

Wilton Manors City Charter

LAST 6 PARAGRAPHS OF ARTICLE II SEC. 1

41st To borrow money, issue warrants, bonds and certificates of the City within the limits as hereinafter set out, for the organization and maintenance of the City government and for necessary municipal purposes such as water, fire protection, sanitation, police protection and other necessary municipal expenses, provided however, that no money thus secured shall be used to construct, purchase or operate projects or businesses in competition with existing projects or businesses.

42nd To collect tax on the sale of cigarettes as provided for under the General Laws of the State of Florida.

43rd To impose and collect a tax on the services of utilities.

44th To regulate by ordinance aviation over said City.

45th To regulate by ordinance the speed of railroad trains passing through said City.

46th To purchase insurance contracts to protect its property against loss by fire, windstorm, extended coverage, and to also purchase contracts of insurance to protect the municipality against public liability. TO BE CONTINUED NEXT WEEK
