Miss Heilman is a graduate of the National College of Education. Cont. page 2



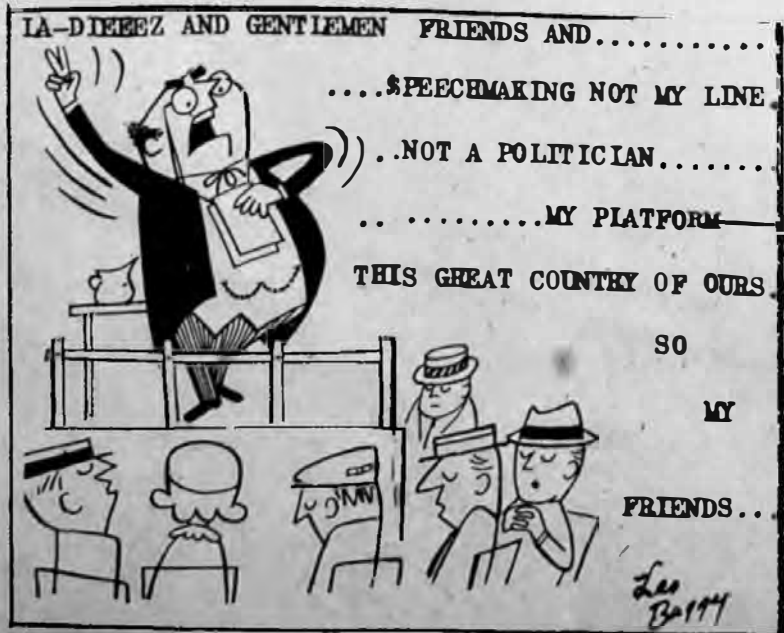
TRAFFIC DEATH TRAP - INTERSECTION AT NORTH ANDREWS & OCEAN BLVD.

A dark night, a strange driver on the road, coming suddenly upon this apparent end of the road at this point, could easily be the cause of disaster for the occupants of an auto, by going over into the canal.

Traveling east on Ocean Blvd. you suddenly come to a dead end at North Andrews Ave., where, to continue east, you must make a sharp turn to the left, then to the right over a narrow rickety bridge across the north fork of Middle River. There are no signs on the road to warn the driver of this dangerous situation and there is no barricade in front of a drop of many feet into the canal, to bring the danger to the drivers attention.

This condition has existed for a long time, and with travel becoming heavy on Ocean Blvd. it is high time the County eased this danger point, along with several others around the County.

One mile west of Andrews Ave. on ocean Blvd. was the scene of death recently when an auto plunged into the canal at the hazardous Seaboard Railway Crossing.
