DETOUR SIGN LEAVES MOTORIST ENROUTE TO WILTON MANORS CONFUSED

Placed on N. E. 4th Ave., the site of installation of surface drainage sewers, the Detour Sign fails to direct Wilton Manors traffic on how to get there. There are no other directional signs after one takes a choice of direction to go (Sign indicates to detour East or West). Best Route into Wilton Manors Business Center is to turn left to Andrews Ave., then right on Andrews to the north end of Richardson's Golf Course (N. E. 21st Ct.) - turn right to Business Section.

Wilton Manors City Charter

ARTICLE III

GOVERNMENT

Section 1: Except as otherwise provided in this Act, the government of the City of Wilton Manors shall be vested in a Mayor, a Clerk, and a common council, said common council to consist of five (5) members to be called the City Council of the City of Wilton Manors, and the Mayor and the said five (5) Councilmen shall be elected by the qualified electors of the said City at Large in the manner hereinafter prescribed. The members of the Council shall elect at the first regular, meeting after each election herein provided for, one of their number as President of the Council, who shall preside over its meetings, and enforce such rules as may be prescribed by ordinances. The Council may elect a Vice President of the Council to act in the absence or disability of the President.

Section 2: The Council shall meet at such time and place as may be prescribed by resolution. All meetings of the Council shall be public.

Section 3: The compensation of such Councilmen and Mayor shall be fixed by ordinance from time to time at a sum not exceeding \$1,200.00 each, per year, provided however, that any ordinance providing for an increase in the compensation for Councilmen and the Mayor shall not take effect until one (1) year after its passage.

Section 4: The City Council shall have the power to designate or create such offices, departments or divisions other than provided herein, as may be necessary for the administration of the affairs of the City; to provide the duties and powers of the officers and employees of such office, department or division; and fix the salary and compensation of such officers or employees.

Visitors to the popular Sabal Point Beach area are now turned back by "No Trespassing" signs and chain barricades, Recently, multi-millionaire Arthur Vining Davis Obtained an option to buy the beach area of Sabal Point. Stuart L. Moore, President of the Boca Raton Properties, Inc., in a statement to the Miami News said "The land had been posted in the best interest of all residents of Boca Raton", using as an excuse, that the beaches had been abused by outof-town persons. According to the Miami News article, Moore stated "We just could'nt afford to keep cleaning up the area". He further stated "We do realize very keenly that it is our duty as good members of the community to so administer our property as to enhance the reputation of Boca Raton rather than to encourage abuses which could easily and quickly lead to the destruction of the town's good name.

Moore also said "We will be happy to entertain suggestions of anyone with a workable plan for enjoyment of fishing and privileges by local citizens, without the abuse that has attended this effort in the recent past".

Although Mr. Moore recognizes no obligation to convert valuable private property into a public park for all-comers, this Editor would like to take advantage of Mr. Moore's invitation for suggestions of a workable plan, not only for the enjoyment of privileges by local citizens, but also for visitors from all over the world who come to our famous State to enjoy our hospitality, our beaches and our wonderful climate.

We humbly suggest that Arthur Vining Davis give a deed to the City of Boca Raton for the land in question, to be used as a public recreational facility, thus enhancing Boca Raton's good name.


