RICHARDSON HIGH FOR WILTON MANORS COUNCIL MIDDLETON SECOND

Big interest by registered voters of Wilton Manors was shown in choosing two councilmen from a list of seven candidates. Out of about seven hundred persons registered to vote in Wilton Manors election, 511 cast their ballot. The lowest man on the list was only 50 votes away from election to the council. If every one of the 511 voters had cast a vote for two of their choice, 1022 would be the total votes counted. The total shows 972 votes counted for the seven candidates, including 2 cast for write-ins (C Leaver and Mr. Gallup) This shows that a large number of persons voted for only one candidate. The count is as listed below:

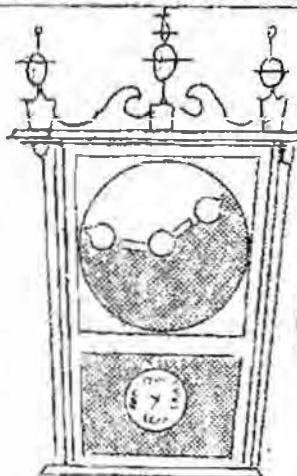
While in New Jersey Mrs. Saxer attended the christening of her new grandnephew Charles Alfred Mason.

"Get Out The Vote" was the general Theme of a coffee held at the Tropical Club Tuesday, Nov. 2, at 10 PM. For the Wilton Manors Club Community Service program. The principal speaker was Mrs. George F. Young a member of the League of Women Voters and Trustee on the Broward County School Board, who spoke briefly on "Your Place in Self Government". She urged all women to take advantage of their privilege to vote and cited the tremendous things that can be accomplished if women will take their place at the polls. She informed the group that the League supports only the legislation thoroughly studied by its members and endorses no candidates. A copy of the proposed amendments to the Florida Constitution approved by the 1954 legislature and proposed by the League was passed out to the members for study before voting at the general election Nov. 2, 1954.

Reports were made by Mrs. I. Johnston, who was a delegate to the District 11 meeting in Miami and Mrs. J. Mullock, who attended the Broward County Federation meeting in Hollywood.

Ways and Means Chairman, Mrs. A. Hagen, gave the calendar of coming events for the month of Nov. and reported on the receipts of the Bake Sale held on Oct. 30, 1954.

Mrs. C. Saxer asked for volunteers to help on the committee for the rummage sale. Mrs. Dunton, Mrs. Caro, Mrs. Morey, Mrs. Mullock responded.

POLICE DEPT. NOTES

Last week was a busy one for the Police Dept. The court docket included everything from drunk driving to assault and battery. Several minor accidents were investigated with one major accident on Old Dixie Hwy. which resulted in \$500. damage and one person treated at North Broward General Hospital. One sudden death was investigated and ruled to be natural. Several dog bite cases were reported and owners instructed to place each errant dog under observation for a period of two weeks. Several cases of theft from buildings under construction are presently under investigation.

Graduation for the Wilton Manors Police School took place at a dinner at the Tropical Club. Sgt. Lynch co-ordinator of the school issued diplomas to men of several Broward Police Depts. including Oakland Park, Deerfield Beach and Dania. Lynch stated that hitch hiking is illegal and strict enforcement is being practiced.
