WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT THE REFERENDUM ELECTION

Next Tuesday, June 1, 1965

THE PURPOSE OF ORDINANCE 3 251-C is to encourage large apartment buildings and high-rise apartments, especially on vacant and plentiful business property (B-1 zoning). There is enough B-1 property in Wilton Manors to support a city of 40,000 to 50,000 people. (Present population is 10,000.) Any type of residential use is allowed on business property.

If you vote for this ordinance you can expect:

HIGHER TAXES. In northern towns taxes have skyrocketed 300% and more, where large multi-unit apartments sprang up. Municipal expense increases faster than tax revenue from such buildings. A Coral Ridge Tower type of 15 stories brings in only as much as a flourishing supermarket.

PARKING INDIGESTION. Our parking ordinance requires only one parking space per apt. unit. City Council has refused to raise the requirement.

TRAFFIC CONGESTION. Ordinance 251-C makes possible 500 apartments at the corner of NE 15th Ave. and 26th St. One thousand people or more on this former ball park! The example can be multiplied throughout our city.

SIGNIFICANT POINTS ABOUT 251-C (or) HOW THE PUBLIC IS FOOLED

--By a change of the definition of a public sewerage system in the existing ordinance #90, it allows that an "On-Site Package Treatment Plant" be considered the same as a public sewerage system, and

--Lowers the land area requirement for apartment dwellings from 1200 square feet per family living unit to 800 square feet where these so-called public sewerage systems are used. That is mainly all 251-C does.

1. WHAT IS an "On-Site Package Treatment Plant"? It is a sewerage treatment plant on a very small scale. It is located entirely on the building-site area of the building it will serve, AND SO IS THE DISCHARGE OF ALL "REFINED" SEWERAGE THEREFROM, unless emptying into a waterway. This can hardly be called a "Public Sewerage System."
2. IN EFFECT, 251-C allows apartment houses using a package plant to put more families on any given piece of land. Actually, the Council-proposed reduction from 1200 sq. ft. to 800 sq. ft. would INCREASE POPULATION DENSITY 33% and can CREATE SEWERAGE DENSITY INCREASES OF 33%.
3. PRESENT ORDINANCES DO NOT forbid the use of package plants in Wilton Manors. In fact, there are 2 such plants operating now, and both empty waste "effluent" into Middle River. Also, both plants were built under the more spacious 1200 sq. ft. per family standard of Ordinance #90.

In Ordinance #251-C we find no significant difference in standards for construction, operation and maintenance than what the Health Dept. already demands and enforces.

4. THE HEALTH BOARD requires nursing and convalescent homes to use package plants where no true public sewerage system is available. All package plants and septic tank systems in Florida are under direct control of the State and County Boards of Health.
5. HISTORY OF ORDINANCE #251-C goes back to April 1964. Six ordinances have been before Council for this one purpose of reducing land area. Five were defeated or dropped, but 251-C was passed Dec. 22, 1964, by Council members Smith, Stafford, Thompson and Burnell. Mayor Price promptly vetoed it, but on 1/5/65 Council over-rode the Mayor's veto. The ensuing petition circulated by the WILTON MANORS CIVIC ASSOCIATION was a spontaneous response of hundreds of property owners who recognized the imposition on our residential community.

The WILTON MANORS CIVIC ASSOCIATION is not against package treatment plants, or a true public sewerage system. We ARE AGAINST the reduction of land area per apartment which Ordinance 251-C so cleverly hides. It would seem to be ridiculous to designate as a public sewerage system what is in fact a privately owned and privately operated package treatment plant.

WE ARE NOT YET such a poor, mixed-up or rundown community that we must allow the numerous "blights" made possible by an influx of temporary or transient apartment renters around us just to appease a few money-hungry land owners, speculators, or smooth talking politicians.

LET THE DEVELOPERS and landowners build their structures under the same rules that presently exist. These are the building and zoning rules that caused many of us to move to Wilton Manors with pride in the environment.

OTHER CITIES are trying to rid themselves of the same situation that 251-C would create for Wilton Manors! A vote for 251-C is a step backwards. No other community in Broward or Palm Beach Counties to the best of our knowledge will allow such a building-site reduction in square footage where sanitary sewers are unavailable.

VOTE AGAINST 251-C Tuesday, June 1. The WILTON MANORS CIVIC ASSOCIATION has made it possible for you to have this voice in the matter. The time is now for you to be heard.

THE CITY CHARTER AMENDMENT BILL TO APPROVE A 4-YEAR TERM FOR COUNCIL MEMBERS

The City Council some months ago made all necessary arrangements with the Legislators comprising the Broward County Delegation to Tallahassee, and had the City Attorney draw up the necessary papers in order that Council members would be able, by such action, to enjoy twice the tenure in office.

THIS WAS DONE WITHOUT ONCE HOLDING A PUBLIC HEARING PRIOR TO PLACING IT IN THE HANDS OF THE STATE DELEGATION. IT DID APPEAR ON AN AGENDA FOR THE FIRST TIME AT A SPECIAL SATURDAY MEETING AFTER THE WILTON MANORS CIVIC ASSOCIATION DIRECTORS UNANIMOUSLY VOTED TO OBJECT TO SUCH ARBITRARY ACTION TO CHANGE THIS MOST SACRED DOCUMENT OF OUR PEOPLE WITHOUT THEIR KNOWLEDGE. HENCE, THE BROWARD DELEGATION OF SENATOR RYAN AND MESSRS. ALLSWORTH, EDDY, BROWN, McPHERSON, AND KEARNS SAID THEY WOULD RECOMMEND AN APPROVAL OF A CHARTER CHANGE (for 4 year terms) ONLY IF APPROVED BY A VOTE OF THE PEOPLE.

Our Comment: -- Any elected official has no trouble being re-elected if worthy and deserving of office. We know they are sensitive to the public pulse the year before election. We believe a 4-year term is not in the best interest of the people of this community at this time. When and if we have 6 elected officials who consistently represent and work for the good of the majority, this Association will be the first to beat the drums for a 4-year term!

X-VOTE AGAINST THE CHARTER BILL

TAXES AND THE CITY BUDGET

We respectfully call your attention to this release in the Ft. Lauderdale News of Sunday, May 16, 1965:

Councilmen Burnell, Meacham and Thompson indicated if there was a need they would increase the city taxes one half (1/2) to one (1) mil on top of the present three (3) mills.

This action is hardly necessary. Here is why ----

Tax Assessor Markham has publicly stated he is compelled by law to assess at 100% of property valuation. We're now assessed at 75%. This simply means we will be paying more taxes to the city if the taxing bodies do not REDUCE the present millage.

Example. Your house now valued at \$10,000, assessed at 75% of valuation. 75% of \$10,000 is \$7,500, from which \$5,000 exemption is deducted, leaving taxable \$2,500 at 3 mills and making your tax to the city of Wilton Manors \$7.50. The same house, valued at \$10,000, assessed at 100% of valuation, from which \$5,000 exemption is deducted, leaves a taxable \$5,000 at 3 mills, and makes your tax to the city \$15.00. This is a 100% increase in tax monies.

All taxing bodies are being asked to reduce the present millage, when this State Supreme Court decision is effective. It could be effective this year or next year at the latest.

CITY COUNCIL NEWS:

At the last City Council meeting held Feb. 9th, Ordinance 496 was put before the Council for consideration, namely to change the job classification of Finance Director and eliminate the requirement of the B.A. degree pertaining to that position. The Ordinance was passed on the first reading by a vote of 4 to 1. A statement was made that the present Finance Director, John Ciullo, had been doing a fine job for the past two years, since he was appointed (temporarily). According to the 1980 and 1981 audits made by an accredited C.P.A. firm, THE FACTS, COMMENTS AND THE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR CHANGES TO BE MADE SHOWS THAT STATEMENT TO BE UNTRUE! There have been many discrepancies in the finance dept. which shows the lack of good supervision such as: books and records not kept up to date, delayed reconciliations of bank accounts, no detailed records of the 2.5 million dollars in the General Fixed Asset account and no detailed records for the City's investments and REVENUE from same. The C.P.A.'s have recommended that the Internal Accounting Control be brought up to the standards of the Governmental Accounting & Financial reporting principles. It will be interesting to see when this will be accomplished and by whom. Ordinance 496 was passed on Feb. 23rd by a vote of 3 to 1, (second reading)

WHY A CIVIC ASSOCIATION IN WILTON MANORS?

This is the most frequent question asked by citizens. One candidate for the council has even stated that there are no issues in the up-coming election. Apparently this candidate has not been to council meetings as many citizens have, due to the limited seating of approximately 125 for a population of 14,000. It cripples our active participation. Because our city lacks a means of communication to its people and newspapers find our city less newsworthy than our larger neighbors, the need for a Civic Association to provide citizens with factual information and insight is imperative for the control of our own city. Had a Civic Association existed for the past several years, here are some of the facts that could have been made available to the public:

Sept. 1978 Council agrees to a Charter Review Board and will take applications for same.

OCT. 1978 Police officers apply for Union - feel the council makes no effort to understand their needs and working conditions, etc.

OCT. 1978 County supplies all city inspectors (for over 6 months) until

JULY 1st, 1979 when current building inspector assumes duties.

NOV. 1978 Police vote down Union after assurances by private citizens working behind the scenes that council will be receptive, thus making it legal for council and police to discuss differences.

NOV. 1978 Charter Review has 6 applicants - will be on future agenda set up for Jan. 1979 - but never gets to agenda - citizens are told there is trouble in getting people to serve - never brought up by council again until Nov. 1981

DEC. 12, 1978 - 12:15 A.M. Council adds to agenda - effectively cutting off public input, then appoints one of their own members to Civil Service position of building inspector. Addition to agenda requires 4 to 1 vote. This member appointed, votes to assure item goes on agenda. Councilman appointed continues in his seat for 6 months, resigns June 1979.

JAN 12, 1979 Civil Service Rules and Regulations adopted in 1973 and in use for over 6 years, invalidated appointment - rules prohibit elected officials from being appointed.

JAN 23, 1979 City Attorney invalidated Civil Service rules as not being physically attached to city council minutes. Two attempts to instruct him to research further to validate them are ignored by council.

NOTE!!!! After almost 3 years of waiting for City Attorney, Civil Service Board prepares, re-writes and passes NEW RULES & REGULATIONS - included is same 1973 ruling no elected official can be appointed during his term to a classified position.

FEB 13, 1979 State Attorney General Ruling presented to the council states appointment is contrary to public policy, against good conscience, public morals and should be held VOID.

MARCH 1979 City Attorney rules State Attorney General ruling invalid and appointment is valid unless it goes to court and is decided otherwise. Council members appoint as President of City Council - the same councilman appointed to building inspector, during council discussions of need for city "own" building inspector

APRIL 1979 City Council receives report on 10:00 A.M. meeting with Broward County Building Dept. on what they can provide plus costs, etc. Six requests to put on future agenda for full discussion - allowing citizens to hear and participate are ignored. Building dept. and Assistant City Administrator advise County doing an excellent job and cost efficient.

MAY 1979 City Council President (and appointee to building inspector) questions value of Deputy City Administrator Harry Mertz after he addressed the council earlier that the Countys' inspections were adequate for the city and there was no need for our own building inspector.

JUNE 1979 Harry Mertz, D.C.A., a degree holding professional, resigns, due to undue pressure from council. F. Sterling regrets his resignation as he was doing a fine job and dedicated to the city.

JAN 1980 Mayor requests council to place on referendum for citizens vote in March, 1980 addition to Charter prohibiting former elected city officials from holding any compensated appointed city office or employment until one year after the expiration of their term. Council criticizes Mayor and takes no action. Citizens get no choice.

JAN 1980 Citizens again requests council - what about Charter Review Board? what has happened to the committee? Council advises - not set up due to not enough applicants to serve. NOTE: NOT UNTIL 1982 did the citizens locate a memo dated Jan 5, 1979 sent to council giving them 8 residents who volunteered to serve on this board that only numbers 5.

MARCH 1980 Election City Council: Mike Curran (appointed to council in Oct. 1979) runs on platform of being "Committed to a Charter Review Commission"
 NOTE: nothing happens again until after Tracy Staffords' appointment and the Civic Association presses need for this review board. Finally in Jan. 1982, after 20 months, a Board is appointed.

JUNE 1980 John Ciullo is appointed acting Finance Director with the understanding from Mayor he will continue his schooling and obtain his degree as required by the job description.

OCT 1980 Crime Task Force proposes to expand police station - council rejects proposal and disbands the Task Force. Police station is 25 yrs old - had 8 employees - now there 30 and is still the same size.

NOV 1980 Citizens organize Town Hall meeting at Elementary school requesting better police protection and that council improve antiquated, crowded facilities of police dept. by additional space. Council agrees to help and advise citizens shortly. No word received again until Jan. 1982 on expansion of police station.

JUNE 1981 Councilman resigns to apply for City Administrator job.

AUG 1981 Police requests pay increases to stay competitive with other cities. Council refuses to create evaluation committee of professionals to review over 60 applications for City Administrator position.

SEPT 1981 Mayor cuts travel 1981/1982 for council and administrators by \$3000.00 as unnecessary but council returns funds to budget.

SEPT 1981 68 applications for City Admin. position - council ready to select without any personal interviews or regard to outside expertise.

SEPT. 1981 Councilperson Jedlicka nominates Tracy Stafford for City Admin. which requires 5 years experience in administration. City Attorney rules the move is legal

SEPT 1981 Council interviews 4 candidates - three with degrees and experience in administration (public).

SEPT 1981 Council appoints, as predicted, Tracy Stafford, their fellow-councilman to City Admin. position over protests of packed chambers, lobby & street.

OCT 1981 3 to 5 Budget hearings/meetings - council refuses to hold any work-shop meetings to discuss citizens proposals or requests. Budget gets approved, at a 38% increase.

OCT 1981 Civil Service Board advised by citizens that the Finance Director serving illegally - and found to be the truth.

OCT 22, 1981 WILTON MANORS CIVIC ASSOC. has organizational meeting : objective : inform the public, create Charter Review Board as proposed 2 yrs. ago and get Civil Service rules & regulations up to date.

NOV 1981 Council President Curran offers to set up Charter Review Board, look into Civil Service and building dept.

NOV 1981 Civil Service Board meets - upset over city not notifying them that the Finance Director was un-certified. Votes to advertise for job and make certifications.

DEC. 1981 Council replaces Jim Mitchell on Civil Service Board claiming a conflict of interest as member of WMCA - replaces with Sandy Jedlickas' nomination - Angela Nerber, accountant with no previous knowledge of Civil Service. Nerber is now Sandys' Campaign Director.

NOTE: Jim Mitchell holds a legal degree and has 39 years experience in labor and personnel.

JAN 1982 Civil Service Board meets and approves new rules & regulations. Vote illegal as Angela Nerber abstains. Result: must be voted on again at next meeting. City Attorney states vote legal when at time questioned by members of WMCA.

FEB 1982 City Council finally appoints members to Charter Review Board. Also changes title, description, qualifications of Finance Director - also removes Finance Director from Civil Service, thus retaining the same person in position. Puts City Administrator in charge of budget with no change in his qualifications.

These are just some of the things, briefly explained, that have taken place in your city. All are public record and we encourage all to visit the City Hall, read them, listen to the tapes of the meetings, attend meetings, and come to your own conclusions.

Help us to improve our Government by moving positively forward to protect and create a better quality of life.

METRO TAKE OVER - NO!!!

Any decisions made by City Council on contractual work by other cities or county does not mean METRO TAKE OVER. It means a job done more efficiently at reduced cost, which is a tax savings for the citizens of Wilton Manors. We now contract as follows:

Oakland Park for sewerage
Utilities Service Inc. for Sewage Pump Station repairs
Shenandoah Const. Co. for Sewer Line T.V. Monitoring

Our Building Dept. will continue to issue licenses and permits as it has in the past. The only difference will be that the city will contract some one else to do the actual physical inspections. All inspections and services will be coordinated through our present Building Dept. at City Hall.

CHARTER REVIEW ADVISORY BOARD

As of the last meeting of this Board on April 20, 1982, progress has been made up to Article III, Sec. 10. All out-dated items were discarded and have been replaced by up-dated and re-phrased sections including Mayor, City Administrator/Treas. and City Clerk positions and their respective duties. Newly appointed Acting City Attorney, Morris C. Tucker, attended this meeting to assist in some of the legal aspects in changing any Charter Format that may not be consistent with the Florida Statutes. The next meeting is scheduled for May 4, 1982. This Board meets on alternating Tuesday nights (the first and third, whereas the Council meets every second and fourth of each month.) at 7:30 P.M. at the City Hall. The public is invited to attend these meetings to observe and perhaps provide in-put at the end of the session.

FOURTH OF JULY - CELEBRATION & ACTIVITIES AT MICKEL FIELD

Plans are in the process now of sponsoring Tommy Mercer and his band to play from 4:00 P.M. to 6:00 P.M. with John Lupton (from WFTL) as M.C. This should prove to be worth while entertainment for all and give the Wilton Manors Civic Association a chance to let everyone know that "WE'RE HERE!" This program will be put before the floor at the April 29th meeting for discussion and vote. We will also need donations to meet the costs of this venture. Any and all will be gratefully accepted!

POLICE UNION VOTED DOWN!

By only one vote, the Wilton Manors Police decided not to unionize. With a 13 to 12 vote, the Police said they would try again to work out their problems with City Council. Officer Pete Bigelsen, secretary of the F.O.P., was quoted, " I think it's a good warning to the city that if they don't listen or attempt to communicate with us, then the union issue will be brought back for a third time and will be voted in." The vote, however, shows the majority of the officers felt they had a good chance to communicate with the new Council. Good luck to all involved!

CITY COUNCIL NEWS HI-LITES

At the Council meeting of October 26th, Special Ordinance 339, Authorizing the issuance of Industrial Development Bonds in the amount of \$715,000.00 for the Sheffield Nursing home facility was approved by a 3/2 vote on the First reading.

Ronald Boss was appointed to the Code Enforcement Board by a 4/1 vote. Seven requisitions were approved for equipment needed for various City Departments and will come back to Council in the proper Resolution form for a final vote.

A travel voucher for Councilman James Grady to attend the National League of Cities Convention was approved as amended.

Comments were made as to the postponement of the Charter Review meetings and the limited time for public in-put.

At the Council meeting of November 9, the new City Administrator, J. Scott Miller and the new City Clerk, Ms. Deanne J. Doherty were sworn in to their new positions by Judge George Richardson, a long time resident of Wilton Manors.

Special Ordinance 339 was approved by a 3/2 vote on the 2nd and Final reading regarding the Sheffield Nursing home.

Ordinance 511 regarding drug paraphernalia, prohibiting possession of same with intent to use, manufacture or delivery of same, advertising same, providing penalties, etc. was approved unanimously on First reading. Comments from Council stated the maximum penalties of \$500.00 fine and short jail term were not strong enough but City Attorney Morris Tucker stated that these penalties are locked in by State Law.

Ordinance 512 regarding the retroactive effect of attorney's fees and City costs as to any public nuisance unabated per date of this Ordinance, was approved by 4/1 vote.

Ordinance 513, repealing Ordinance 307, dated November 26, 1968, regarding the Municipal Police Officer's Retirement Trust Fund was approved on First reading, however, a Special Council meeting was called on Friday morning at 10 A.M. for further discussion and vote. As there was a time limit on this item, it was approved by a 4/5 vote on 2nd and Final reading.

Further discussion on the Charter Review Board was brought up resulting in the request by Council President Diane Cline that the meetings be resumed on Tuesday, November 16th.

RESEARCH COMMITTEE NEWS

Early in 1982, it was brought to the attention of the Civic Association by the Research Committee that a "Head Shop" was doing business in our City. For those who do not know the term "Head Shop"; it is a store that sells drug paraphernalia. Since that time, on at least two different occasions, a representative of the Civic Association has appeared before City Council encouraging passage of a strong anti-drug paraphernalia law. We are happy to report that such a law has been unanimously approved on First reading and will become law after approval and passage of the 2nd and Final reading on November 23rd, 1982. Anyone with knowledge or suspicion of drug use or trafficking within our city owes it to their friends and neighbors to report these suspicions to the Wilton Manors Police Dept. With this new law, we urge you also, to report any suspicion of sales of paraphernalia. Only with community cooperation and support, can we clean the drugs out of Wilton Manors.

CLEAN-UP CAMPAIGN

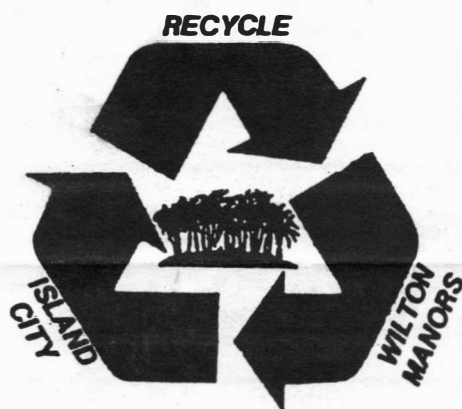

Tuesday, Aug. 28th

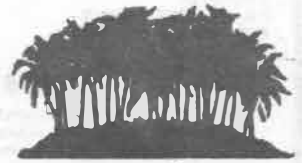

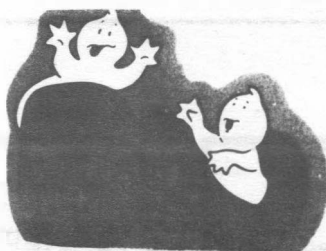

ANTI-CRIME AWARDS

City officials are starting a program similar to Crime-stoppers. Under the Wilton Manors Reward Fund, cash would be given to the person whose tip leads to the conviction of a criminal. 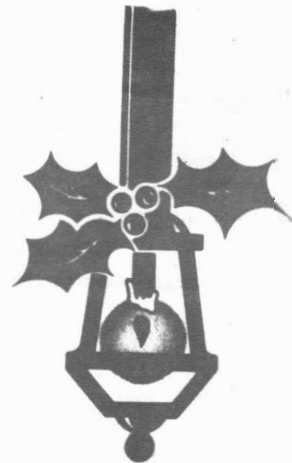

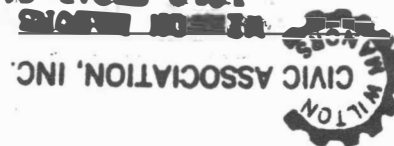

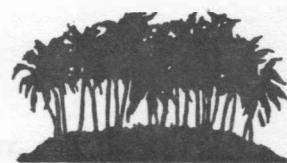

COUNCIL MEETING
SETS RECORDS ON 2/22

Due to the Holidays falling on meeting nights, the Council had an extremely large agenda which included three or four extremely controversial items. I have been given to understand that there are 60 public seats in Chambers. Every seat had someone in it and at least the same amount of people were in the lobby attempting to get in. I don't know how early you had to be there to get a seat but, if you could sit that long, it was yours until 1:35 AM when the meeting finally adjourned. This reporter only found a seat when Officer "Tony" left.

COUNCIL MEETING 2/22

The Mayor requested that input and con-structive criticism be kept to a maximum of three minutes. A timekeeper was appointed and no debates or personality conflicts were to be tolerated.

PUBLIC HEARING

Three residents took exception with out-of-state traveling done by the Council as well as to the League of Cities and to Tallahassee for the Inaugural. Also, according to city rules and regs, all expenses must be approved in writing and not done orally, as had been. The Mayor stated that we had been invited to Tallahassee to make a presentation, on a state-wide level, of our innovative recycling program. They drove the City bus which helped make expenses nominal. All expenses were not paid by Council.

A Highland neighbor objected to the new garbage contract stating that some things looked worse than they had been before. The City Manager was directed to look into the matter. He said that the recycling containers are on order and should be

operable by the 15th of February. Rab Rouser questioned as to whether the corner and highway "holdups" are licensed and is the money going where its supposed to be.

The Mayor moved the Agenda for the sake of expediency.

NEW BUSINESS

The DOT showed a proposal to refigure the traffic pattern at 5 Points, which would include one-lane-ing 26th street, West. After many pros and cons, the Council voted it down. No one apparently has seen accidents or had any real problems. There was also discussion on Publix, the parking lot and the Dixie bridge as well as the businesses on the East side of the street. The general feeling was "If it's not broken, don't fix it."

DOT's Vargas answered twelve questions. The Council left a motion to leave 5 points the way it is. There will be a continuance on Dixie Highway until a digital map overlay is done.

PARKLAND ACQUISITION

acquired, how it was done, use of land, who would use, the recreations provided, police coverage, where money came from, etc. Mayor admitted to a procedural error, but - its ours, lets use it. The Ordinance to ratify the purchase was approved by vote. 3 yes, one no & one abstention.

Council authorized amendments to the City Pension Plan.

Council allowed an exclusive easement to Southern Bell for telecommunication equipment.

Council passed a resolution to apply for a Highway Beautification grant.

Police Department requested Council to revoke a resident's business license due to a fraudulent info on his application. Much discussion and evidence presented. The request was honored by vote.

Broward Days will be March 13th and 14th and Council voted to make their annual donation - \$200 to Tallahassee.

St. Clements was allowed a waiver of fees for their annual festival, to run from Feb. 21 thru Feb. 24.

MARCH COUNCIL MEETING 3/26/91

April 1 through 7 was proclaimed to be Community Development Week.

Frances Payne presented a plaque to the City from the Child Care Connection in honor of a

\$2500.00 donation to the Day Care Center for Underprivileged Children.

Public Hearings had a great deal to do with 15th Avenue - still!. The residents wish the curbs and sidewalks to be finished and forget the plants. Consensus appears to be that shrubbery should be in the swale as a safety and sound barrier for traffic. They are also interested in additional parking for the Avenue and more officer's time to protect against speeders. Vehicles will be towed from the swale, if left, and the swale will be maintained by the city. The sidewalks will be put on the agenda from the April 25th meeting.

RESOLUTION \$ 1531 re the six cent local option gas tax was approved and passed. Expected revenue should be about \$135,000.00.

RESOLUTION #1532 was approved and passed to purchase three police vehicles and one police van at a total cost of \$55,657.00.

It was reported that the Salute to the Troops was a well attended and successful event.

I-95 UPDATE

Murray C. Bond, the Gold Coast Commuter Services Project Director made what he said was to be "his last report". The 12 lanes have been put in and should be open shortly. Cypress to Sample Road, Boca and Palm Beach extensions should be done by May, at the latest, and Griffin to Dade County should be finished by June or July. The last section to be worked on will be south of Sunrise Boulevard to the New River Bridge and will include a flyover bridge at Broward and Davie Boulevards OVER I-95, instead of under. If you wish to avoid any of these construction areas, take the TRI-RAIL along with the 8000 daily commuters that ride it now. Broward County Transportation System has noticed an increase in use that continues despite road completion.

OFFICIAL'S REPORTS

Councilwoman Olson inquired as to Motor Homes relation to ORDINANCE #1987 regarding State standards re length. It will

undoubtedly be put on an agenda, shortly. Also, the Fire Department will be consulted as to safety re propane gas tanks. Mayor Steen publicly thanked Rab and Anita Rouser for their donation of time and materials to print the handbills, posters and programs for the Salute to the Troops. They allow the City a very heavy discount. The flags will come down and go up again for July Fourth Weekend but the yellow banners will remain up for a while longer. She also thanked the Business Association and the Parks and Recreation Department for their part in Saturday's affair.

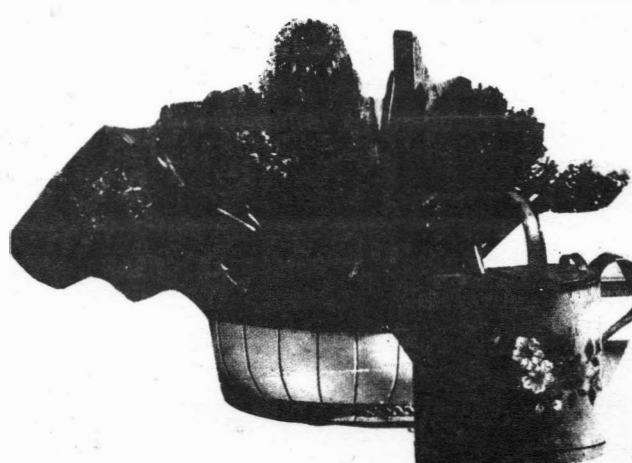

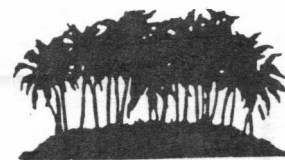

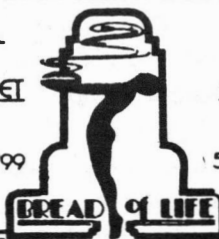

COUNCIL MEETING

APRIL 23, 1991

Mayor Steen proclaimed April 21 - 27 to be National Week of the Ocean; May 1 & 2 Career/Jobs Expo '91 Days for students, in cooperation with the School Board; May 1 to be Seniors for Seniors Day due to the President declaring May to be Older Citizen's Month and May 1 to also be National Fun and Fitness Day for the youth of Wilton Manors.

Concerned citizens expressed their approval as well as disapproval about an unsigned flyer that was received in the mail regarding a scurrilous attack on Councilwoman O'Gorman. All but one of the many speakers told Ms. O'Gorman that they personally supported her. Rab Rouser informed those present that Stuart McIver was to speak at the Friends of the Library meeting to discuss the County and our City.

RESOLUTION #1533 re-appointed Warren Westervelt, Nick Bellissimo and Robert Wunsch to a 2 year term with the Planning and

Zoning Board.

RESOLUTION #1534 accepted a proposal from Bell Atlantic Tricon Leasing for budgeted items under a lease-purchase arrangement.

REPORT OF THE CITY MANAGER:

1) Commercial recycling Pilot Program now in use. City-wide mid-size and large programs will kick-off by July 4th.

2) A 53% of power demand has resulted in a yearly saving of \$1700.

NEW BUSINESS:

Our City is in good financial condition despite a slight cash reserve drop (due to unexpected payments and needed purchases).

The St. Clement's School warning/crossing light was approved at \$2000 and should be operating in approximately 45 days.

The engineering company of Darby and Way was paid a total of \$20,900.47 for unpaid bills. It was announced that Ed and Emma Johnson who, residents of Manor Grove, will celebrate their 65th Anniversary.

MEMBERSHIP FEES

Last month's meeting was your last chance to pay only \$6.00 for your year's dues. Due to the increase in postage, we have to pass on the additional cost to our members so that you may continue receiving this newsletter. We voted to raise the dues to \$10.00 per year, per family.

EDITORIAL ADDITIONS

We have added two new columns to this paper, starting with this issue. They will be only as good as you make them. One is PATS AND PANS, in which you may praise or belittle a person, place or thing. The second is the SOUND OFF column, in which you may censure, defend, offer information or give suggestions to our readers. Please mail any input to Vicky Keller, Editor, 140 NE 19th Court, E101. They will be printed in the next monthly issue and will be edited only to fit the available space. If you identify yourself to us, we will not print your name if you so request. Please look elsewhere in this issue for our first contributions from local citizens.

WRITER'S WANTED

We would hope that some of you would take pen in hand to advise of your concerns about our city. Traffic, code enforcement, school, recycling, waste, council doings (or "not doings") and/or anything else that might interest you. Send us pictures of the water-fronts, abandoned cars or property, streets that need fixing of some kind, street lights that are out, etc. Let us know, we'll pass it along to the department that needs to know about it. Better yet, come to our meetings and bring your input with you.

PATS AND PANS

Talk Is Cheap?

The time and money spent for beautiful drawings submitted for the N.E. 15th Avenue landscaping were not. It was stated that trees and landscaping would not improve the safety factor of the street so it still looks like a race track road. It is not appealing to the eye and the street has hurt the resale property value of the residential area. As a citizen I believe it should be brought to the level of Wilton Drive's landscape.

PATS AND PANS (Cont.)

There was a great deal of time and money expended with no comparable results. It would seem that 15th Avenue will remain almost the same. The landscaping bids that were received came in extremely high and will not be utilized. It is thought that there should have been further bids encouraged, however, the area neighbors were not happy with anything that had been drawn and/or submitted to the Council to be acted upon. Council appeared to be more concerned with what those who appeared at the meetings felt and decided to use the money where, perhaps, it was better needed. See what happens when you attend Council meetings! The Public Hearings had a great deal to do with 15th Avenue - still! The residents wish the curbs and sidewalks to be finished and forget the plants. Consensus appears to be that shrubbery should be in the swale as a sound barrier for traffic and be maintained by the City. They are also interested in additional parking for the Avenue and more officer's time to protect against speeders.

OFFICIALS REPORTS:

Vice-Mayor Fiore attended Earth Day Festivities. He informed those present that many persons were much impressed with the 83% participation of our citizens in our recycling program; one of the highest in any City or County in the State.

It was stated that the Budget Workshops will have to be scheduled around vacations.

It was announced that there are 2 vacancies on the Board of Adjustments. Council requests applications from any interested and qualified individuals.

The Board hears appeals from Building and Zoning and it is suggested that one be a Civil Engineer; have contractual/architectural and/or legal knowledge.

Mayor Steen was appointed by the Broward League of Cities to the Resource Recovery Board of Directors. She toured the new South Broward Incinerator Plant which is due to open in one month; the North Plant to open in July.

Councilman Pratt commented that we have a State-wide leadership position in recycling which is justifiably deserved.

SOUND OFF

THE BUDGET???

Once again the time has come for our town to plan how to spend our tax dollars. Unfortunately government sometimes formulates how much is wished to be spent and then finds out how to apply a tax increase to cover the added expense. Never does the word "cut" or "save" enter the discussion until the final days of the public hearings.

We are a small town and it is about time to realize that we cannot match the latest, biggest and expensive acquisitions enjoyed by our neighbor cities. The quest to "keep up with the Jones'" is not only burdening the current tax years, but by the recent use of "creative" financing, also spreading the current budget to future years. It appears to be a credible financial policy to borrow money at low rates rather than use our current tax income - but this mistakenly frees money in this year's budget to use for additional items. This policy is valid for large capital expenditures or where bond issues are employed for major

projects such as the Water Pipe Replacement BUT - if abused, the deferred payments will snowball to the point where the current budget is only paying for previous council purchases.

To note some of the recent finance/lease arrangements that have been used to postpone actual expenditure, I list just a few:

- 1) A computer was budgeted for \$55,000 but was leased - where was the budgeted money used?
- 2) A fire truck was purchased over a several year period.
- 3) Several police cars and some repairs/additions to the Police Station have been financed.

Major expenditures should be financed to reflect their useful life - BUT - I strongly urge the council not to use next year's tax dollars to make this year's budget look good. I have watched our budget increase from \$2.5 million to \$8.5 million in the last five years. This while the population is decreasing. That is a leap of 350 per cent (\$6 million dollars),

and that I find utterly impossible to explain!!!

Let's make this year's budget really reflect what is needed to keep our city progressing - not how we can manipulate the finances to create a well "balanced budget".

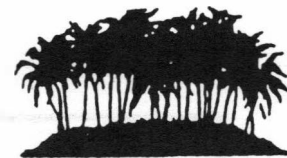

#1547: Appointing members to the Parks & Recreation Advisory Bd.

#1548: Authorizing the City Manager to apply for a national small business tree planting grant.

The following recipe was requested by so many people at our last meeting, we asked Tony Barone how he made his

RUM RAISIN POUND CAKE

3/4 cup raisins
1/2 cup rum (see note)
2 Tbls all-purpose flour
1 package yellow cake mix (18 1/2 ozs.)
8 ozs. sour cream or yogurt (1 cup)
3 eggs
3/4 teaspoon nutmeg

Preheat oven to 350 degrees; grease and lightly flour a Bundt or 10 inch tube pan. Place raisins & rum in a microwave-safe bowl or measuring cup. Microwave on high (100% power) for 1 1/2 minutes. Allow to stand for 5 minutes.....or place in a small saucepan and heat to a simmer..... Remove from heat and allow to stand 5 minutes. Drain raisins well, reserving rum. Mix raisins with 2 Tbls. flour until well coated; set aside.

In a large bowl, combine cake mix, reserved rum, sour cream or yogurt, eggs and nutmeg.

Beat with an electric mixer at low speed until moistened. Beat at high speed 2 minutes. With a large spoon, fold in flour-ed raisins, distributing throughout. Pour batter into prepared pan. Bake in preheated oven for 40/45 minutes or until long wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Makes sixteen servings.

NOTE: If desired, substitute part rum, part water. Bourbon or Brandy may also be used. However, if you do not wish to use alcohol, substitute 1/2 cup water mixed with 1 tsp. rum, brandy or almond extract.

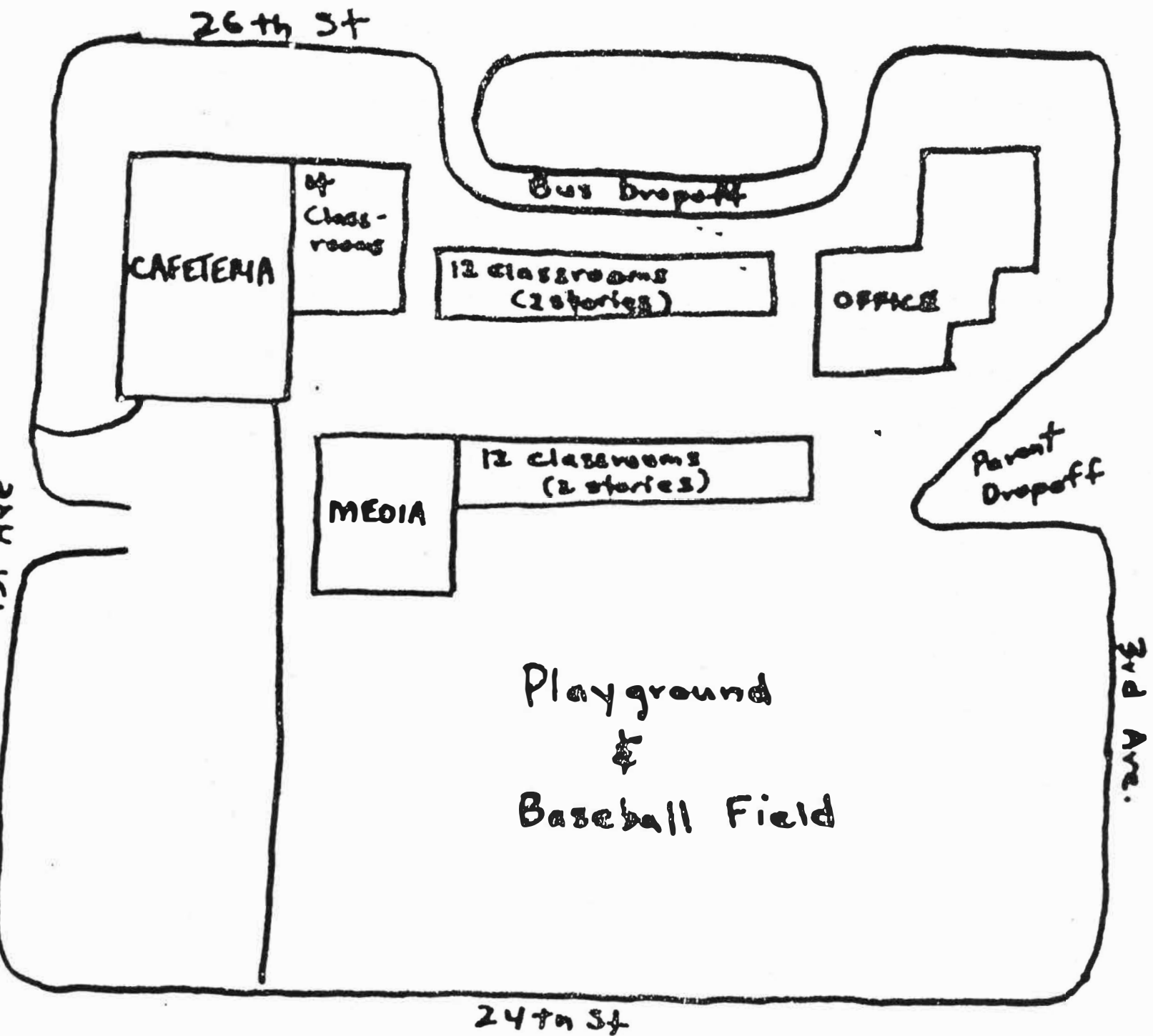

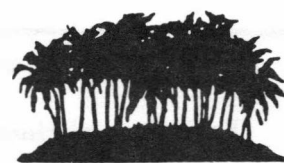

CRIME WATCH

Citizen participation is one of the most effective tools against crime because the job of stopping burglary, robbery or sexual assault is impossible for the police to accomplish alone. Crime watchers are networks of neighbors trained by crime prevention officers in home and self-protection, suspect identification and how to serve effectively as additional eyes and ears for law enforcement agencies in their communities.

Neighborhood awareness or crime watcher groups provide a way for neighbors to help one another by keeping an eye on each other's homes and property. A telephone chain is set up to enable neighbors to receive information from the police concerning descriptions of suspected criminals and other pertinent information.

When a member of a network sees a suspicious person or vehicle, one that meets the description given through the telephone chain, or a crime in progress they call the police department to report. You should NEVER attempt to apprehend a

suspect. This is the law enforcement officer's job. It is recommended too that members of a network have handy listing of immediate neighbor's names, addresses and phone numbers and business phone numbers.

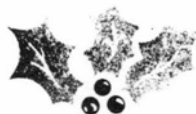
LIBRARY NEWS

OCTOBER 8, 1991

Mayor Steen recognized Nicholas Burczyk during the Public Hearing. He had a complaint re the Wilton Manors Police Department and Officer Zangara in particular. Burczyk had circulated a letter regarding a traffic ticket he had received. The Council and others supported the W.M.P.D. and Officer Zangara's actions.

ORDINANCE #701: to increase the variable charge for water. Since the City of Ft. Lauderdale has increased their water charge to us, it must be passed on to the residents. #701 was adopted unanimously.

ORDINANCE #702: to correct an omission

of language in a section of our zoning laws. #702 adopted.

Mr. Payne informed the Council that the City had received a America the Beautiful Urban and Community Forestry Grant to inventory and develop a maintenance program for all of our city trees.

It was announced that Officer Dominic Raimondi has been selected, for the second year, as Officer of the Year by Crime Stoppers.

Mayor Steen recognized Officer Ed Costello, in the audience, for his work with DARE. He has also been appointed to the State Board for the DARE program.

The Council agreed to proceed with a Veteran's Day Ceremony for Phase One of Veteran's Park; installation of the flags and flagpoles. Bricks are still being sold to fund phases two and three.

A motion was made to repair and upgrade the gravity sewer system with a Bond Issue. The motion

was passed unanimously.

Mayor Steen reported that the News Carrier's Easter Seals Campaign was kicked off on Friday, October 4th. She hopes to receive donations from business owners. She stated that we would be helping "one of our own" as an employee of the Library has a child with cerebral palsy who has been receiving help from the Easter Seal center for the last three years.

Mr. Payne announced that the reflector lights on 15th Avenue will be completed as soon as possible; that "No Fishing" and "Drug Free Zone" signs have been ordered; that a joint meeting with the Planning & Zoning Board has been scheduled.

Councilwoman O'Gorman congratulated the Parks and Recreation Staff for their excellent job in preparing and setting up the City Booth for Pioneer's Day which was held on October 5th and 6th in the town of Davie. It was enjoyed by all.

NOVEMBER 12, 1991

A Proclamation was read declaring December 1, 1991 as World AIDS Day in Wilton Manors. All citizens were urged to support the dedication and efforts of the Broward County Community AIDS Task Force.

ORDINANCE Z-192: Re rezoning of 2607 NE 10th Avenue. Dr. Tom Howard, Chiropractor, stated that he has provided proper parking and did not expect his office to create a traffic or parking problem. Vice-Mayor Fiore announced that this ordinance had been reviewed twice by the Planning and Zoning Board and was recommended. Passed.

RESOLUTION #1565: A motion was made and passed to have Daniel Keefe serve on the Municipal segment of the Community Development Block Grant Program of the Committee for Community Development.

Discussion on a motion for a feasibility study regarding the Yawt property. It

appears that the Yawt family does not wish to sell the trailer park at this time. Motion was defeated.

Marcia Ellington was extended congratulations for her appointment as Secretary to the Florida Library Association.

NOVEMBER 26, 1991

Mayor Steen proclaimed 11/22 - 28 as H.M.S. Alacrity Week in honor of this Royal Frigate and urged all citizens to visit this ship during its stay in Port Everglades.

Both Tony Barone and Ann Lunsford of the Wilton Manors Civic Association appreciated the Mayor's time to go aboard the frigate and present its Captain and crew with a proclamation in honor for their rescue of Tony and those who fought with him during the Korean War.

Wayne Schotanus suggested that Council consider a community fundraiser to help Officer Fleming and any other City employee

who might be injured while performing their duties. He was informed that a fund was being established for same.

RESOLUTION #1566: Much discussion and information on an agreement with Industrial Waste Services for commercial collections with new collection procedures within the city utility bills. This was adopted.

ORDINANCE #703: Removing chapter seven of the code and replacing it in its entirety regulating alarm systems within the city. Passed.

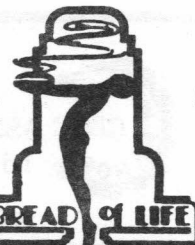
