Predictions for the vote are that less people will go to the polls in the 27th election than cast their bellots on primary day. All candidates have concentrated on getting out the

Water System Progressing Oakland Park Awards Bid

According to Lou Venditti, of Intercounty Construction Corp., construction managers for the Village water distribution system, work on the laying of the water lines is ahead

During the past week, pipe was laid on Sixth Avenue and a goodly portion of Wilton Drive. Mr. Vanditti has commented that he has received splendid cooperation from the Village officials and business houses along the drive, on the matter of parking when their organization was laying the pipe.

It is expected that Oakland Park will begin laying their pipe, to connect with the Wilton Manors line at the bridge on Old Dirie Highway, sometime this week.

A \$7,920 bid submitted by the Crorper Construction Co. of Delray Beach was accepted by the town council recently for construction of a water line to Wilson Manors.

Two higher bids were submitted by Inter-County Construction Co. of Fort Lauderdale (58,544) and the Remoraton Construction Co. of Miami (\$8,280).

According to the contract, installation of the pipeline will start within live days of the signing of the contract and will be completed in 30 days. The ine will be transite pipe conforming with pipe already included in the

The water line will extend south of Oakland Perk from Third St. to the south bank of the north fork at Middle River, a distance of approximately 7,000 feet,


