## INK SPILLED BY THE EDITOR

Millions of words have been written and spoken about integration in the past few months, expressing opinions and ideas by the hundreds. Our thinking is that only a handful of persons are responsible for the local agitation in regard to use of all public facilities by colored people.

It is evident all of us have been "eating high on the hawg". When we look around and see record breaking new home construction, both in white and colored neighborhoods, see the extremely large number of autos driven by both races, take notice of the well fed appearance of all, we cannot help but feel that the majority of the colored citizens are satisfied with the tremendous economical progress made by their race in the past few years.

That tourist money is responsible by the largest percentage for the good economical conditions in Southeast Florida is undeniable. If there were no tourist business, it is extremely doubtful that this part of Florida would have the fine beach facilities, the beautiful golf courses, parks, etc. By the same line of reasoning, the colored people's economical conditions would not be at the high it is today.

Construction, with its demand for labor at an all-time high pay along with the jobs created in Services, Stores, Restaurants, Hotels and Homes by the influx of tourist money, is giving the colored race advantages today that it never had before.

It's not been too long in the past that most colored folks depended on farming for their living, and now the labor market is such that labor has to be imported to supplement farm help.

It's unthinkable that the majority of colored people would insist on integration at the beaches, etc. (No question at all, they should have equal facilities). They must know that the pleasure seeking tourists with the pocket full of money who helps keep us going, can, by choice, spend their money at some other place where integration is not a problem, thus depriving all of us, our good economical condition. This would indeed be cutting off the nose to spite the face.

Average home owners of both races pay very little money in the form of real estate tax, due to the homestead exemption law. However, the large hotel and business places do pay high taxes. Part of that tax is spent in a manner to attract and keep the money spending tourist coming here.

School facilities in white areas are tremendously inadequate due to the rapid influx of population from other places. School officials have been furnishing facilities for both colored and white to the best of their ability.

Colored leaders should educate their race to continually better their economical condition, rather than incite them into believing that mixing with whites is desirable. Integration at public facilities will not give any economical gain to the colored; rather it will retard that which is most desirable in life, Social Security, (Social, as defined in Webster's, pertaining to men as living in association with one another - - Security, state or quality of being safe or protected, freedom from fear, danger, or anxiety).
