State Road Board Chairman Wilbur E. Jones will meet today with the members of Hollywood City Commission to hear their opinion of the proposed Route of Interama road thru a residential section of Hollywood.

Hollywood Organizations have strenuously objected to the proposed route. Central Committee of Improvement Associations went on record at their last meeting to give Hollywood objectors support, and recommend State Rd. 9 as a feeder road for Interama.

The Road Board proposal would place Interama Road along 13th and 14th Avenues thru one of Hollywood's residential neighborhoods.

Wilton Manors City Charter

LAST 6 PARAGRAPHS OF ARTICLE II SEC. 1

41st To borrow money, issue warrants, bonds and certificates of the City within the limits as hereinafter set out, for the organization and maintenance of the City government and for necessary municipal purposes such as water, fire protection, sanitation, police protection and other necessary municipal expenses, provided however, that no money thus secured shall be used to construct, purchase or operate projects or businesses in competition with existing projects or businesses.

42nd To collect tax on the sale of cigarettes as provided for under the General Laws of the State of Florida.

43rd To impose and collect a tax on the services of utilities.

44th To regulate by ordinance aviation over said City.

45th To regulate by ordinance the speed of railroad trains passing through said City.

46th To purchase insurance contracts to protect its property against loss by fire, wind-storm, extended coverage, and to also purchase contracts of insurance to protect the municipality against public liability.

'Gog' Suspense Story Of Space Villains

(Prepared Review)

The time when man will first es-
tablish a space station from which
interplanetary missiles or ships
might be launched has, often been
speculated by scientific and govern-
ment circles, and now is the subject
of an exciting film called "Gog."

It is evident that Pro-
ducer Ivan Tors, who through re-
search and general interest, has be-
come an authority on the subject,
thinks that the great feat might be
accomplished in as short a time as
five years from now.

The suspense-packed story of the
picture, which was photographed in
brilliant Eastman color concerns the
attempts of a group of enemy agents
intent on sabotaging a government
plan to launch a space platform.
They do this by creating a robot,
"Gog," whose death-rays are directed
at the country's top scientists.

Richard Egan plays the role of
a scientist called in by the authori-

ties to track down the enemy agents.
Constance Dowling is co-starred as
Egan's guide, and Herbert Marshall
is cast as the scientist in charge of
the space station installation. Ivan
Tors, who produced the picture, also
wrote the story, which was adapted
for the screen by Tom Taggart.
Herbert L. Strock directed the taut
adventure story of interstellar con-
flict.

No Gravity

One of the many actual new won-
ders of science presented in "Gog,"
is an "anti-gravity cham-
ber," reproducing the "weightless"
conditions that prevail in outer
space. In the picture, filmed in East-
man color, two women and a man
are actually shown in the anti-
gravity chamber, weightless and
floating in mid-air.

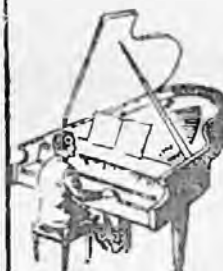
