

INK SPILLED BY THE EDITOR

STRIP ZONING

Inability of zoning authorities to grasp the enormous change in habits of the present day shopper, has in the past few years, and still is, creating strip business zoning, detrimental not only to surrounding properties, but also to business in general.

Pressure groups, composed of land owners, developers and promoters, take advantage of the zoning authorities lack of conception of what the automobile has accomplished in changing habits of the shopper.

The old time neighborhood stores, up on the main street of the community, which drew shoppers from all the surrounding area within walking distance, has become a dead dodo since the family car has become such an important part of every day life. At one time a business street, many blocks long, with highly developed home areas blocks deep on each side, with the customers walking in, did a thriving business. But buyers of today, adverse to walking, jump into the family car to shop, even for small items. A few blocks away is the shopping strip, but with the few available parking facilities already in use, the buyer heads for the nearest shopping center where the car can be parked within a few steps of the counter.

Although shopping centers with plenty of parking are becoming plentiful to the extent of creating keen competition, zoning authorities continue to zone strips which not only continue for blocks, but are fast becoming miles of this kind of commercial property. Results will be a repetition of each type of business every few blocks.

As each merchant learns "That Ends Don't Meet", he looks around for a buyer. Sure, he'll find one, until a time of short money, when the landlord, in order to save his investment will be willing to rent for warehousing and services which will deteriorate the surrounding property values.

Southeast Florida is becoming one of the most outstanding examples of strip zoning, and Wilton Manors is keeping pace with the prevailing indiscrimination. The west side of Wilton Drive has a narrow strip zoned for business from the River on the south to Dixie Hwy. on the other end, offering very little parking. The east side of the Drive is zoned at various depths up to 400 feet deep; but aside from a few business houses on the south end, advantage has not been taken for utilizing the favorable zoning for This holds true also of plans for a new so-called shopping center, the plans calling for use of only 250 feet which will in effect still be little better than strip business.

North Andrews Ave. is now zoned business for approximately 50% its length through Wilton Depth of the B-1 zoning is up to 300 Manors. ft. deep. Aside from a Chain Food Store existing building plans call the most part, for less than 1 to 1 parking

Old Dixie Highway north of Wilton Drive affords only a depth suitable for strip zoning, and indications point to request for the south end of Dixie to be zoned likewise.


BLOOMING BLOOMER




