## Holy Cross Picks Wilton-Oakland Area As Site For New \$2,500,000 Hospital

Hospital care for the people of the Wilton Manors-Oakland Park area will be much closer at hand when the new Holy Cross Hospital is completed, it was revealed this week. Archbishop Joseph P. Hurley of the diocese of St. Augustine announced Monday that Holy Cross Hospital will be erected on a site immediately north of Oakland Park on the west side of Federal highway, at Floranada road. A 22-acre site at that location was acquired for construction of the new hospital.

The Catholic spokesman issued a prepared statement in which he said: "Holy Cross Hospital will be built at a location carefully selected after a thorough study of the present and future needs of the permanent and seasonal residents of Broward County."

"The land along Federal High-

way, at Floranada road, is high and natural. From this excellent vantage point, the hospital will be easily accessible to patients from the extreme northern area of the county as well as to residents in Ft. Lauderdale and communities to the south.

"In the near future, steps will be taken toward the early construction of a facility urgently needed for the health protection of thousands of men, women and children of all creeds throughout the area."

The site for the future hospital was approved by virtually every official contacted within the area.

## New Bike License Tags Go On Sale January 2

License tags which must be displayed on every bicycle owned and operated in Wilton Manors will go on sale at the Wilton Manors Village Hall January 2, according to an announcement by Police Chief Richard Beaney.

Beaney told The Sun that the tags have just been received.

Issuance of the metal tags was authorized by the Village Council in an ordinance adopted recently.

Every bicycle in the Village will have to have one, and mechanical inspections to determine that bikes are in good running condition will be made before a tag is issued.

In addition, a red reflector will be issued with each tag sold, and tags will be clamped to the rear fender of the bike with the reflector-fastener.

Beaney said tags will be sold from 2 until 5 p. m. each Saturday thereafter until further notice.

## Auto License Tags Will Be Sold In Oakland Park

Florida's 1953 automobile license tags will be sold this year in Oakland Park, a fact which will eliminate the necessity for local people to go all the way to the court house in Ft. Lauderdale to get them.

That was announced late Tuesday by Mrs. Elizabeth Tucker, Oakland Park City Clerk.

Mrs. Tucker said the new auto tags will go on sale on January 6 at the city hall.

The arrangement for sale of tags locally was made by Mrs. Tucker with incoming Broward County Tax Collector Herman Meeks, with the approval of the Oakland Park city council.

## Williams, Duncan File For Council In Oakland Park

Interest in the coming Oakland Park city election to fill one city council vacancy mounted this week with the announcement that two new candidates have qualified to seek the office, one of whom was not a candidate in the previous December voting.

A new election January 12 was called following the December balloting because of a mixup over some candidates' qualifications.

Mrs. Elizabeth Tucker, city clerk, announced that Henry Williams, paint and body shop owner, and Lee J. Duncan, operator of O-P Concrete Products, filed the necessary qualifications this week to become candidates for the council post.

Mrs. Tucker also pointed out that January 2 will be the last day for candidates to enter the race, while voters' registration will be permitted until January 7, five days before election.

Williams was a candidate in the December election, but Duncan had not sought office at that time.

Several additional candidates are expected to file before the deadline. And at least one woman, Mrs. Lydia Mann, treasurer of the Oakland Park Woman's Club, will be in the contest.

This column, we know, will be a source of many fine ideas and a lot of entertainment as well.

So you have some TURKEY left the same old creamed turkey and turkey hash don't have any special appeal?

Then try this delicious turkey chow mein—inexpensive and simple to prepare and Oh! so quickly put together!

4 cups celery cut in 1/2 inch lengths

3 cups onions sliced rather thin

2 green peppers cut in good sized pieces

1 cup boiling water

3 tbs soy sauce

Salt to taste

3 cups "very thick" turkey gravy

2 cups (or more) turkey

1 small can pimentos

almonds

2 cans chow mein noodles

Add celery, green peppers, onions and soy sauce to boiling water, in covered sauce pan. Boil for about eight minutes, but do

not overcook vegetables—they must retain some of their original crispness!

Add gravy and cut-up turkey, and heat thoroughly. Combine with vegetable mixture, add chopped pimentos, handful of almonds for that festive air.

Serve on a bed of pre-heated chow mein noodles.

Pass additional soy sauce and hot tea, of course!
