These folks, through hard work and persistence and patience, built over a period of years a house to live in, and they stocked it with goods.

Last Sunday night in a matter of a few minutes fire destroyed it all.

Now, we haven't asked the permission of these people to try to do something to help them start anew but that should not be necessary.

HUNGARIAN BEEF STEW

- 2 lbs. stew meat
- 14 cup flour
- 3 tbs shortening
- 1 clove garlic
- 2 good sized onions
- 1 tbs parsley
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- Roll cut up beef in flour.

Melt shortening in heavy frying pan. Add crushed garlic and cook three minutes. Discard garlic. Put beef in hot skillet and when the meat starts to brown, add chopped onions. Keep moving mixture around, taking care not to burn. When onions turn golden, add four cups of boiling water, parsley and salt and pepper. Cover. Simmer until meat is tender and liquid boiled down to about two cups. Add sour cream, shake skillet a few times, and heat for two or three minutes and serve.
