The public is requested to cut out and mail the above coupon to the office of The Wilton Manors Bulletin, 2007 Wilton Drive Wilton Manors, Fort Lauderdale, Fla., or to leave the same at the office of this publication.

This is a public service rendered by The Bulletin in order to expedite the water question and at the request of the Village Council.

According to the report of the engineers, Black and Associates, Inc., from Gainesville, who were engaged by the Village Council to make a survey of the water situation for the Village, they make their recommendations as follows and we quote in part:

"The installation of a public water supply system for the Village of Wilton Manors is necessary for the growth and health of the community.

"The estimated population is 2800 in 1975.

"The proposed distribution system will serve the Village for the existing housing. When the housing area considered is expanded, the system will suffice as a sound network for future expansion.

"It is recommended that the minimum rate be \$2.50 for a 5,000 gallon minimum monthly and that additional water used over the 5,000 gallon minimum be charged at the rate of 50 cents per 1,000 gallons.

"The proposed financial method of installing the system is well within the anticipated revenue and will yield a satisfactory source of revenue to the Village."

The estimated costs according to the latest report from Black and Associates is, that based on the possibility of receiving water from Oakland Park, with the installation of the system it would cost approximately \$67,910.

Village officials have met with the Oakland Park governing body on several occasions and it is expected that at this week's meeting of the latter officials that some type of agreement can be reached.

One thing that the people of the community can be assured of is the fact that the governing body has given deep and conscientious study to the problem over the last few months.

At the meeting of the Council this Friday night a report will be made as to the action taken by Oakland Park as to whether or not they wish to supply water to the Village.

The Village Council meets Friday night.
