No equipment shall be removed from the clubhouse unless for use in club activities; permission to be obtained from house chairman or President.
3. Members in good standing desiring to use the clubhouse for special functions may do so by paying \$10.00^{25.00} to cover the expenses of maintenance, electricity and water. A fee of \$7.50 shall be made for the rental of the P.A. system. Approval of the house chairman or another member of the house committee plus the President must be given before the P. A. system may be rented.
4. Luncheon expenses for appointed delegates to the District election meeting will be assumed by the club.
5. An allowance will be made for the President's expenses.
6. Every member is required to serve as hostess at a regular meeting and at a card party once during the club year. If unable to serve on an appointed date it is up to the member to arrange for a substitute. A donation of \$2.00^{5.00} toward the day's expenses should be made to the chairman of the hostesses at a regular meeting if committee member is unable to serve at all.
7. The chairman of the day will be responsible for the dish towels being laundered and returned to the clubhouse promptly.
8. Any extra tables and chairs used other than those set up should be returned to the storage area.
9. Building shall be left in as good condition as found.

BY-LAWS – THE WOMAN'S CLUB OF WILTON MANORS

ARTICLE I – NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc., located in the City of Wilton Manors, Broward County, Florida.

ARTICLE II – OBJECT

The object of this organization shall be to further religious, educational, cultural and civic activities of the community. It shall be non-political and non-sectarian.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The qualifications for membership shall be women of good character and good standing in the community, having an interest in the objects of this organization.

Section 2. (a) A prospective member shall have attended two meetings as a guest and shall have been introduced to the general membership before her application for membership is presented.

(b) Names of prospective members shall be presented to the membership committee *only* by members of at least one year's standing. Applications to be signed by the membership chairman and two members, one sponsor knowing the applicant for a period of at least six months.

(c) After an interview with the prospective membership chairman shall collect the initiation fee and bring the name before the Board of Directors for final action. If accepted, the new member shall be enrolled and the dues collected.

Section 3. An applicant for membership may be rejected by three dissenting votes on a closed ballot by the Board of Directors. The applicant shall then be informed by the membership chairman and the initiation fee refunded.

Section 4. (a) The membership of this organization shall consist of three classes: Active, Inactive and Life.

(b) Active members shall consider themselves honor bound to attend the meetings regularly, take an active part in the program and projects of the organization, support all fund raising projects, and shall be entitled to all privileges of membership. Each active member shall serve as a hostess at a regular meeting and a card party at least once a year. The privilege of holding office, making motions, debating and voting shall not be extended to those members whose dues are in arrears.

(c) Inactive members shall be entitled to all privileges of membership except holding office. Upon application to the membership committee, payment of dues, plus a special inactive membership fee of \$15.00, an active member may become an inactive member for a specified time with the approval of the Board of Directors.

(d) Life membership is bestowed by the club upon a member for outstanding service rendered to the club. This shall be a paid up membership and includes all the privileges of voting, holding office and participating in all activities and projects.

Section 5. Transfer memberships from other Federated clubs shall be accepted upon presentation of a current membership card and letter of transfer together with the payment of the regular dues.

Section 6. A member of the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall not hold any membership in another Federated Woman's Club in this District.

Section 7. Resignations shall be presented by the membership committee to and accepted by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. A member who has resigned from the club in good standing may be reinstated by making application to the membership committee and following the general new member procedure.

ARTICLE IV – DUES

Section 1. The fiscal year shall begin on April first of each year at which time the annual dues of Eight Dollars (\$8.00) shall be due and payable. 10.00

Section 2. Any member whose dues are not paid by July first shall be suspended from membership after written notice.

Section 3. An initiation fee of Four Dollars (\$4.00) shall be paid by each new member, with the exception of transfer members who shall pay the annual dues of Eight Dollars (\$8.00) only. A new member joining the organization after January first shall pay Four Dollars (\$4.00) which is one-half the annual dues. 5.00

ARTICLE V – OFFICERS OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Third Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Financial Secretary, Treasurer and five Directors.

Section 2. (a) The officers shall be elected annually, the term of office being for one year or until their successors are elected and installed.

(b) No member shall be entitled to hold an elective office who has not been a member at least one year. No member shall be eligible to hold the office of President who has not been a member for at least two years and served in an elective office.

(c) No member shall hold more than one elective office at any one time. No member shall serve in the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 3. (a) The elected officers, the parliamentarian, the Junior Sponsor, the Immediate Past President and the Department Chairmen shall constitute the Board of Directors.

(b) The Board of Directors shall meet the fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

~~10~~ (c) ~~Seven~~ (7) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall carry on the routine business of the organization, make recommendations and propose plans for the approval of the general membership.

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall recommend standing rules to the general membership. Standing rules shall be adopted by a majority vote of the membership present at any meeting without previous notice having been given; may be suspended by a majority vote or amended or rescinded by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present.

ARTICLE VI – ELECTIONS

Section 1. (a) Nominations for officers and directors shall be made by a nominating committee of three members. The chairman of the nominating committee shall be elected by the Board of Directors in January. Two members shall be elected by the general membership at the regular meeting on the first Tuesday in February. The nominating committee shall report and post the names of nominees on the bulletin board in the clubhouse at the first regular business meeting in March. Nominations may be made from the floor on the third Tuesday in March.

The consent of each nominee must be obtained before her name is placed in nomination.

(b) The nominating committee shall be responsible for informing nominees of their duties according to these by-laws.

Page 2
Section 2. (a) Election shall be held by ballot annually on the third Tuesday in March. However, if there is only one nominee for each office, it shall be in order to move that the secretary cast the elective ballot of the organization for the entire slate.

(b) Officers and Directors shall assume their official duties upon installation.

(c) Vacancies in office shall be filled by a recommendation of the Board of Directors to the general assembly. Nominations may be made from the floor with election by written ballot. If there is only one nominee the secretary may cast the elective ballot.

ARTICLE VII – DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall call special meetings; shall exercise general supervision over all club activities; shall be a member ex-officio of all committees with the exception of the nominating committee; shall appoint the parliamentarian, the department chairmen, the standing and special committee chairmen; shall serve as a Delegate to all State conventions and board meetings, District meetings and shall present a written report at the meeting at which officers are installed.

Section 2. The First Vice President shall act as aide to the President and shall preside in the absence of the President or at her request. She shall serve as chairman of the program committee and compile and edit the yearbook.

Section 3. The Second Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President and First Vice President; shall serve as chairman of the membership committee; shall contact members who have missed two consecutive meetings; and shall investigate resignations before they are considered by the Board of Directors. She shall make sure that a prospective member has attended two regular meetings, been informed of and accepted the by-laws and standing rules of the club. She shall visit the prospective member, fill out the membership application fee with her recommendations to the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The Third Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President, First Vice President and Second Vice President; shall serve as a member of the program committee, shall serve as chairman of the social committee and shall be responsible for the hostesses at each regular meeting.

Section 5. The Recording Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all regular and special meetings of the general membership and Board of Directors, shall prepare a memorandum of all unfinished business from the minutes of each meeting for the use of the President and shall keep an accurate record of any changes in by-laws and standing rules.

Section 6. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the club; shall send necessary notices to members and shall notify members of Board of Directors meetings.

Section 7. The Financial Secretary shall receive all dues; shall issue receipts for dues paid; shall remit monies at once to the treasurer; shall keep a record of the membership and shall send written notices during the first week in June to all members whose dues are not paid.

Section 8. The Treasurer shall receive all monies, keeping an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements; shall submit a written report at the first regular meeting of each month

of the general membership and at the Board of Directors meeting; shall deposit all monies received in a reliable bank selected by the Board of Directors, in the name of the "*Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc.*"; shall have the power to pay current operating expenses when due and shall issue any other checks only upon receipt of itemized bills approved by the Board of Directors. She shall pay out funds by order of the Board of Directors to members to reimburse such members for expenses incurred on behalf of the organization; shall serve as a member ex-officio of the ways and means and budget committees; shall secure the signature of the President and Treasurer or the Recording Secretary on all checks; and shall arrange for an audit of her final report as of ~~April 30th.~~ *March 31*

Section 9. The five elected Directors shall be chairmen as follows:

Director 1 – House

Director 2 – Ways and Means

Director 3 – Press, Publicity and Historian

Director 4 – Finance and Budget

Director 5 – Sunshine and Welfare

Section 10. The Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary shall transfer without delay to their successors all books, papers, monies and vouchers of the organization in their possession at the first Board of Directors meeting after the installation or in case of resignation.

Section 11. The Parliamentarian shall attend all meetings of the Board of Directors; shall give the necessary advice on parliamentary procedure when requested.

ARTICLE VIII – MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular meetings of this organization shall be held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month from September to May, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Special meetings of the organization may be called by the President or shall be called upon the written request of fifteen (15) members.

March
Section 3. The annual meeting shall be the first Tuesday in May. All officers, department chairmen and standing committee chairmen shall submit written annual reports.

Section 4. Fifteen (15) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5. The date of the installation of officers meeting shall be set by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Guests may be invited to any meeting of the organization except the election meeting in March.

Section 7. The same guest may not attend more than two (2) meetings in one year if eligible for membership.

ARTICLE IX – DEPARTMENTS & COMMITTEES

Section 1. (a) The departments of this organization shall conform with that outlined by the State and General Federation.

(b) No member shall serve as chairman of the same department for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 2. (a) This organization shall sponsor the Junior Woman's Club, Inc. of Wilton Manors.

(b) The sponsor of the Junior Woman's Club shall be appointed by the Board of Directors on the recommendation of the Junior and Senior clubs.

(c) The Junior Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall be permitted to use the clubhouse facilities for not more than two (2) fund raising events per club year not to exceed two (2) consecutive days per each event.

Section 3. The standing committees shall be: Budget, Program, Membership, Social, Ways and Means, Press, Publicity and Historian, Sunshine and Welfare, House, Telephone and Transportation, and Bulletin. *are archives*

Section 4. The chairmen of the departments and special committees shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Board of Directors. *members for Ops*

Section 5. There shall be a standing By-laws Revision Committee. The chairman shall be appointed by the President and two (2) members elected from the general assembly at the first meeting in September. This committee may submit a revised set of by-laws at a meeting of the general assembly. The chairman shall read the revised By-laws at two (2) regular business meetings for adoption by the general assembly.

ARTICLE X – PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Section 1. The rules contained in *Robert's Rules of Order Revised* shall govern the organization in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these by-laws.

ARTICLE XI – AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the organization by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting, provided written notice of the proposed amendment shall have been sent to the entire membership and the proposed amendments read at two (2) consecutive meetings.

Section 2. Proposed revisions must be consistent with the charter provision in accordance with Section 617.02, Florida Statutes Annotated.

STANDING CLUB RULES AND HOUSE RULES

THE WOMAN'S CLUB OF WILTON MANORS

1. No equipment shall be removed from the clubhouse unless for use in club activities; permission to be obtained from house chairman or President.
2. Members in good standing desiring to use the clubhouse for special functions may do so by paying \$25.00 to cover the expenses of maintenance, electricity and water. A fee of \$15.00 shall be made for the rental of the P.A. system. Approval of the house chairman or another member of the house committee plus the President must be given before the P. A. system may be rented.
3. Luncheon expenses for appointed delegates to the District election meeting will be assumed by the club.
4. An allowance will be made for the President's expenses.
5. Every member is required to serve as hostess at a regular meeting and at a card party once during the club year. If unable to serve on an appointed date it is up to the member to arrange for a substitute. A donation of \$5.00 toward the day's expenses should be made to the chairman of the hostesses at a regular meeting if committee member is unable to serve at all.
6. The chairman of the day will be responsible for the dish towels being laundered and returned to the clubhouse promptly.
7. Any extra tables and chairs used other than those set up should be returned to the storage area.
8. Building shall be left in as good condition as found.

BY-LAWS – THE WOMAN'S CLUB OF WILTON MANORS

ARTICLE I – NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc., located in the City of Wilton Manors, Broward County, Florida.

ARTICLE II – OBJECT

The object of this organization shall be to further religious, educational, cultural and civic activities of the community. It shall be non-political and non-sectarian.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The qualifications for membership shall be women of good character and good standing in the community, having an interest in the objects of this organization.

Section 2. (a) A prospective member shall have attended two meetings as a guest and shall have been introduced to the general membership before her application for membership is presented.

(b) Names of prospective members shall be presented to the membership committee *only* by members of at least one year's standing. Applications to be signed by the membership chairman and two members, one sponsor knowing the applicant for a period of at least six months.

(c) After an interview with the prospective membership chairman shall collect the initiation fee and bring the name before the Board of Directors for final action. If accepted, the new member shall be enrolled and the dues collected.

Section 3. An applicant for membership may be rejected by three dissenting votes on a closed ballot by the Board of Directors. The applicant shall then be informed by the membership chairman and the initiation fee refunded.

Section 4. (a) The membership of this organization shall consist of three classes: Active, Inactive and Life.

(b) Active members shall consider themselves honor bound to attend the meetings regularly, take an active part in the program and projects of the organization, support all fund raising projects, and shall be entitled to all privileges of membership. Each active member shall serve as a hostess at a regular meeting and a card party at least once a year. The privilege of holding office, making motions, debating and voting shall not be extended to those members whose dues are in arrears.

(c) Inactive members shall be entitled to all privileges of membership except holding office. Upon application to the membership committee, payment of dues, plus a special inactive membership fee of \$15.00, an active member may become an inactive member for a specified time with the approval of the Board of Directors.

(d) Life membership is bestowed by the club upon a member for outstanding service rendered to the club. This shall be a paid up membership and includes all the privileges of voting, holding office and participating in all activities and projects.

Section 5. Transfer memberships from other Federated clubs shall be accepted upon presentation of a current membership card and letter of transfer together with the payment of the regular dues.

Section 6. A member of the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall not hold any membership in another Federated Woman's Club in this District.

Section 7. Resignations shall be presented by the membership committee to and accepted by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. A member who has resigned from the club in good standing may be reinstated by making application to the membership committee and following the general new member procedure.

ARTICLE IV – DUES

Section 1. The fiscal year shall begin on April first of each year at which time the annual dues of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be due and payable.

Section 2. Any member whose dues are not paid by July first shall be suspended from membership after written notice.

Section 3. An initiation fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be paid by each new member, with the exception of transfer members who shall pay the annual dues of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) only. A new member joining the organization after January first shall pay Five Dollars (\$5.00) which is one-half the annual dues.

ARTICLE V – OFFICERS OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Assistant Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Financial Secretary, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer and five Directors.

Section 2. (a) The officers shall be elected annually, the term of office being for one year or until their successors are elected and installed.

(b) No member shall be entitled to hold an elective office who has not been a member at least one year. No mem-

ber shall be eligible to hold the office of President who has not been a member for at least two years and served in an elective office.

(c) No member shall hold more than one elective office at any one time. No member shall serve in the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 3. (a) The elected officers, the parliamentarian, the Junior Sponsor, the Immediate Past President and the Department Chairmen shall constitute the Board of Directors.

(b) The Board of Directors shall meet the fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

(c) Ten (10) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall carry on the routine business of the organization, make recommendations and propose plans for the approval of the general membership.

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall recommend standing rules to the general membership. Standing rules shall be adopted by a majority vote of the membership present at any meeting without previous notice having been given; may be suspended by a majority vote or amended or rescinded by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present.

ARTICLE VI – ELECTIONS

Section 1. (a) Nominations for officers and directors shall be made by a nominating committee of three members. The chairman of the nominating committee shall be elected by the Board of Directors in December. Two members shall be elected by the general membership at the regular meeting on the first Tuesday in January. The nominating committee shall report and post the names of the nominees on the bulletin board in the clubhouse at the first regular business meeting in Febru-

ary. Nominations may be made from the floor on the first Tuesday in March. The consent of each nominee must be obtained before her name is placed in nomination.

(b) The nominating committee shall be responsible for informing nominees of their duties according to these by-laws.

Section 2. (a) Election shall be held by ballot annually on the first Tuesday in March. However, if there is only one nominee for each office, it shall be in order to move that the secretary cast the elective ballot of the organization for the entire slate.

(b) Officers and Directors shall assume their official duties upon installation.

(c) Vacancies in office shall be filled by a recommendation of the Board of Directors to the general assembly. Nominations may be made from the floor with election by written ballot. If there is only one nominee the secretary may cast the elective ballot.

ARTICLE VII – DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall call special meetings; shall exercise general supervision over all club activities; shall be a member ex-officio of all committees with the exception of the nominating committee; shall appoint the parliamentary, the department chairmen, the standing and special committee chairmen; shall serve as a Delegate to all State conventions and board meetings, District meetings and shall present a written report at the meeting at which officers are installed.

Section 2. The First Vice President shall act as aide to the President and shall preside in the absence of the President or at her request. She shall serve as chairman of the program committee and compile and edit the yearbook.

Section 3. The Second Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President and First Vice President; shall serve as chairman of the membership committee; shall contact members who have missed two consecutive meetings; and shall investigate resignations before they are considered by the Board of Directors. She shall make sure that a prospective member has attended two regular meetings, been informed of and accepted the by-laws and standing rules of the club. She shall visit the prospective member, fill out the membership application fee with her recommendations to the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The Third Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President, First Vice President and Second Vice President; shall serve as a member of the program committee, shall serve as chairman of the social committee and shall be responsible for the hostesses at each regular meeting.

Section 5. (a) The Recording Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all regular and special meetings of the general membership and Board of Directors, shall prepare a memorandum of all unfinished business from the minutes of each meeting for the use of the President and shall keep an accurate record of any changes in by-laws and standing rules.

(b) The Assistant Recording Secretary shall assume the duties of the Recording Secretary in her absence.

Section 6. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the club; shall send necessary notices to members and shall notify members of Board of Directors meetings.

Section 7. The Financial Secretary shall receive all dues; shall issue receipts for dues paid; shall remit monies at once to the treasurer; shall keep a record of the membership and shall send written notices during the first week in June to all members whose dues are not paid.

Section 8. (a) The Treasurer shall receive all monies, keeping

an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements; shall submit a written report at the first regular meeting of each month of the general membership and at the Board of Directors meeting; shall deposit all monies received in a reliable bank selected by the Board of Directors, in the name of the "*Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc.*"; shall have the power to pay current operating expenses when due and shall issue any other checks only upon receipt of itemized bills approved by the Board of Directors. She shall pay out funds by order of the Board of Directors to member to reimburse such members for expenses incurred on behalf of the organization; shall serve as a member ex-officio of the ways and means and budget committees; shall secure the signature of the President, First Vice-President, Treasurer and/or Assistant Treasurer on all checks; add shall arrange for an audit of her final report as of March 31st.

(b) The Assistant Treasurer shall assume the duties of the Treasurer in her absence and aid her in duties when requested.

(c) The President, First Vice-President, Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer shall be bonded.

Section 9. The five elected Directors shall be chairmen as follows:

Director 1 — House

Director 2 — Ways and Menas

Director 3 — Press, Publicity and Historian

Director 4 — Finance and Budget

Director 5 — Sunshine and Welfare

Section 10. The Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary shall transfer without delay to their successors all books, papers, monies and vouchers of the organization in their possession at the first Board of

Directors meeting after the installation or in case of resignation.

Section 11. The Parliamentarian shall attend all meetings of the Board of Directors; shall give the necessary advice on parliamentary procedure when requested.

ARTICLE VIII – MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular meetings of this organization shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month from September to May, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Special meetings of the organization may be called by the President or shall be called upon the written request of fifteen (15) members.

Section 3. The annual meeting shall be the first Tuesday in March. All officers, department chairmen and standing committee chairmen shall submit written annual reports.

Section 4. Fifteen (15) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5. The date of the installation of officers meeting shall be set by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Guests may be invited to any meeting of the organization except the election meeting in March.

Section 7. The same guest may not attend more than two (2) meetings in one year if eligible for membership.

ARTICLE IX – DEPARTMENTS & COMMITTEES

Section 1. (a) The departments of this organization shall conform with that outlined by the State and General Federation.

(b) No member shall serve as chairman of the same department for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 2. (a) This organization shall sponsor the Junior Woman's Club, Inc. of Wilton Manors.

(b) The sponsor of the Junior Woman's Club shall be appointed by the Board of Directors on the recommendation of the Junior and Senior clubs.

(c) The Junior Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall be permitted to use the clubhouse facilities for not more than two (2) fund raising events per club year not to exceed two (2) consecutive days per each event.

Section 3. The standing committees shall be: Budget, Program, Membership, Social, Ways and Means, Press, Publicity and Historian, Sunshine and Welfare, House, Telephone and Transportation, and Bulletin.

Section 4. The chairmen of the departments and special committees shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 5. There shall be a standing By-laws Revision Committee. The chairman shall be appointed by the President and two (2) members elected from the general assembly at the first meeting in September. This committee may submit a revised set of by-laws at a meeting of the general assembly. The chairman shall read the revised By-laws at two (2) regular business meetings for adoption by the general assembly.

ARTICLE X – PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Section 1. The rules contained in *Robert's Rules of Order Revised* shall govern the organization in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these by-laws.

ARTICLE XI – AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the organization by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the mem-

bers present and voting, provided written notice of the proposed amendment shall have been sent to the entire membership and the proposed amendments read at two (2) consecutive meetings.

Section 2. Proposed revisions must be consistent with the charter provision in accordance with Section 617.02, Florida Statutes Annotated.

STANDING CLUB RULES AND HOUSE RULES

THE WOMAN'S CLUB OF WILTON MANORS

1. No equipment shall be removed from the clubhouse unless for use in club activities; permission to be obtained from house chairman or President.
2. Members in good standing desiring to use the clubhouse for special functions may do so by paying \$25.00 to cover the expenses of maintenance, electricity and water. A fee of \$15.00 shall be made for the rental of the P.A. system. Approval of the house chairman or another member of the house committee plus the President must be given before the P. A. system may be rented.
3. Luncheon expenses for appointed delegates to the District election meeting will be assumed by the club.
4. An allowance will be made for the President's expenses.
5. Every member is required to serve as hostess at a regular meeting and at a card party once during the club year. If unable to serve on an appointed date it is up to the member to arrange for a substitute. A donation of \$5.00 toward the day's expenses should be made to the chairman of the hostesses at a regular meeting if committee member is unable to serve at all.
6. The chairman of the day will be responsible for the dish towels being laundered and returned to the clubhouse promptly.
7. Any extra tables and chairs used other than those set up should be returned to the storage area.
8. Building shall be left in as good condition as found.

BY-LAWS – THE WOMAN'S CLUB OF WILTON MANORS

ARTICLE I – NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc., located in the City of Wilton Manors, Broward County, Florida.

ARTICLE II – OBJECT

The object of this organization shall be to further religious, educational, cultural and civic activities of the community. It shall be non-political and non-sectarian.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The qualifications for membership shall be women of good character and good standing in the community, having an interest in the objects of this organization.

Section 2. (a) A prospective member shall have attended two meetings as a guest and shall have been introduced to the general membership before her application for membership is presented.

(b) Names of prospective members shall be presented to the membership committee *only* by members of at least one year's standing. Applications to be signed by the membership chairman and two members, one sponsor knowing the applicant for a period of at least six months.

(c) After an interview with the prospective membership chairman shall collect the initiation fee and bring the name before the Board of Directors for final action. If accepted, the new member shall be enrolled and the dues collected.

Section 3. An applicant for membership may be rejected by three dissenting votes on a closed ballot by the Board of Directors. The applicant shall then be informed by the membership chairman and the initiation fee refunded.

Section 4. (a) The membership of this organization shall consist of three classes: Active, Inactive and Life.

(b) Active members shall consider themselves honor bound to attend the meetings regularly, take an active part in the program and projects of the organization, support all fund raising projects, and shall be entitled to all privileges of membership. Each active member shall serve as a hostess at a regular meeting and a card party at least once a year. The privilege of holding office, making motions, debating and voting shall not be extended to those members whose dues are in arrears.

(c) Inactive members shall be entitled to all privileges of membership except holding office. Upon application to the membership committee, payment of dues, plus a special inactive membership fee of \$15.00, an active member may become an inactive member for a specified time with the approval of the Board of Directors.

(d) Life membership is bestowed by the club upon a member for outstanding service rendered to the club. This shall be a paid up membership and includes all the privileges of voting, holding office and participating in all activities and projects.

Section 5. Transfer memberships from other Federated clubs shall be accepted upon presentation of a current membership card and letter of transfer together with the payment of the regular dues.

Section 6. A member of the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall not hold any membership in another Federated Woman's Club in this District.

Section 7. Resignations shall be presented by the membership committee to and accepted by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. A member who has resigned from the club in good standing may be reinstated by making application to the membership committee and following the general new member procedure.

ARTICLE IV – DUES

Section 1. The fiscal year shall begin on April first of each year at which time the annual dues of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be due and payable.

Section 2. Any member whose dues are not paid by July first shall be suspended from membership after written notice.

Section 3. An initiation fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be paid by each new member, with the exception of transfer members who shall pay the annual dues of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) only. A new member joining the organization after January first shall pay Five Dollars (\$5.00) which is one-half the annual dues.

ARTICLE V – OFFICERS OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Assistant Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Financial Secretary, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer and five Directors.

Section 2. (a) The officers shall be elected annually, the term of office being for one year or until their successors are elected and installed.

(b) No member shall be entitled to hold an elective office who has not been a member at least one year. No mem-

ber shall be eligible to hold the office of President who has not been a member for at least two years and served in an elective office.

(c) No member shall hold more than one elective office at any one time. No member shall serve in the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 3. (a) The elected officers, the parliamentarian, the Junior Sponsor, the Immediate Past President and the Department Chairmen shall constitute the Board of Directors.

(b) The Board of Directors shall meet the fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

(c) Ten (10) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall carry on the routine business of the organization, make recommendations and propose plans for the approval of the general membership.

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall recommend standing rules to the general membership. Standing rules shall be adopted by a majority vote of the membership present at any meeting without previous notice having been given; may be suspended by a majority vote or amended or rescinded by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present.

ARTICLE VI — ELECTIONS

Section 1. (a) Nominations for officers and directors shall be made by a nominating committee of three members. The chairman of the nominating committee shall be elected by the Board of Directors in December. Two members shall be elected by the general membership at the regular meeting on the first Tuesday in January. The nominating committee shall report and post the names of the nominees on the bulletin board in the clubhouse at the first regular business meeting in Febru-

ary. Nominations may be made from the floor on the first Tuesday in March. The consent of each nominee must be obtained before her name is placed in nomination.

(b) The nominating committee shall be responsible for informing nominees of their duties according to these by-laws.

Section 2. (a) Election shall be held by ballot annually on the first Tuesday in March. However, if there is only one nominee for each office, it shall be in order to move that the secretary cast the elective ballot of the organization for the entire slate.

(b) Officers and Directors shall assume their official duties upon installation.

(c) Vacancies in office shall be filled by a recommendation of the Board of Directors to the general assembly. Nominations may be made from the floor with election by written ballot. If there is only one nominee the secretary may cast the elective ballot.

ARTICLE VII – DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall call special meetings; shall exercise general supervision over all club activities; shall be a member ex-officio of all committees with the exception of the nominating committee; shall appoint the parliamentarian, the department chairmen, the standing and special committee chairmen; shall serve as a Delegate to all State conventions and board meetings, District meetings and shall present a written report at the meeting at which officers are installed.

Section 2. The First Vice President shall act as aide to the President and shall preside in the absence of the President or at her request. She shall serve as chairman of the program committee and compile and edit the yearbook.

Section 3. The Second Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President and First Vice President; shall serve as chairman of the membership committee; shall contact members who have missed two consecutive meetings; and shall investigate resignations before they are considered by the Board of Directors. She shall make sure that a prospective member has attended two regular meetings, been informed of and accepted the by-laws and standing rules of the club. She shall visit the prospective member, fill out the membership application fee with her recommendations to the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The Third Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President, First Vice President and Second Vice President; shall serve as a member of the program committee, shall serve as chairman of the social committee and shall be responsible for the hostesses at each regular meeting.

Section 5. (a) The Recording Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all regular and special meetings of the general membership and Board of Directors, shall prepare a memorandum of all unfinished business from the minutes of each meeting for the use of the President and shall keep an accurate record of any changes in by-laws and standing rules.

(b) The Assistant Recording Secretary shall assume the duties of the Recording Secretary in her absence.

Section 6. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the club; shall send necessary notices to members and shall notify members of Board of Directors meetings.

Section 7. The Financial Secretary shall receive all dues; shall issue receipts for dues paid; shall remit monies at once to the treasurer; shall keep a record of the membership and shall send written notices during the first week in June to all members whose dues are not paid.

Section 8. (a) The Treasurer shall receive all monies, keeping

an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements; shall submit a written report at the first regular meeting of each month of the general membership and at the Board of Directors meeting; shall deposit all monies received in a reliable bank selected by the Board of Directors, in the name of the "*Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc.*"; shall have the power to pay current operating expenses when due and shall issue any other checks only upon receipt of itemized bills approved by the Board of Directors. She shall pay out funds by order of the Board of Directors to member to reimburse such members for expenses incurred on behalf of the organization; shall serve as a member ex-officio of the ways and means and budget committees; shall secure the signature of the President, First Vice-President, Treasurer and/or Assistant Treasurer on all checks; add shall arrange for an audit of her final report as of March 31st.

(b) The Assistant Treasurer shall assume the duties of the Treasurer in her absence and aid her in duties when requested.

(c) The President, First Vice-President, Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer shall be bonded.

Section 9. The five elected Directors shall be chairmen as follows:

Director 1 – House

Director 2 – Ways and Menas

Director 3 – Press, Publicity and Historian

Director 4 – Finance and Budget

Director 5 – Sunshine and Welfare

Section 10. The Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary shall transfer without delay to their successors all books, papers, monies and vouchers of the organization in their possession at the first Board of

Directors meeting after the installation or in case of resignation.

Section 11. The Parliamentarian shall attend all meetings of the Board of Directors; shall give the necessary advice on parliamentary procedure when requested.

ARTICLE VIII – MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular meetings of this organization shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month from September to May, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Special meetings of the organization may be called by the President or shall be called upon the written request of fifteen [15] members.

Section 3. The annual meeting shall be the first Tuesday in March. All officers, department chairmen and standing committee chairmen shall submit written annual reports.

Section 4. Fifteen [15] members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5. The date of the installation of officers meeting shall be set by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Guests may be invited to any meeting of the organization except the election meeting in March.

Section 7. The same guest may not attend more than two [2] meetings in one year if eligible for membership.

ARTICLE IX – DEPARTMENTS & COMMITTEES

Section 1. (a) The departments of this organization shall conform with that outlined by the State and General Federation.

(b) No member shall serve as chairman of the same department for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 2. (a) This organization shall sponsor the Junior Woman's Club, Inc. of Wilton Manors.

(b) The sponsor of the Junior Woman's Club shall be appointed by the Board of Directors on the recommendation of the Junior and Senior clubs.

(c) The Junior Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall be permitted to use the clubhouse facilities for not more than two [2] fund raising events per club year not to exceed two [2] consecutive days per each event.

Section 3. The standing committees shall be: Budget, Program, Membership, Social, Ways and Means, Press, Publicity and Historian, Sunshine and Welfare, House, Telephone and Transportation, and Bulletin.

Section 4. The chairmen of the departments and special committees shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 5. There shall be a standing By-laws Revision Committee. The chairman shall be appointed by the President and two [2] members elected from the general assembly at the first meeting in September. This committee may submit a revised set of by-laws at a meeting of the general assembly. The chairman shall read the revised By-laws at two [2] regular business meetings for adoption by the general assembly.

ARTICLE X – PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Section 1. The rules contained in *Robert's Rules of Order Revised* shall govern the organization in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these by-laws.

ARTICLE XI – AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the organization by a two-thirds [2/3] vote of the mem-

bers present and voting, provided written notice of the proposed amendment shall have been sent to the entire membership and the proposed amendments read at two (2) consecutive meetings.

Section 2. Proposed revisions must be consistent with the charter provision in accordance with Section 617.02, Florida Statutes Annotated.

STANDING CLUB RULES AND HOUSE RULES

THE WOMAN'S CLUB OF WILTON MANORS

1. No equipment shall be removed from the clubhouse unless for use in club activities; permission to be obtained from house chairman or President.
2. Members in good standing desiring to use the clubhouse for special functions may do so by paying \$25.00 to cover the expenses of maintenance, electricity and water. A fee of \$15.00 shall be made for the rental of the P.A. system. Approval of the house chairman or another member of the house committee plus the President must be given before the P. A. system may be rented.
3. Luncheon expenses for appointed delegates to the District election meeting will be assumed by the club.
4. An allowance will be made for the President's expenses.
5. Every member is required to serve as hostess at a regular meeting and at a card party once during the club year. If unable to serve on an appointed date it is up to the member to arrange for a substitute. A donation of \$5.00 toward the day's expenses should be made to the chairman of the hostesses at a regular meeting if committee member is unable to serve at all.
6. The chairman of the day will be responsible for the dish towels being laundered and returned to the clubhouse promptly.
7. Any extra tables and chairs used other than those set up should be returned to the storage area.
8. Building shall be left in as good condition as found.

BY-LAWS — THE WOMAN'S CLUB OF WILTON MANORS

ARTICLE I — NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc., located in the City of Wilton Manors, Broward County, Florida.

ARTICLE II — OBJECT

The object of this organization shall be to further religious, educational, cultural and civic activities of the community. It shall be non-political and non-sectarian.

ARTICLE III — MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The qualifications for membership shall be women of good character and good standing in the community, having an interest in the objects of this organization.

Section 2. (a) A prospective member shall have attended two meetings as a guest and shall have been introduced to the general membership before her application for membership is presented.

(b) Names of prospective members shall be presented to the membership committee *only* by members of at least one year's standing. Applications to be signed by the membership chairman and two members, one sponsor knowing the applicant for a period of at least six months.

(c) After an interview with the prospective membership chairman shall collect the initiation fee and bring the name before the Board of Directors for final action. If accepted, the new member shall be enrolled and the dues collected.

Section 3. An applicant for membership may be rejected by three dissenting votes on a closed ballot by the Board of Directors. The applicant shall then be informed by the membership chairman and the initiation fee refunded.

Section 4. (a) The membership of this organization shall consist of three classes: Active, Inactive and Life.

(b) Active members shall consider themselves honor bound to attend the meetings regularly, take an active part in the program and projects of the organization, support all fund raising projects, and shall be entitled to all privileges of membership. Each active member shall serve as a hostess at a regular meeting and a card party at least once a year. The privilege of holding office, making motions, debating and voting shall not be extended to those members whose dues are in arrears.

(c) Inactive members shall be entitled to all privileges of membership except holding office. Upon application to the membership committee, payment of dues, plus a special inactive membership fee of \$15.00, an active member may become an inactive member for a specified time with the approval of the Board of Directors.

(d) Life membership is bestowed by the club upon a member for outstanding service rendered to the club. This shall be a paid up membership and includes all the privileges of voting, holding office and participating in all activities and projects.

Section 5. Transfer memberships from other Federated clubs shall be accepted upon presentation of a current membership card and letter of transfer together with the payment of the regular dues.

Section 6. A member of the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall not hold any membership in another Federated Woman's Club in this District.

Section 7. Resignations shall be presented by the membership committee to and accepted by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. A member who has resigned from the club in good standing may be reinstated by making application to the membership committee and following the general new member procedure.

ARTICLE IV – DUES

Section 1. The fiscal year shall begin on April first of each year at which time the annual dues of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be due and payable.

Section 2. Any member whose dues are not paid by July first shall be suspended from membership after written notice.

Section 3. An initiation fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be paid by each new member, with the exception of transfer members who shall pay the annual dues of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) only. A new member joining the organization after January first shall pay Five Dollars (\$5.00) which is one-half the annual dues.

ARTICLE V – OFFICERS OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Assistant Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Financial Secretary, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer and five Directors.

Section 2. (a) The officers shall be elected annually, the term of office being for one year or until their successors are elected and installed.

(b) No member shall be entitled to hold an elective office who has not been a member at least one year. No mem-

ber shall be eligible to hold the office of President who has not been a member for at least two years and served in an elective office.

(c) No member shall hold more than one elective office at any one time. No member shall serve in the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 3. (a) The elected officers, the parliamentarian, the Junior Sponsor, the Immediate Past President and the Department Chairmen shall constitute the Board of Directors.

(b) The Board of Directors shall meet the fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

(c) Ten (10) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall carry on the routine business of the organization, make recommendations and propose plans for the approval of the general membership.

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall recommend standing rules to the general membership. Standing rules shall be adopted by a majority vote of the membership present at any meeting without previous notice having been given; may be suspended by a majority vote or amended or rescinded by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present.

ARTICLE VI – ELECTIONS

Section 1. (a) Nominations for officers and directors shall be made by a nominating committee of three members. The chairman of the nominating committee shall be elected by the Board of Directors in December. Two members shall be elected by the general membership at the regular meeting on the first Tuesday in January. The nominating committee shall report and post the names of the nominees on the bulletin board in the clubhouse at the first regular business meeting in Febru-

ary. Nominations may be made from the floor on the first Tuesday in March. The consent of each nominee must be obtained before her name is placed in nomination.

(b) The nominating committee shall be responsible for informing nominees of their duties according to these by-laws.

Section 2. (a) Election shall be held by ballot annually on the first Tuesday in March. However, if there is only one nominee for each office, it shall be in order to move that the secretary cast the elective ballot of the organization for the entire slate.

(b) Officers and Directors shall assume their official duties upon installation.

(c) Vacancies in office shall be filled by a recommendation of the Board of Directors to the general assembly. Nominations may be made from the floor with election by written ballot. If there is only one nominee the secretary may cast the elective ballot.

ARTIVLE VII – DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall call special meetings; shall exercise general supervision over all club activities; shall be a member ex-officio of all committees with the exception of the nominating committee; shall appoint the parliamentarian, the department chairmen, the standing and special committee chairmen; shall serve as a Delegate to all State conventions and board meetings, District meetings and shall present a written report at the meeting at which officers are installed.

Section 2. The First Vice President shall act as aide to the President and shall preside in the absence of the President or at her request. She shall serve as chairman of the program committee and compile and edit the yearbook.

Section 3. The Second Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President and First Vice President; shall serve as chairman of the membership committee; shall contact members who have missed two consecutive meetings; and shall investigate resignations before they are considered by the Board of Directors. She shall make sure that a prospective member has attended two regular meetings, been informed of and accepted the by-laws and standing rules of the club. She shall visit the prospective member, fill out the membership application fee with her recommendations to the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The Third Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President, First Vice President and Second Vice President; shall serve as a member of the program committee, shall serve as chairman of the social committee and shall be responsible for the hostesses at each regular meeting.

Section 5. (a) The Recording Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all regular and special meetings of the general membership and Board of Directors, shall prepare a memorandum of all unfinished business from the minutes of each meeting for the use of the President and shall keep an accurate record of any changes in by-laws and standing rules.

(b) The Assistant Recording Secretary shall assume the duties of the Recording Secretary in her absence.

Section 6. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the club; shall send necessary notices to members and shall notify members of Board of Directors meetings.

Section 7. The Financial Secretary shall receive all dues; shall issue receipts for dues paid; shall remit monies at once to the treasurer; shall keep a record of the membership and shall send written notices during the first week in June to all members whose dues are not paid.

Section 8. (a) The Treasurer shall receive all monies, keeping

an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements; shall submit a written report at the first regular meeting of each month of the general membership and at the Board of Directors meeting; shall deposit all monies received in a reliable bank selected by the Board of Directors, in the name of the "*Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc.*"; shall have the power to pay current operating expenses when due and shall issue any other checks only upon receipt of itemized bills approved by the Board of Directors. She shall pay out funds by order of the Board of Directors to member to reimburse such members for expenses incurred on behalf of the organization; shall serve as a member ex-officio of the ways and means and budget committees; shall secure the signature of the President, First Vice-President, Treasurer and/or Assistant Treasurer on all checks; and shall arrange for an audit of her final report as of March 31st.

(b) The Assistant Treasurer shall assume the duties of the Treasurer in her absence and aid her in duties when requested.

(c) The President, First Vice-President, Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer shall be bonded.

Section 9. The five elected Directors shall be chairmen as follows:

Director 1 – House

Director 2 – Ways and Means

Director 3 – Press, Publicity and Historian

Director 4 – Finance and Budget

Director 5 – Sunshine and Welfare

Section 10. The Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary shall transfer without delay to their successors all books, papers, monies and vouchers of the organization in their possession at the first Board of

Directors meeting after the installation or in case of resignation.

Section 11. The Parliamentarian shall attend all meetings of the Board of Directors; shall give the necessary advice on parliamentary procedure when requested.

ARTICLE VIII – MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular meetings of this organization shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month from September to May, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Special meetings of the organization may be called by the President or shall be called upon the written request of fifteen (15) members.

Section 3. The annual meeting shall be the first Tuesday in March. All officers, department chairmen and standing committee chairmen shall submit written annual reports.

Section 4. Fifteen (15) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5. The date of the installation of officers meeting shall be set by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Guests may be invited to any meeting of the organization except the election meeting in March.

Section 7. The same guest may not attend more than two (2) meetings in one year if eligible for membership.

ARTICLE IX – DEPARTMENTS & COMMITTEES

Section 1. (a) The departments of this organization shall conform with that outlined by the State and General Federation.

(b) No member shall serve as chairman of the same department for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 2. (a) This organization shall sponsor the Junior Woman's Club, Inc. of Wilton Manors.

(b) The sponsor of the Junior Woman's Club shall be appointed by the Board of Directors on the recommendation of the Junior and Senior clubs.

(c) The Junior Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall be permitted to use the clubhouse facilities for not more than two (2) fund raising events per club year not to exceed two (2) consecutive days per each event.

Section 3. The standing committees shall be: Budget, Program, Membership, Social, Ways and Means, Press, Publicity and Historian, Sunshine and Welfare, House, Telephone and Transportation, and Bulletin.

Section 4. The chairmen of the departments and special committees shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 5. There shall be a standing By-laws Revision Committee. The chairman shall be appointed by the President and two (2) members elected from the general assembly at the first meeting in September. This committee may submit a revised set of by-laws at a meeting of the general assembly. The chairman shall read the revised By-laws at two (2) regular business meetings for adoption by the general assembly.

ARTICLE X – PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Section 1. The rules contained in *Robert's Rules of Order Revised* shall govern the organization in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these by-laws.

ARTICLE XI – AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the organization by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the mem-

bers present and voting, provided written notice of the proposed amendment shall have been sent to the entire membership and the proposed amendments read at two (2) consecutive meetings.

Section 2. Proposed revisions must be consistent with the charter provision in accordance with Section 617.02, Florida Statutes Annotated.

STANDING CLUB RULES AND HOUSE RULES

THE WOMAN'S CLUB OF WILTON MANORS

1. No equipment shall be removed from the clubhouse unless for use in club activities; permission to be obtained from house chairman or President.
2. Members in good standing desiring to use the clubhouse for special functions may do so by paying \$25.00 to cover the expenses of maintenance, electricity and water. A fee of \$15.00 shall be made for the rental of the P.A. system. Approval of the house chairman or another member of the house committee plus the President must be given before the P. A. system may be rented.
3. Luncheon expenses for appointed delegates to the District election meeting will be assumed by the club.
4. An allowance will be made for the President's expenses.
5. Every member is required to serve as hostess at a regular meeting and at a card party once during the club year. If unable to serve on an appointed date it is up to the member to arrange for a substitute. A donation of \$5.00 toward the day's expenses should be made to the chairman of the hostesses at a regular meeting if committee member is unable to serve at all.
6. The chairman of the day will be responsible for the dish towels being laundered and returned to the clubhouse promptly.
7. Any extra tables and chairs used other than those set up should be returned to the storage area.
8. Building shall be left in as good condition as found.

BY-LAWS – THE WOMAN'S CLUB OF WILTON MANORS

ARTICLE I – NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc., located in the City of Wilton Manors, Broward County, Florida.

ARTICLE II – OBJECT

The object of this organization shall be to further religious, educational, cultural and civic activities of the community. It shall be non-political and non-sectarian.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The qualifications for membership shall be women of good character and good standing in the community, having an interest in the objects of this organization.

Section 2. (a) A prospective member shall have attended two meetings as a guest and shall have been introduced to the general membership before her application for membership is presented. *to The Board.*

(b) Names of prospective members shall be presented to the membership committee *only* by members of at least ~~one year's~~ *6 months* standing. Applications to be signed by the membership chairman and two members, one sponsor knowing the applicant for a period of at least six months. *member the*

(c) After an interview with the prospective ~~member~~ *member* the membership chairman shall collect the initiation fee and bring the name before the Board of Directors for final action. If accepted, the new member shall be enrolled and the dues collected.

Section 3. An applicant for membership may be rejected by three dissenting votes on a closed ballot by the Board of Directors. The applicant shall then be informed by the membership chairman and the initiation fee refunded.

Section 4. (a) The membership of this organization shall consist of three classes: Active, Inactive ~~and~~ Life, *and Dual*.

(b) Active members shall consider themselves honor bound to attend the meetings regularly, take an active part in the program and projects of the organization, support all fund raising projects, and shall be entitled to all privileges of membership. Each active member shall serve as a hostess at a regular meeting and a card party at least once a year. The privilege of holding office, making motions, debating and voting shall not be extended to those members whose dues are in arrears.

(c) Inactive members shall be entitled to all privileges of membership except holding office. Upon application to the membership committee, payment of dues, plus a special inactive membership fee of \$15.00, an active member may become an inactive member for a specified time with the approval of the Board of Directors.

(d) Life membership is bestowed by the club upon a member for outstanding service rendered to the club. This shall be a paid up membership and includes all the privileges of voting, holding office and participating in all activities and projects. *(E) Dual members*

Section 5. Transfer memberships from other Federated clubs shall be accepted upon presentation of a current membership card and letter of transfer together with the payment of the regular dues.

Section 6. A member of the Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall not hold any membership in another Federated *General* Woman's Club in this District.

Section 7. Resignations shall be presented by the membership committee to and accepted by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. A member who has resigned from the club in good standing may be reinstated by making application to the membership committee and following the general new member procedure.

ARTICLE IV – DUES

Section 1. The fiscal year shall begin on April first of each year at which time the annual dues of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be due and payable.

Section 2. Any member whose dues are not paid by July first shall be suspended from membership after written notice.

Section 3. An initiation fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be paid by each new member, with the exception of transfer members who shall pay the annual dues of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) only. A new member joining the organization after January first shall pay Five Dollars (\$5.00) which is one-half the annual dues.

ARTICLE V – OFFICERS OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Assistant Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Financial Secretary, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer and five Directors.

Section 2. (a) The officers shall be elected annually, the term of office being for one year or until their successors are elected and installed.

(b) No member shall be entitled to hold an elective office who has not been a member at least one year. No mem-

ber shall be eligible to hold the office of President who has not been a member for at least two years and served in an elective office.

(c) No member shall hold more than one elective office at any one time. No member shall serve in the same office for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 3. (a) The elected officers, the parliamentarian, the Junior Sponsor, the Immediate Past President and the Department Chairmen shall constitute the Board of Directors.

(b) The Board of Directors shall meet the fourth Wednesday of each month throughout the year unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

(c) Ten (10) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. The Board of Directors shall carry on the routine business of the organization, make recommendations and propose plans for the approval of the general membership.

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall recommend standing rules to the general membership. Standing rules shall be adopted by a majority vote of the membership present at any meeting without previous notice having been given; may be suspended by a majority vote or amended or rescinded by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present.

ARTICLE VI – ELECTIONS

Section 1. (a) Nominations for officers and directors shall be made by a nominating committee of ~~three~~ ^{five} members. The chairman of the nominating committee shall be elected by the Board of Directors in December. Two members shall be elected by the general membership at the regular meeting on the first Tuesday in January. The nominating committee shall report and post the names of the nominees on the bulletin board in the clubhouse at the first regular business meeting in Febru-

ary. Nominations may be made from the floor on the first Tuesday in March. The consent of each nominee must be obtained before her name is placed in nomination.

(b) The nominating committee shall be responsible for informing nominees of their duties according to these by-laws.

Section 2. (a) Election shall be held by ballot annually on the first Tuesday in March. However, if there is only one nominee for each office, it shall be in order to move that the secretary cast the elective ballot of the organization for the entire slate.

(b) Officers and Directors shall assume their official duties ~~upon installation.~~ *April 1st.*

(c) Vacancies in office shall be filled by a recommendation of the Board of Directors to the general assembly. Nominations may be made from the floor with election by written ballot. If there is only one nominee the secretary may cast the elective ballot.

ARTICLE VII – DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; shall call special meetings; shall exercise general supervision over all club activities; shall be a member ex-officio of all committees with the exception of the nominating committee; shall appoint the parliamentarian, the department chairmen, the standing and special committee chairmen; shall serve as a Delegate to all State conventions and board meetings, District meetings and shall present a written report at the meeting at which officers are installed.

Section 2. The First Vice President shall act as aide to the President and shall preside in the absence of the President or at her request. She shall serve as chairman of the program committee and compile and edit the yearbook.

Section 3. The Second Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President and First Vice President; shall serve as chairman of the membership committee; shall contact members who have missed two consecutive meetings; and shall investigate resignations before they are considered by the Board of Directors. She shall make sure that a prospective member has attended two regular meetings, been informed of and accepted the by-laws and standing rules of the club. She shall visit the prospective member, fill out the membership application fee with her recommendations to the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The Third Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President, First Vice President and Second Vice President; shall serve as a member of the program committee, shall serve as chairman of the social committee and shall be responsible for the hostesses at each regular meeting.

Section 5. (a) The Recording Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all regular and special meetings of the general membership and Board of Directors, shall prepare a memorandum of all unfinished business from the minutes of each meeting for the use of the President and shall keep an accurate record of any changes in by-laws and standing rules.

(b) The Assistant Recording Secretary shall assume the duties of the Recording Secretary in her absence.

Section 6. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the club; shall send necessary notices to members and shall notify members of Board of Directors meetings.

Section 7. The Financial Secretary shall receive all dues; shall issue receipts for dues paid; shall remit monies at once to the treasurer; shall keep a record of the membership and shall send written notices during the first week in June to all members whose dues are not paid.

Section 8. (a) The Treasurer shall receive all monies, keeping

an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements; shall submit a written report at the first regular meeting of each month of the general membership and at the Board of Directors meeting; shall deposit all monies received in a reliable bank selected by the Board of Directors, in the name of the "*Woman's Club of Wilton Manors, Inc.*"; shall have the power to pay current operating expenses when due and shall issue any other checks only upon receipt of itemized bills approved by the Board of Directors. She shall pay out funds by order of the Board of Directors to member to reimburse such members for expenses incurred on behalf of the organization; shall serve as a member ex-officio of the ways and means and budget committees; shall secure the signature of the President, First Vice-President, Treasurer and/or Assistant Treasurer on all checks; and shall arrange for an audit of her final report as of March 31st.

(b) The Assistant Treasurer shall assume the duties of the Treasurer in her absence and aid her in duties when requested.

(c) The President, First Vice-President, Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer shall be bonded.

Section 9. The five elected Directors shall be chairmen as follows:

Director 1 – House

Director 2 – Ways and Means

Director 3 – Press, Publicity and Historian

Director 4 – Finance and Budget

Director 5 – Sunshine and Welfare

Section 10. The Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary shall transfer without delay to their successors all books, papers, monies and vouchers of the organization in their possession at the first Board of

Directors meeting after the installation or in case of resignation.

Section 11. The Parliamentarian shall attend all meetings of the Board of Directors; shall give the necessary advice on parliamentary procedure when requested.

ARTICLE VIII – MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular meetings of this organization shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month from September to ^{April} May, unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Special meetings of the organization may be called by the President or shall be called upon the written request of fifteen (15) members.

Section 3. The annual meeting shall be the first Tuesday in March. All officers, department chairmen and standing committee chairmen shall submit written annual reports.

Section 4. Fifteen (15) members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5. The date of the installation of officers meeting shall be set by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Guests may be invited to any meeting of the organization except the election meeting in March.

Section 7. The same guest may not attend more than two (2) meetings in one year if eligible for membership.

ARTICLE IX – DEPARTMENTS & COMMITTEES

Section 1. (a) The departments of this organization shall conform with that outlined by the State and General Federation.

(b) No member shall serve as chairman of the same department for more than two consecutive terms.

Section 2. (a) This organization shall sponsor the Junior Woman's Club, Inc. of Wilton Manors.

(b) The sponsor of the Junior Woman's Club shall be appointed by the Board of Directors on the recommendation of the Junior and Senior clubs.

(c) The Junior Woman's Club of Wilton Manors shall be permitted to use the clubhouse facilities for not more than two (2) fund raising events per club year not to exceed two (2) consecutive days per each event.

Section 3. The standing committees shall be: Budget, Program, Membership, Social, Ways and Means, Press, Publicity and Historian, Sunshine and Welfare, House, Telephone and Transportation, and Bulletin.

Section 4. The chairmen of the departments and special committees shall be appointed by the President ~~with the approval of the Board of Directors.~~

Section 5. There shall be a standing By-laws Revision Committee. The chairman shall be appointed by the President and two (2) members elected from the general assembly at the first meeting in September. This committee may submit a revised set of by-laws at a meeting of the general assembly. The chairman shall read the revised By-laws at two (2) regular business meetings for adoption by the general assembly.

ARTICLE X – PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Section 1. The rules contained in *Robert's Rules of Order Revised* shall govern the organization in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these by-laws.

ARTICLE XI – AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the organization by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the mem-

bers present and voting, provided written notice of the proposed amendment shall have been sent to the entire membership and the proposed amendments read at two (2) consecutive meetings.

Section 2. Proposed revisions must be consistent with the charter provision in accordance with Section 617.02, Florida Statutes Annotated.
