Worm Causes Disease Which Often Attacks Plants About Holiday Time

THE CAUSE OF ROOT-KNOT

This is the time of year when most people are looking to their plants for Christmas color and beauty. And just when things are going right the plant seems to yellow off, cease growing or just die prematurely. Poinsettias, in particular, are subject to this disease most people call root knot.

Root Knot derives its name from the large, irregular, swollen, knot- soil from plant to plant, but the Park. ted appearance of the roots of affected plants. Do not confuse root capable of little or no motion. knot with the nodules of nitrogen fixing bacteria which grow on the roots of legumes and a few other plants. (Seldom will you find the nitrogen nodules in the home garden.)

However, you may easily determine which is the good and which is the bad. Nodules are usually smaller and on any given plant are uniform in size and shape. Also they are attached loosely to the root and may be pulled off easily. The galls of root knot-infected greatly in size and shape.


