REGISTRATION REPORT REVIEWED

Mrs. Noonan gave a report of the finances of the Recreation Dept. at the Council meeting of Oct. 27.

Cash on hand at present amounts to \$140.23. Receipts showed \$702 as collected from the Booster Drive; \$237 miscellaneous donations and \$79 as profit from dances or a total of \$1018.29. Expenditures shows \$1005.79 for concrete slab at new park and for playground equipment. Mrs. Joe Rogers tendered her resignation as Publicity chairman. The Council withheld a new appointee for the present.

Recreation Director Libby was told that the Council would appropriate \$150.00 for a fall and winter program.

Building Inspector Morey requested an ordinance to be drawn cancelling permits six months after issue if a building is not started.

A hearing for rezoning property in 26th street block, south of Old Dixie was turned down by the Council. The request was for B1 zoning.

UTILITY TAX ORDINANCE DELAYED

Due to objections from the public the Utility tax ordinance was put off until the new Council tax office. The proposed ordinance covers water, electricity, phone and bottled gas.

The same election board will serve as heretofore with the exception of Mrs. L.L.



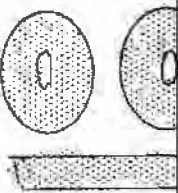

"The Soviet Version"

I, the son of the toiling people, and a citizen of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, assume the duties of a fighter in the Worker's and Peasant's Army. Before the working class of the U.S.S.R. and of the whole world, I promise to bear this title with honor, conscientiously to study the profession of arms and to guard like the apple of my eye the national and military property from damage and theft.
