WORLD'S LARGEST COLLECTION OF INDIAN HEAD PENNIES



Warren P. Ruth's enormous collection of Indian head pennies is one reason they are scarce. Collectors like Ruth have salted them away. And any penny that Ruth lays his hands on is worth considerably more than one cent.

The other day he loaded a wheelbarrow with 90,480 pennies, weighing 580 lbs. and worth approximately \$9,000, just to have his picture taken.

All of these pennies were of common dates - that is, they were turned out in years when lots of pennies were minted. Collectors pay for them, depending on their condition.

Not included in the wheelbarrow load were his choice coins, a few minted in 1856 and in San Francisco in 1909.

A collector will pay up to \$180 for an 1856 penny and as much as \$42.50 for an uncirculated one minted in San Francisco in 1909. A penny made in San Francisco in 1909 is stamped 1909-S. Most Indian head pennies were minted at the Philadelphia mint.

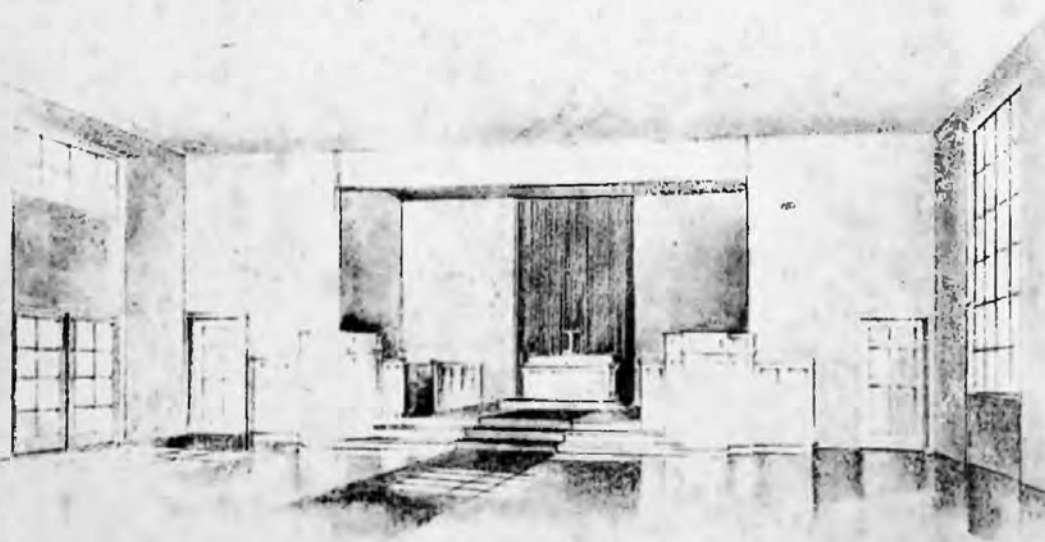
The Government made Indian head pennies from 1856 thru 1909. Ruth has four complete sets, representing all of those years, and each coin is in good shape. He hesitates to say how much each set is worth.

Ruth isn't just penny-wise. He has collections of other coins minted in this and in other countries. He says it's an educational hobby. You get to learn a lot of history. He has owned and exhibited a \$10,000 bill.

He started collecting when he was 17. He found an old baking powder can in his family's cellar filled with old coins, and appropriated it. It was his father's collection. The elder Ruth was annoyed when he couldn't find it, but when his son admitted he took it he let him keep it.

He was a painter and decorating contractor in Reading and he'd paint a house in exchange for a collection of coins. He helped organize the Reading Coin Club and used to speak on the radio every year during National Coin Week.

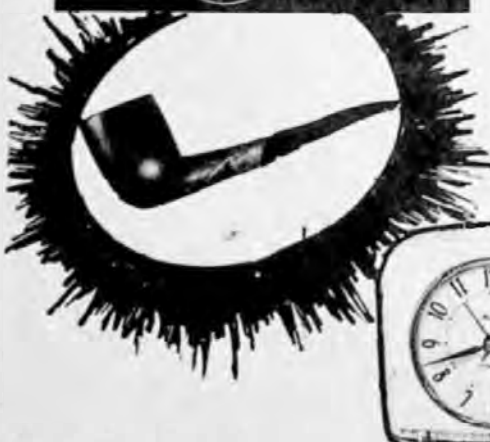
