## Our Own Homogenized

### Hot Air

The trouble with this country today is that there are too many wide-open spaces—entirely surrounded by teeth.

Here are two little stories for contrast. And what contrast. Story No. 1: Some incredible tramp stole one of the containers for the Tappan Fire Fund from Williams Pharmacy in Wilton Manors this week. This is the fund for the folks in Prospect Gardens who lost everything they owned in a fire several weeks ago.



Story No. 2: Recently word got around about a mother living in a Ft. Lauderdale housing project with practically no furniture and little to feed two children; a no-good husband had reportedly "sold" a third child, a baby, and disappeared; there were other pitiful circumstances, too. What furniture there was reportedly had been repossessed. Mrs. Fannie Israel of the County welfare organization located the baby, finally.

She saw that the baby was placed in a foster home to receive proper care. Mrs. Florence Campbell of West Ocean Blvd., Oakland Park, has been caring for the other children. And Mrs. Campbell notified us that Elmer Elfers of Wilton Manors Furniture has given the family an entire living room suite—a davenport convertible to double bed, rugs, coffee table, two occasional chairs, two lamps, two end tables—and advised that if they need anything else, holler.

We see Elfers every day, but he didn't tell us about this little matter. Which is more reason why we wanted to tell you.

Tomorrow night (Friday), a chance to find out just what this "annexation" business is all about, when Rep. Ted David and Village Counsel Bill Miller explain it to Manors Civic Assn. at Village Hall, 8 p. m. There are many points of interest in this affair, and clearing them up points to better understanding of local government.

Not only could the Legislature annex Wilton Manors or Oakland Park to Ft. Lauderdale; it could annex Ft. Lauderdale to us; or to Miami; or abolish Miami as a city; or any other town. Probably wouldn't, but could.

The Legislature once abolished Daytona Beach, reincorporated it three hours later and appointed a new bunch of city officials, all to get rid of the old officials. The courts upset that little appercart, calling it an improper exercise of powers, but wou see what the Legislature can do if it wants to. In that deal, of course, it was a case of one faction versus another, with one wielding power in Legislature.

The difference between present Wilton Manors incorporation (under state's general laws) and formal charter is the same difference between a ready-made suit and a custom-tailored suit. We now operate under whatever statutes the state has in operation for such communities. A new charter would be tailored to fit our needs. Most officials seem to favor new charter. The question is whether there's time to get one ready this year. Some old timers, notably former Mayor Dave Turner, have been for for it for a long while.

Mrs. H. C. Dew was elected president of the Oakland Park Woman's Club Wednesday afternoon to succeed Mrs. Harry K. Powell, who is retiring as president.

A covered dish luncheon featured the election meeting, attended by a large number of members and several guests.

Mrs. Harrison Mann, who held the post of treasurer, was named first vice president; Mrs. Charles Krassy was reelected second vice president and Mrs. Ward Crandall was reelected corresponding secretary.

Installation of new officers will take place April 8.

The terms of office of Mrs. Albert Christensen, recording secretary, and Mrs. W. E. Smith, financial secretary, have another year to run.

The post of treasurer, left vacant by the election of Mrs. Mann to the first vice presidency, will be filled by the executive committee of the Woman's Club.

### PLANNING BOARD RECOMMENDS CHARTER; MAYOR-COUNCIL GOVERNMENT PROBABLE

Wilton Manors advisory planning board will recommend to the Village Council that the Florida legislature be asked to approve a local bill granting a municipal charter to the Village. The charter would grant powers to the Council geared to the needs of the community, and at the same time would define the limitations of the Council's authorities.

The planning board's recommendation was decided upon last Friday night. There was some talk of a city manager-type of local government, but in the end the board recommended a mayor-council form of operation, with the mayor to be given limited powers similar to those a city manager would require to make decisions and keep the municipal wheels in motion.

It remains a possibility that a two-year delay in applying for charter might be decided upon. But the desire of most officials seems to be that such a bill be passed this year, if a charter act can be drawn in time. (See "Hot Air," this page, for further details).

### ZONING HEARING IS DELAYED BY BOARD

A continued public hearing on the proposed rezoning of certain lots owned by J. N. and J. M. McJunkin will not be concluded next Tuesday as had been scheduled by the Wilton Manors Village Council.

Clerk Marcia Stafford said the date for winding up the hearing probably will be set at Tuesday night's regular meeting of the Council and will be advertised for benefit of persons interested.

The property involved consists of lots behind present commercial buildings on the south side of the 2100 block of Wilton Drive. The McJunkin interests seek to have the lots zoned for business but some objections have been raised.

Council is studying the proposal, and there are some indications the rezoning will be approved. There also are signs that additional property now zoned for residence may be re-designated for business.

### OAKLAND PARK DOG OWNERS GET FINAL POLICE NOTICE

"Last and final warning" was issued this week by Oakland Park Police Chief J. M. Barnhill to dog owners whose pets have not yet been equipped with new license tags.

Barnhill pointed out that the legal deadline for purchase of new tags came and went more than a month ago. And he said stray dogs without tags will be picked up and held by authorities beginning next Monday "without further delay."

"We don't want to work any hardship on anybody, but the period of grace has been extended just as long as we can extend it," the chief added.

### STATE LEGISLATOR, VILLAGE ATTORNEY TO EXPLAIN ABOUT "ANNEXATION"

A complete explanation of what is involved in current rumors that Ft. Lauderdale might try to make over Wilton Manors for annexation is scheduled this Friday at 8 p. m. when State Rep. Ted David and Village Attorney William G. Miller Jr. attend a meeting of the Wilton Manors Civic Association at the Village Hall. The association's regular meeting set for last Monday was postponed five days to arrange for the special discussion.

State Rep. John Burwell, who had hoped to attend, was called out of town.

David, however, said he definitely will be present.

Last week, Miller and Council President Earle Middleton appeared before David and Burwell at a pre-legislative hearing to notify the legislators Wilton Manors has no desire to be a part of Ft. Lauderdale and to discuss the possibility that the Village may ask for an act formal charter in this year's session of the Legislature.

A big turnout seems certain for the association meeting.

1 tbsp baking powder  
Beat yolks and sugar. Sift flour and baking powder together. Add flour, nuts and dates to egg and sugar mixture, a little at a time; then add vanilla and beaten egg whites. If mixture is too stiff, add another beaten egg white. Pour into square pan which has been greased and floured.

Bake 45 minutes in a 300 degree oven. While still a little warm, cut in strips and roll in powdered sugar.

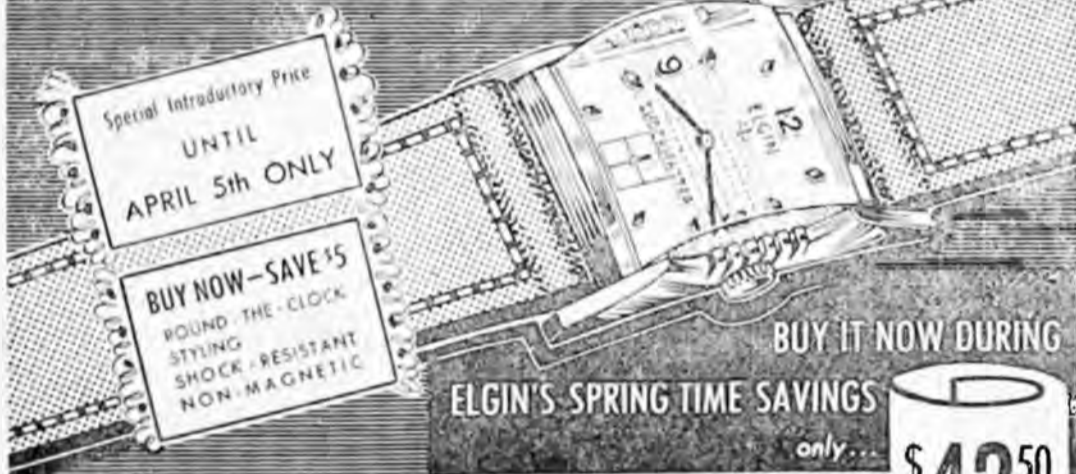

**Police Enjoy Big Week In Stolen Goods Dept.**

Wilton Manors police last week recovered a substantial batch of stolen articles, topped off by the recovery of an automobile owned by a used car dealer who lives only a few hundred feet from the point where the car was abandoned by the thief.

Patrolman Bob Hickman spotted the 1952 Pontiac abandoned in a grocery store's parking lot about 4 a. m. Saturday. The auto was minus one wheel, a radio and other equipment.

It was found to have been stolen from Stewart's used cars, 300 East Sunrise Blvd. Gordon E. Stewart, owner of the firm and a resident of Wilton Manors, lives only about 300 feet from the store in whose lot the auto was abandoned.
