Mrs. Widman announced that her theme for the coming year will be "Community Service, a Teenage and Pre-school Program". This will be

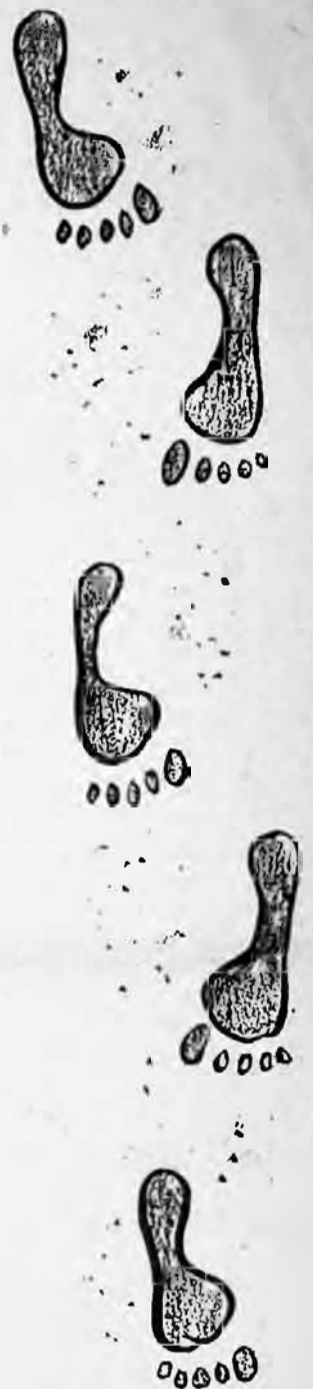
