FEEDER ROAD FOR INTRAMA.

CCIA WANTS ROAD 9 COMPLETED

Rumors of the State Road Board's intention to place the route of a proposed feeder road, sometimes called the Intrama Route, through a residential neighborhood in Hollywood, brought objections from a Hollywood delegation into the Monday evening meeting of the C. C. I. A.

Rumors that the northern terminus of the route would connect at the fork of North Andrews and Federal Highway, brought a motion for the organization to go on record as opposing the route as apparently planned by the State Road Board. A committee was appointed. It was recommended that the completion of Route 9 should act as a feeder into the Intrama Route.

The C. C. I. A. will ask for the proposed budgets of the county, hospital, and school boards so a study can be made of the same.

Broadview Park asks for assistance in combating the dangerous situation of Marine planes practicing landing tactics in their neighborhood. It was pointed out that a school would be built in the area soon.

Riverland Road delegation reported progress of their organization in preparing the path for legislation giving control by the Railway Commission over private water and sewer companies. The C. C. I. A. voted to carry the ball and a suggestion was made to include gas companies.

Also on record is a recommendation that 3rd and 4th Avenues and Federal Highway be considered for one way streets to relieve congested traffic conditions through Fort Lauderdale.

No additional right-of-way is needed to complete 3rd and 4th Avenues as a one-way route along with Federal Highway. If traffic conditions are relieved on Federal by using 3rd and 4th Avenues as one way, Federal and State funds would be available for construction.

SUMMER RECREATION PROGRAM READY

Registration, Monday, June 18th, at Hagen Park will kick off what is expected to be the busiest Summer Recreation Program ever for Wilton Manors.

Facilities to be used include Hagen Park where specialized instructors will give instructions in archery, arts and crafts, bowling, badminton, tennis, shuffleboard, table tennis, tetherball, softball and many other table and organized games.

Many new pieces of play ground equipment and fence now being installed at Hagen Park, it is hoped, will be ready soon after Registration Day.

Mickel Field will be headquarters for baseball, softball, physical fitness and track and field activities.

Wilton Manors School grounds will be used for basketball, tetherball, postball, kickball, baseball and softball, etc. in the Athletic Activities. The playground equipment which includes slides, towers, revolving platforms and many other items will

Wilton Manors City Charter

CONTAINS FIRST 20 OF 46 PARAGRAPHS

ARTICLE II

GENERAL MUNICIPAL POWERS

Section 1: The Council within the limitations of this Act shall have the power by ordinance:

1st To levy and collect taxes on all property, privileges and professions taxable by law for State purposes. The occupational license taxes to be levied and imposed by the City of Wilton Manors upon professions and privileges taxable under the laws of the State of Florida shall be the same amounts as fixed by the Florida laws, except however, the City Council may change the amounts of occupational licenses by ordinance from time to time.

2nd To make their own valuation for the purposes of municipal taxation, independent of the State and County valuations.

3rd To appropriate money for the payment of debts and the expenses of the town.

4th To make regulations to prevent the introduction and spread of infectious and contagious diseases into the City and to make quarantine laws for the purpose and to enforce the same within five miles of the City limits when the same are not in conflict with the quarantine

laws and regulations of the State or of the
 United States; provided that this jurisdiction
 shall not extend over the territory of any
 other municipality.

5th To establish hospitals, jails, houses of
 detention and correction and to make regula-
 tions for the government thereof.

6th To make rules and regulations to secure
 the general health of the inhabitants and to
 prevent and remove nuisances, whether affecting
 the health or morals of the community or other-
 wise wrongful.

7th To fill in all low ground in the City and
 to compel the owners of low ground in the City
 to fill the same up to an established grade so
 as to prevent the breeding of mosquitoes or the
 spread of disease.

8th To compel owners of land or riparian
 rights within the City to remove therefrom all
 brush, weeds, obnoxious growth of any kind,
 filth, garbage, trash, debris, decayed build-
 ings, ruins of any kind and buildings or docks
 in a falling or dangerous condition.

9th To provide the City with a supply of water
 for public purposes and to sell the same to
 private individuals for profit, by waterworks
 to be within or beyond the boundaries of the
 City, and for that purpose to acquire, build,
 construct or lease or permit others to acquire,
 build, construct or lease waterworks and a

water system, and to dig artesian wells. The City Council may contract with other municipalities or private individuals for the supply of water to be furnished the inhabitants and citizens of the City of Wilton Manors whose water plants, or facilities for furnishing water may be outside the City limits. The City Council may also grant a license and privilege to any person, firm, corporation or municipality to use its streets, alleys, and ways for water mains, fire hydrants, and each other water distribution system as is necessary for the serving of the inhabitants and citizens of the City with water and fire protection.

10th To provide for the prevention and extinguishment of fires and to organize and establish fire departments. The City Council may contract with other Fire Departments, located beyond its limits, for its services in providing the inhabitants and citizens of the City of Wilton Manors with fire protection, and is authorized to pay a reasonable sum for the services of said Fire Department or Departments.

11th To provide for lighting of the City by electricity, gas or other illuminating material and to sell gas or electricity to others for profit, within or beyond the boundaries of the municipality.

12th To authorize and make appropriations to alter, open, extend, abolish, widen, establish, grade, pave or otherwise improve, clean and keep in repair bridges, culverts, sewers, gutters, groins, jetties and seawalls.

13th To make appropriations for lighting the streets and public buildings and for the erection and maintenance of all buildings necessary to the use of the City.

14th To license, tax, and regulate auctioneers, tavern keepers, peddlers and all other privileges taxable by the State. The occupational license tax to be charged businesses and professions taxable by the State of Florida, shall be taxable by the City of Wilton Manors, and the amount of said occupational license tax shall be the same as that charged by the State of Florida, under the General Statutes of the State, however, the City Council may change the amounts of the license taxes by ordinance.

15th To license, tax and regulate carriages, wheel chairs, cars, vehicles, motors, omnibuses, wagons and drays, and to fix the rate to be charged for the carriage of persons and property within the City limits and to the public works and property without the City limits.

16th To regulate and license any theatrical or other exhibition, show, circus, parade, athletic or other amusement; and to license and tax any other business, occupation or professions, without regard to the amount of State license tax and without regard to whether the State shall license the same or not.

17th To prohibit and suppress gambling houses, bawdy houses and disorderly houses and any show, circus, exhibition or any amusement contrary to good morals and also to any and all obscene pictures and literature.

18th To regulate, restrain and prevent the carrying on of manufactories of a nature tending to increase or produce filth or offensive noises and to restrain any person or corporation from polluting the soil, streets, sewers, or streams of water within the city limits.

19th To license or prohibit the sale of fire-arms; to regulate the storage of tar, pitch, rosin, saltpeter, gun-cotton, kerosene, gasoline, oils and all other combustibles, explosives and inflammable material and the use of lights, candles, lamps, electric wires and steam pipes in dwellings, stables, shops and all other places.

20th To regulate or suppress the sale of fire-works, toys, pistols or guns, slingshots and similar articles.
