## PROGRESS SHOWN IN WILTON MANORS

### Highlights '55

**JANUARY...**More lighting requested for Wilton Drive by the business group. Results - five times as much light by doubling number of lamps and increasing power.

**FEBRUARY...**Council rejects only bid on city hall construction as being too high (\$86,000.). New organization formed, Wilton Manors Sports, Inc. Lamar Braddy elected president. Aim - building a baseball field and stadium for kids. \$50.00 plate dinner raised enough funds to start construction on stadium. Large amount of labor and material donated.

**MARCH...**Lions club organized in Wilton Manors. Clayton Leaver elected president.

**APRIL...**Construction of four lane road completed on Wilton Drive. Plans made by Business Ass'n. and clubs for fiesta celebrating opening on May 7th....Wilton Manors National Bank opened. Held reception April 28th....City took collection of garbage fee, 10% of collections to be paid as compensation to the city by Lasser Waste Service....Jr. Woman's club formed, Mrs. John Loos elected president....Ground-breaking ceremonies for Women's Club House held during the month.

**MAY...**Mayor Perry Mickel gave \$1.00 per year lease for 5 years to Wilton Manors Sports, Inc. on 2½ acres land with option to purchase for \$15,000. at end of lease.

**JUNE...**Recreation building completed at Hagen Park. Cost - \$4,000. Grand opening held June 18th. Tennis courts constructed.

**JULY...**First wing of stadium and baseball playing field completed. 700 see little league baseball games at big 4th July celebration sponsored by Wilton Manors Sports, Inc. Highlighted by visit of baseball's 'Hall of Fame' Jimmy Foxx.

**AUGUST...**Public hearing on proposed utility tax large gathering of consumers voiced strenuous objections....Middle River Development Co. withdrew offer to donate a piece of property on 26th St. as site for new city hall.

**SEPTEMBER...**JC Club sponsored the sale of driver's licenses as a community project and started safety program....Council voted to put ad valorem tax referendum before freeholder voters of Wilton Manors....Kiwanis Club sponsored the 'Kid's Day' at Mickel Field.

**OCTOBER...**JC's promoted 'Get Out The Vote' for November election....McJunkin property on Wilton Drive leased - shopping center slated.

**NOVEMBER...**Optimist Club organized. Foster McCarl, Sr. elected president....Wilton Manors Civic Association sponsored political rally.... Frank Starling elected Mayor of Wilton Manors by seven votes over Attorney Geo. Richardson, Jr....AdValorem tax went over with a bang, better than 2 to 1 freeholders voted for taxes.... Safety Drive Day 'SD DAY' sponsored by local JC Club. Wilton Manors free of accidents for the day.

## POLITICAL, BUSINESS, FINANCIAL - WHAT WILL 1956 BRING?

### WILL EISENHOWER RUN?

The President says he feels fine. But he has not made up his own mind to run and will not until late in January. Reason is that it takes 4 months to show whether his heart is enlarged. He will make no decision until he knows.

### TAXES CUT?

Eisenhower & the treasury Department may be reluctant on tax cutting, budget balancing is a worry - plus business booming, and efforts being made to restrain inflationary trends, but most people thinking along these lines are not running for office in the next election; the voting is done by legislators who are and tax cuts mean votes.

Wage earners may benefit from a cut effective in the middle of the year.

### FARMERS INCOME?

Congress will insist on higher support prices with direct payment to farmers of the difference between what they get for produce and what the Gov't formula says it is worth - 'Farmers Vote Also!'

**FEDERAL AID TO EDUCATION**  
Negro Integration in the South will be a stumbling block. A bill may get through Congress but will have plenty of trouble.

**HOUSING FOR OLD FOLKS?**  
Older persons have trouble borrowing on good terms, now FHA is working on a plan to help them buy a home if some third person guarantees, son or daughter will be preferred but anyone might be acceptable, - this would tend toward safer loan.

### BIG BUSINESS:

Auto manufacturers will push for high output and high sales 'til the middle of the year. Plans are to equal 1955 record, and maybe top it. A heavy pressure will be on the dealers - big advertising programs will be undertaken..

DECEMBER...Police Dept. sponsored Bicycle Safety Week. Kiwanis club and Wilton Sunrise news gave prizes to help promote. Optimist club made plans for organizing bicycle club.....Business Group sponsored Christmas Lighting Decoration contest for homes.....\$150,000 water bonds validated.

### SUMMARY:

1516 water meters are installed in the city of Dec. 31, 1955 as compared to 328 meters installed when system was completed in 1952.

DURING 1955: - 144 million gallons of water was used in Wilton Manors. Seven new subdivisions adding 600 lots were platted during the year. Four hundred new homes were built at an estimated value of 4 million three hundred thousand dollars.....2 1/2 miles more of streets were added making a total of 32 1/2 miles in the city.

CONTINUED GROWTH IN 1956.....IF...construction money becomes more plentiful after January and the Gov't. indicates it will take restraint off, the building of homes in Wilton Manors will continue at close to 1955 rate, at least 'til the middle of the year.

Another wing may be added to Wilton Manors elementary school this year; plans may include a cafeteria.

Thru a fund raising scheme now in the planning stage, Wilton Manors Sports, Inc. hopes to have the necessary money to light the baseball field and make other improvements.
