Laying of Water Pipe To Commence This Week

Officials of the Intercounty Construction Corp., Construction Managers of the Village in the installation of the water distribution system, stated that they will begin the laying of the main feed lines sometime this week. Already a bulldozer is on the job leveling off the ground on Old Dixie Highway near the Oakland Park line previous to the operation of the trench digger. The first pipes will be laid on Old Dixie where connection will be made with the Oakland Park system, and then go west on 26th St.

Practically all the pipe is now on the job and during the past week, the various size pipe was distributed throughout the Village.

One of those men, who is well qualified for re-election to the Port Authority, District 3, is F. Laird Rickard. Mr. Rickard through past experience is familiar with the activities of the port. He was a naval port director in World War II and has been a resident of Fort Lauderdale for 41 years, and knows the port and its potential in the shipping world. His record in the past 5 years is one of experience, capability and reliability. The growth which the port has made in the past few years is an indication of the business acumen displayed by Mr. Rickard, as a member of the Port Authority commission.

It has been called to our attention by a resident, not in a tone of criticism, but as a suggestion that the various business establishments in the community try to keep the "bank" of their stores free from refuse. It was further suggested that the Council might proclaim a "Clean Up Week," for the Village.

Elias E. Marshall, candidate for Constable in the May 6th Democratic

primary, has enlisted the services of his friends and acquaintances in the area who have enlisted their services in his behalf.

We note that with the primaries only a few days off that the various candidates are stepping up their campaigns. In the past few days we have noticed particularly that many cars are displaying banners for their favorites. We see many Paul E. Swindell banners in evidence. Mr. Swindell is a candidate for County Commissioner of District 1 and believes it is time for sincere administration. He has made no promises other than good, efficient government. Richard T. (Dick) Gallion, the present incumbent for this office and running for re-election believes that he has given an honest and economical administration to the job and has rendered many worthwhile improvements in Wilton Manors and the area. Mr. Gallion contends that there is no substitute for experience.

Have heard some comment regarding the scheduling of events at the Village Hall. It seems meetings of the Council have been scheduled when other clubs or organizations had made previous arrangements to hold meetings. We understand the Brownies, last Friday, were inconvenienced due to a special meeting of the Council. Another time recently the Civic Association was compelled to postpone their regular meeting due to the fact another Council meeting was held the same evening. The scheduling of the

New Permit Fee Regulations for Village

With the adoption at a recent meeting of the Village Council of a change in building, plumbing and electrical permit fees to coincide with those of Fort Lauderdale, The Bulletin publishes the new permit regulations.

Residential building permits based on cubical contents of building. A minimum fee of \$4.00 for 0 to 2,000 cu. ft.; 2,000 to 5,000 cu. ft., \$7.50; 5,000 to 10,000 cu. ft., \$12.00; 10,000 to 20,000 cu. ft., \$20.00 and \$1.00 per thousand cu. ft. thereafter.

Under the former Village permit arrangement, the same type home for a building permit would be \$12 compared to the new method of \$20.

The new commercial building permit rates are as follows: 0 to 2,000 cu. ft., \$5.00; 2,000 to 5,000 cu. ft., \$10.00; 5,000 to 25,000 cu. ft., \$20.00; 25,000 to 50,000 cu. ft., \$30.00; 50,000 to 100,000 cu. ft., \$50.00 and 25¢ per thousand thereafter.

The new set up for electrical is: first 8 outlets \$5.00 each with each additional outlet 50¢, and other outlets at \$5.00. The fee heretofore was a flat \$1.00. The plumbing permits are as follows: septic tank \$2.00, grease trap \$1.00 and others \$1.50. The heretofore fee was a flat \$1.00.

In comparison we submit the Oakland Park permit regulations:

Residential buildings: 2,000 cu. ft. or less \$2.00; 2,000 to 5,000 cu. ft., \$3.50; 5,000 to 10,000 cu. ft., \$6.00; 10,000 to 20,000 cu. ft., \$10.00 and 50¢ per thousand thereafter.

Commercial buildings: 2,000 cu. ft. or less, \$2.50; 2,000 to 5,000 cu. ft., \$5.00; 5,000 to 25,000 cu. ft., \$10.00; 25,000 to 50,000 cu. ft., \$15.00; 50,000 to 100,000 cu. ft., \$25.00; for over 100,000 cu. ft. for each additional thousand cu. ft. 12 1/2¢.

Plumbing permits: \$1.00 per fixture; septic tank \$2.00.

Electrical permits: 1 to 8 outlets \$1.50; next 7 outlets 7c each; next 7 outlets 6c each, all additional outlets after above 5c each.

With the new set up of fees in the Village, a decided increase in revenue is anticipated for the year.

As a reminder—Don't forget to vote on Tuesday, May 6th.

McCarty for Governor Workers Hold Meeting

In various polls conducted in the area for political candidates, Dan McCarty who is running for the gubernatorial office leads all other candidates to date. Mr. McCarty, however, is not slackening his campaign in the least and is continuing his forceful campaign for a sound economical government.

An enthusiastic meeting of Dan McCarty supporters and workers was held last Thursday night at the Broward Hotel when workers from Hallandale to Deerfield Beach were present, reporting on the trend and development of the campaign.

Steve O'Connell, Broward County Campaign Manager for the McCarty forces, was in charge of the meeting and urged all those in attendance to keep up the good work and to get out the vote on May 6th.

Mr. O'Connell pointed out that Dan McCarty is a successful business man with over 20 years experience in the daily management of his farm, citrus and cattle affairs.

As a legislator, Mr. O'Connell stated that McCarty represented his county for 1937, 1939 and 1941 and was unanimously elected as Speaker in 1941, the youngest man in Florida's history. McCarty's record shows his fight for improvement of the school system, unemployment and workmen's compensation insurance and developing all fields of agriculture. He also championed the elimination of the poll tax and slot machines.

In closing his talk, the chairman of the meeting stated that Dan McCarty has gone on record that if elected to office and in so far as the power is vested in him that he shall see that there is no further increase in the tax burden on the people of Florida.
